At our ~~September~~ meeting we gathered in Greenville with that chapter to hear Mrs. Alexia J. Helsley from the S. C. Archives. Mrs. Helsley described the various material at the Archives and discussed the computer indexing of early state records. She said more material is being added to the computer index to make it more valuable to the researcher and to save time when researching early state and Charleston records. Mrs. Helsley indicated the Archives has ordered the soundex index to the federal census of 1900. Taking into account the "speed" of the federal government, perhaps the soundex for 1900 will arrive in time for a Christmas present to those who need it.

In two or three weeks (allowing time for the mails) you should receive material announcing the annual meeting of the SCGS in Columbia on December 1 (Saturday). The meeting will be held at the Capstone House on the campus of USC. Following the business meeting and lunch tours are planned to the libraries in the Columbia area.
