#### Births, Marriages, and Deaths

The following information was found in the Acts of the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina passed in November and December, 1860, and January, 1861.

No. 4516. AN ACT to repeal certain acts in relation to the registration of births, marriages and deaths in the State of South Carolina. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, now met and sitting in General Assembly, and by the authority of the same, That an Act entitled "An Act for the establishment of a general system of Registration of Births, Marriages and Deaths in the State of South Carolina," ratified on the twentieth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, and an Act entitled "An Act for the better establishment of a general system of Registration of Births, Marriages and Deaths in the State of South Carolina," ratified on the twentieth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, be, and the same are hereby, repealed. January 28, 1861.

A Glimpse Into the Past

Francis Burt Doyle, who submitted the article in a local newspaper in June, 1919, was the son of James A. Doyle. Mr. James Doyle's family lived at Pickens Court House where he served as sheriff of the District. He also lived at Ft. Madison and at Old Oconee Station. J. A. Doyle died in 1884.

Interesting Facts Culled From An Old Diary of James A. Doyle

No house on road between Pickens Ferry and Walhalla the first time I traveled the road. The first house was at the upper end of what is Walhalla, where lived an old man named Houston. This was in 1828. Land along this road would hardly bring 25 cents per acre.

Of the McElroy place, Dave Sloan and Overton Lewis said it would not

do to buy this land at 25 cents an acre for speculation.

J. A. Doyle bought Lewis Moorehead's place for a colt in 1835.

Tract of 100 acres near Double Springs was given as boot in a horse trade in 1829. Common thing to trade a horse or colt for a tract of land. A

gun, also, was a big item in a land trade.

When I was tax collector of Pickens District (1840-1848), land was divided into three classes or grades and taxed as follows: 1st class, bottom land, tax 36 cents for 100 acres; 2d class, good upland, tax 17 cents per 100 acres; 3d class, included the balance and was taxed at 6 cents per 100 acres. Most of the land given in was in this class.

The first licensed physician in Pickens District was Dr. Robert Maxwell, who lived near Fair Play, on the Beaverdam. This was in 1848.

In 1848 I knew personally every tax-payer in Pickens District.

William Doyle, father of James A. Doyle, was born near Hagerstown, Md., about 1784, of parents whose ancestors were among the first settlers of that State. His parents moved to Pendleton District, South Carolina, when William was quite a boy.

My grandfather on my mother's side was an Irishman named Alexander,

who was a soldier in the American Revolution.

Richard Lewis, father of J. Overton Lewis, bought Tamassee place from a son of Gen. Andrew Pickens. At the death of Richard Lewis, Tamassee was given to Andrew Lewis as his part of Richard's estate. J. Overton Lewis swapped even the Dendy place, at Richland, for Tamassee, which in 1832 was valued at \$2,500.

I was tax collector of Rabun County, Georgia, in 1830. Amount of

taxes that year did not exceed \$700 for the county.

These events happened in the long ago, and but few, if any, now living can recall a knowledge of these things. The first house on the road at what is now the upper end of Walhalla was located, in all probability, at the Wieben's Springs. Lands were cheap because of the sparse population. Horses were the principal means of transportation. Guns were counted valuable assets. They were manufactured in the old country, and in consequence were scarce and dear. A gun in those days was also highly valued on account of the abundance of game. Most lands are given in for taxation as third class today as they were in 1840.

Times change and men change with them.

### A GLIMPSE INTO THE PAST

The February 1990 NEWSLETTER included excerpts from the diary of James A. Doyle. We now have the following letter written by his son William E. Doyle to his sisters while while he was serving in the Confederate Army. Both were submitted to us by William N. Curry, Jr. of103 Davidson Drive, Terrell, TX 75160.

William E. Doyle was born 26 April 1846 at Oconee Station, near Walnalia, SC to James A. and Martha Dency Doyle. He enlisted in Trennolm's Squadron in February 1864 at Coosewhatchie, SC. He was not yet 15 years old. When called into service, the Squadron became the 7th S. C. Cav., which, with the Hampton Legion and the 24th Virginia, formed Gary's Brigade of Cavairy, A.N.V. He served in engagements around Richmond until his capture by Federal cavairy troops. In 1867, he moved to Texas, settling first in Mexia, then Teague, where he served as mayor of both towns, attorney, and State Senator. He died in Teague, TX 9 September 1934.

(Editor's Note: The () in the above are by Mr. Curry. He has tried to copy the letter exactly as written - spelling and punctuation and all.)

