

PENDLETON DISTRICT CHAPTER SCGS

Our next meeting will be Tuesday August 15, 1978 at 7:30 PM at Home Federal Savings & Loan in Lakeview Plaza on US 123-76 in Clemson.

Program: We will continue our discussion of the work on cemeteries in Pickens County. If you have surveyed a cemetery, bring that list to Mr. Goodman. Mr. Goodman hopes to have available a list of cemeteries which have not been surveyed. Help is still needed to locate some of the smaller cemeteries. Please get a copy of this list to know which cemeteries you can do to help with our project.

The next cemetery survey will be August 5 at New Hope Church. This church is located on State Route 8 north of Pumpkintown. Early risers will begin arriving at 8:00 AM. Later risers are invited to arrive at 9:00 AM so some work can be done before the afternoon heat and possible thundershowers.

In July, Mr. Goodman presented a list of about twenty-five (25) more cemeteries which have been surveyed. This means about 116 cemeteries in Pickens County have been surveyed. It also means there are about 60 cemeteries, of various sizes, remaining to be surveyed. The cemetery survey on July 15 was cut short due to a rain shower at Oolenoy Church. A group was able to finish this survey in the afternoon of the next day.

Also at this meeting, our president, Dr. Borgman, gave a brief talk on Swedish Research and obtaining information from Sweden. Dr. Borgman recommended the book Cradled in Sweden by C.-E. Johansson which is available from Everton Publishers (\$8.95). Copies of the newsletters of other chapters are now available (as they are received) at our meetings. You will want to read them to keep up with their activities and to read the queries in many of the issues.

The Chester County Genealogical Society (Box 64, Richburg, SC 29729) has recently published a survey of the cemetery inscriptions of Old Catholic Presbyterian Church of Chester County. This cemetery contains the graves of 59 Revolutionary War veterans and some members of Pickens Guard CSA. The price of the book is \$3.50. This group is not a chapter of our Society but work is progressing in that direction.

The Tuscaloosa Genealogical Society (12 Woodland Hills, Tuscaloosa, Ala 35401) is preparing the second volume of genealogy charts of people interested in West Alabama. Before Oct. 15, the price is \$8.50; afterwards it is \$10.

The deadline for submitting charts to the Greenville Chapter has arrived. If you wish your chart to be included this year, please send your typed chart immediately to 100 Artillery Rd, Taylors, SC 29687.

The N. C. Genealogical Society (Box 1492, Raleigh, NC 27602) will have a workshop on Quaker Migrations by Willard Heiss on Sept. 9 at the N. C. Archives. The cost is \$10 (including a box lunch) for non members.
