**Sons of Confederate Veterans
Grave Location Project
Soldiers of the War Between the States**

The Sons of Confederate Veterans is conducting a nationwide search for burial sites of Confederate soldiers - in any state, not just SC. They hope to locate 600,000 grave sites and they are about halfway to that number already. Data is being collected by use of the form on the back side and recorded to insure the material is properly preserved and made available to serious researchers.

Of the approximately 300,000 names collected so far, less than 10,000 are SC soldiers. Most of them are SC soldiers buried in other states. SC had approximately 60,000 men that fought for their state, so we have a long way to go. A record of all the SC soldiers is being recorded by the SC Division, SCV. They are then forwarded to Rick Snider Chairman of the National Committee. Fill in as much of the form as you can; every line is not necessary. **"Burial site" must be filled in.**

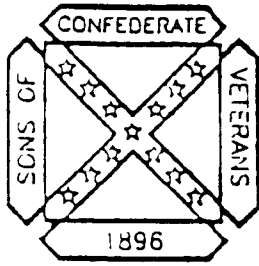
Note: "Official maker" means one that has the Confederate Cross of Honor cut in the stone and lists the company, regiment, along with name and birth/death dates. These markers are provided FREE by the Dept. of Veteran Affairs, and will be shipped free. All you need to do is put up the stone; the SCV can help with that. Just mark the proper box on the form and SCV will supply the data you need to apply for the markers. The process of ordering a marker is simple by using the data supplied.

If you do not wish to place a marker, indicate so on the form. There is no charge for registering a grave location.