#### THE LETTER

Camp Near Malvern Mill
June 16th, 1864

Dear Sisters:

I now Seat myself again to write to you. We have stoped to rest probably for a day or two. I never have heard of such a time as we have had this week. Last Monday we left our camp in great haste going in the direction of Long Bridge (across the Chickahominy) the enemy reported advancing. Went up there as fast as our horses could carry us (Gary's Brigade). We dismounted marched to the front and was soon fighting the Yankees Infintry & Artillery. We stood thire fire 10 or 15 minutes when we were compelled to fall back. 4 of our Company Killed & 4 wounded. Tom Lowery being the onle one amongst the Slain you know 3 of the wounded Since died. There being but one left that was hurt, Mr. Sam Johns Shot throug the leg. Nothing eaquals that since the war began all dead but one they was hurt.

Iam happy to say to you that I was not hurt. And am thankful to the God of battles that I come through the engagement unhurt. Jimmie (J. H. Doyle, the writer's twin brother) is in the Hospital yet. He is getting better. I heard from him today. As we come from the field Hills Corp marched on and drove the enemy back in confusion.

Yesterday we (Gary's Brigade) persued them near to James River capturing prisoners guns Sabres etc...taking us until 10 o clock in the night to get in our lines. Yesterday we skirmished with the enemy at Malvern Hill drove them back only one in our Regt. got wounded.

We then left there went to Rooks Farm Staid there until 9 oclock PM waiting for the enemy. they did not appear, we left there then and marched until 11 o'clock in last night Slept 3 hours left again before day light-marched until

10 o clock today and is now resting. No telling when we may start again. I saw John and all the boys of Stiles company they are all well. John give me hair a dozzen biscuits with 7 dollars. You must write to me soon I have not headrd from home Since 6th May.

#### T. EDWARD STRIBLING

The Courier, Walhalla, SC, September 1, 1915 contains a long article reporting the death by suicide of T. Edward Stribling of Seneca, 30 the day before. The following is an abstract by your NEWSLETTER editor.

Mr. Stribling was a native of Oconee Co., SC naving been born in Fairplay August 27, 1860, son of Jesse W. and Sarah E. Stribling. He married June 27, 1889 Miss Mattie Verner of Richland, SC. Their four children are Thomas E. Stribling, Mrs. Verna Monroe of Laurensburg, NC; J. W. and Charles Stribling. He was survived by a sister, Miss Emma Stribling. Major Wm. J. Stribling and Col. Jos. W. Shelor of Walhalla were uncles of the deceased. He is buried in the family plot at Mountain View Cemetery in Seneca.

For many years, as a young man, Mr. Stribling resided in Walhalla while his father was Clerk of Court of Oconee and for several years thereafter. At the beginning of the lleveland administration, T. E. Stribling was appointed Postmaster for Walhalla.

He had held the position of Magistrate at Seneca for several years and also was Herk and Treasurer of the Seneca Town Council for several years. At the time of his leath, he was running a grocery store in Seneca.



#### WHAT'S IN A NAME

#### by Edwin H. Vedder

The study of names is also a study of history. In our own life span, our language has changed greatly. So have names. The names at any given time reflect the history of the people, past and present, and the impact that they all had.

This country, being the melting pot that it is, has surnames, given names and place names of just about every possible origin. This short paper cannot discuss in any depth, the origins of the many names of ethnic origin, especially from southern and eastern Europe. We now have great numbers from Central and South America as well as from Asia. Also, we must not forget the great number of Indian place names throughout the United States. Therefore, most of what follows deals with names which we usually think of as being of English origin.

This issue of the NEWSLETTER will deal with place names and the May issue with people names.

#### PLACE NAMES

Addressing a letter, knowing that it can be mailed to and will reach its destination, is so taken for granted that we tend to assume that place names are truly definitive. They usually are if we stay within the context of today's accepted practice for a single purpose such as the postal service. Even the postal service has problems, as witness the introduction of the Zip Code system to help keep careless people out of trouble. More recently, we have has street names changed to enable the 911 system to find us following an emergency call. Examples:

Antioch Kershaw County
Antioch Lancaster County

Aragon Mills Chester County
Aragon Mills York County

Belmont Richland County
Belmont York County

Brownsville Dorchester County
Brownsville Marlboro County

Ebenezer Part of Florence, SC Ebenezer Part of Rock Hill

Place names are applied to many types of locations: counties, towns, cities, incorporated villages, unincorporated hamlets, railroad stations or junctions and colloquial names for locations.

