

PENDLETON DISTRICT CHAPTER SOGS

Our next meeting will be Tuesday July 18, 1978 at 7:30 Pm at Home Federal Savings & Loan in Lakeview Plaza on US 123-76 in Clemson.

Program: We will continue our discussion of last month concerning our cemetery work. Any one who has surveyed a cemetery is asked to turn the list over to Mr. Goodman. Also anyone who is typing a cemetery survey is asked to contact Mr. Goodman. In this way, we hope to accurately determine how much more work is necessary for us to complete the work on the cemeteries in Pickens County.

Our next cemetery survey will be July 15 at the Oolenoy Church. This church is located in northern Pickens County near the intersection of State Routes 8 and 135. If you need more directions or need a ride, a group will leave the Lakeview Plaze at Clemson (Home Federal Savings & Loan--our usual meeting place) at 8:00 AM. Other cemeteries in the area may be done on the same day. This would save several separate trips to the corners of the county.

At our June meeting, Mr. Riggs Goodman gave an excellant report on the status of our project with Pickens County cemeteries. About 98 white and 3 black cemeteries have been surveyed. Most of these surveys have been typed. There are about 20 cemeteries remaining to be surveyed. Mr. Goodman gave out copies of list of cemeteries which have been surveyed. Anyone who wants to survey a cemetery is asked to contact Mr. Goodman (654-5360) or Mrs. Sara Timms (639-2782) to avoid duplication of effort. It is also necessary for them to know of any cemeteries not on our list so the surveying can be truly complete when we finish.

At the same meeting, it was also decided we would concentrate our efforts for a while on completing the work of locating and surveying cemeteries in Pickens County. Later we will try to tackle the cemeteries in Oconee County. Still later, we will update Mr. Smith's efforts with Anderson County cemeteries. In the meantime, we will try to collect a list of the locations of cemeteries in Oconee and Anderson Counties.

The Greenville County Library now has most of the census for Alabama. They have ordered the South Carolina part of the census for 1900.

The North Carolina Archives is now closed on Mondays. Also there is a \$2 search fee charged for each letter answered; the fee must accompany your request and is in addition to the cost of copying documents involved.
