## QUERIES:

I am trying to establish the following ancestral line on my **HERRINGS**, could someone help me or tell me that I am barking up the wrong tree. William Herring, d. ca 1819 in the Old Pendleton District. - his son, Elizjah, md. to Clarissa, - their son, Elisha, md. to Tabitha (Delthia). I am trying to establish that Elisha and Tabitha were the parents of my G. Grandfather Jesse Herring, 1824-1899, md. to Milly Whitworth. Jesse and Milly's son Charles Robert Herring was my grandfather. Jesse and Milly are on the 1850 Forsyth Co., Ga. census and a Delthia (could be Tabitha) Herring with 6 children living nearby. Elisha and Tabitha left SC before Elisha's father (Elijah, died ca 1843. Contact Conrad M. Shirley, 33938 Sabal Way, Leesburg, Fl. 34788.

I am searching for parents of **FRANCES (FANNIE) REED**. Frances Reed was b. about 1769-1770; she married Aaron Broyles, or Major Aaron Broyles, who had move into SC very early, and she died 7 Sept., 1811 in the Pendleton Dist. of SC. She and her husband are buried at Shady Grove Cemetery in Belton, SC. Also buried there are one of her sons, Cain Broyles, or, Major Cain Broyles and Cain's daughter Emmaline, with her husband Chester Kingsley, the latter being my 2 G. grandparents. Contact Ramona K. ## When Copying Records:

*Copy them as they are.* Do not assume that a person recorded as Bill is really William. Bill may be his actual given name.

*Print, Don't write.* Can you read your own writing six months later?

*Get all records on a surname.* Why go back to the same location later to complete your record.

*Use a pencil.* Don't risk defacing a public record. Also, it is easier to correct pencil notes.

*For dates* use the form 3 September 1940. It cannot be misunderstood.

*Ancient documents* are very fragile. Be very careful. Others may also find them valuable.

*Old style handwriting* is very difficult to transcribe accurately. Even good penmanship can be misread. Many letters, especially capitals such as M, N, W, and J, I, S, look similar.

*Mixing documents* is all too common. When examining records such as probate, never have two sets of documents spread out at the same time.

*Faded records* are always difficult. Sometimes a photo copy will be darker than the original and enhance legibility.
