

RECENTLY PUBLISHED:—by the Pendleton Chapter of the South Carolina Genealogical Society, <u>The Nicholson and Related Families</u>, by William C. Whitten Jr. and Mrs. Curron (Era) Davis. We had 50 copies prepared and they are selling well; 50% of them are already gone.

The book talks about the origin of the name and some prominent members of that name. Some early census records are given showing the extent of Nicholsons in early America. Two men to the Nicholson name seem to have been the progenitors of all later descendants in the Old Pendleton District. They were Benjamin and William Nicholson. The great majority are descendants of the latter and make up the major part of the book. It is 156 pages plus a thorough index and in soft cover. The cost is \$13 plus \$2 for postage.

Surely there must be other members of the Chapter who have large amounts of data on other families who would like to see that material put into a book. Why don't you get started on it? This applies to those members of the chapter who are remote as well as those who are able to meet regularly with us. If you feel that it is too much of a job, maybe another member of the chapter could work with you. That is what happened on the book above. Communicate with one of the officers listed above if you think that you might want to undertake publishing.
