Program: Mrs. Priscilla Sutcliffe will discuss the holdings of the South Carolina Room and Archival Collections of the Clemson University Library. Mrs. Sutcliffe is the head of this part of Clemson's Library.

At our November meeting Mr. Edwin Vedder discussed the origins and evolutions of place and family names. Mr. Vedder discussed some names in South Carolina and several found in Western New York which encompasses Dutch names. The following slate of officers were also elected:

The Board of the SCGS met briefly before the Annual Meeting in Columbia in December 1979. Some editorial changes in the proposed Constitution were approved. Also the proposed Constitution was altered so the editor of the Carolina Herald would be a member of the Board. Finally, the Greenville Chapter was allowed to design and produce for sale to the membership a lapel pin similar to the SCGS logo.

At the Annual meeting of the SCGS, a large variety of genealogical books were offered for sale by Brent Holcomb, A Press, and Greenwood Chapter members. Dr. Bobby Moss spoke on the people who served in South Carolina during the Revolutionary War. Dr. Moss used material he has gathered for his book on Revolutionary loyalists and patriots in South Carolina. Following Dr. Moss' talk, the business Meeting was held. During this meeting, the Proposed Constitution became thw working Constitution of the Society with the changes voted by the Board. The Society membership was

reported at 757 persons. A slate of officers was also elected for 1980. This action brought to a close Dr. Eugene C. Sneary's four year term as our state president. We are greatly indebted to Dr. Sneary because he brought the SCGS out of Columbia and into the hinterlands by first helping form a chapter in Greenville. During his term in office the Greenwood, Pendleton, Pee Dee and Pinckney Chapters doubled the number of chapters and made it easier for members to attend meetings near their homes. Dr. Sneary is also familiar to members of our chapter as the instructor of the genealogy classes held at Clemson.

FAMILY ASSOCIATIONS are numerous and are very helpful to their members. Many libraries have publications listing them. It may pay to join one or more.

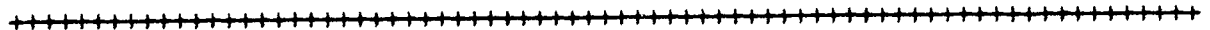

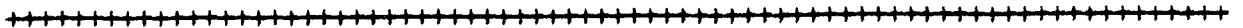
CHANGE OF ADDRESS

WHITENING OLD NEWSPAPER CLIPPINGS

Soak them in a solution of 1 cup of chlorine bleach and 1 gallon of warm water for 10 to 15 minutes. Do only one clipping at a time since more than one will stick together and they won't turn white where they touch each other. Remove from the bleach water, rinse under the faucet and put on the countertop or the door of your refrigerator or stove to dry.

For very yellow clippings, you may want to try a solution as strong as 1 cup of bleach to 3 cups of water, but test a piece of the clipping before you do the whole thing.

PRESERVING NEWSPAPER CLIPPINGS

Spray newspaper clippings before or after pasting in book, with a clear plastic aerosol spray. Apply just a light coating and let dry thoroughly. The trade name of the spray is "Krylon" and may be purchased in an art supply store.

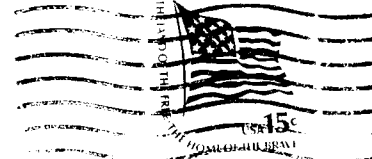