Place names are very loosely used. Wills, family Bibles and similar documents frequently give a location by a name which is easily misunderstood. My great-great grandfather's will refers to his farm in Florida. Since he lived in Schenectady, NY, I was pretty sure that he did not mean the State of Florida. Then I found a village of Florida in Orange County, NY which was at least a possibility. That proved to be dead end. Finally, I discovered that there is a Town (Township) of Florida in Montgomery County, NY and that was the correct one.

Our Vedder family Bible says that my maternal grandfather was born in Otsego, NY. There is, indeed, an Otsego Co. but within that there is a Town (Township) of Otsego. The Bible further says that he was married in Otsego, MI. There is, indeed, an Otsego Co., MI and also a village of Otsego but not in Otsego Co., MI, it being in another county. The marriage record has not been found.

A very confusing thing when examining old records is the practice of changing names or of their becoming obsolete. This is done for many reasons but causes a genealogist to become an expert in the history of names out of self defense. Some of the reasons for changing are:

- a) Postoffices are merged, abandoned or renamed.
- b) Village names are changed to avoid confusion with another or absorbed into another municipality. Usually the name lingers on anyway.
- c) Railroads are abandoned.
- d) A locality may be known differently locally.

A name may not continue to always mean the same thing because of boundary changes. A lot of this occured during the nineteenth century as new counties and towns were formed. This was especially true in South Carolina where the state was divided into Judicial Districts until after the Civil War at which time the state was divided into Counties.

The group of names changed the most frequently was, without doubt, postoffices. In the early days, the postoffices were close together and were not necessarily even in a hamlet. Therefore, many times, a name signified nothing more than a postoffice----frequently named for the postmaster who may have kept office in his house. As transportation became better, small postoffices were consolidated or eliminated. For example of a total accumulation of about 1000 place names of all kinds for the eight counties of Western New York, at least 30% were changed or made obsolete since 1800.

When doing researh involving place names, it is worthwhile to go to a good library and find books on place names in the particular area.


This list of apprentices was lifted from a much larger computer record of some 8000 artisans and their role who worked in Colonial Virginia before 1801. Of the approximately 2000 included in this work, nearly 400 are from Princess Anne County and some counties are not represented at all. The data is primarily from original court records which are available on microfilm from the Archives Division of the Virginia State Library in Richmond.

When available, each of the following records are included for each apprentice ---Name, Master, Beginning date, Ending date, Sex, Source, Occupation, and Race.

#### BOOK REVIEW

1868 Voter Registration, Oconee and Pickens Cos., SC. Transcription and Introduction by Peggy Burton Rich and Frederick C. Holder for Pendleton Chapter, South Carolina Genealogical Society, 1990. Privately printed Clemson, SC. Soft Cover, & 1/2 x 11, Zeroxed, 54 pp.+20 pp. Introduction, indexed. Order from Fendleton Chapter, South Carolina Genealogical Society, William C. Whitten, 101 Cherokee Road, Clemson, SC 29631. Cost \$10.00 each copy including postage and handling.

This book is a major resource for historians, genealogists and the general public seeking information on voter registration and reconstruction in Geomee and Pickens Counties, SG.

The 1868 list of registered voters for these counties was secured from the South Carolina Department of Archives, Columbia, SC and appears to be the first extant list list identifying voters by race. The list is divided into Military Districts, Regimental Precincts and Electoral Precincts. A map of Pickens District showing Electoral Precincts provides a means for locating registered voters.

This book contains not only the data implied by the its title but also a 20 page introduction containing an extensive coverage of the confusion attending the complexities of the 1867-8 voter registration in South Carolina. Researchers will find the explanation of events during that period and reprint and abstracts of notable documents particularly valuable. The origin and function of Military Precincts are explained for the first time. Using a Pickens District newspaper, the authors have provided reprints of a number of documents (Military Orders for example) dealing with voter registration. In addition, the authors have pointed out select errors and/or exceptions to statements in some of the more notable books pertaining to reconstruction in South Carolina.....statements which might lead researchers astray. Using Oconee and Pickens Counties as working models, the authors have attempted to provide information which might be applied by historians and genealogists to any area of South Carolina.

## OH. HOW I WISH HE'D HAD A MIDDLE NAME

If you are having trouble keeping your John Smiths and Jane Browns straight and wish they had a middle name - the following excerpts from an article which appeared in a "HARPERS" Magazine around 1900 might help explain why they did not have middle names.

"Middle names were once illegal. The old English law was definite as to the naming of children and, according to (Sir Edward) COKE'S law commentary, "a man cannot have two names of baptism'; and on bills of sale, 'that purchaser be named by the name of his baptism and his surname.' Royal personages were ALWAYS allowed to have more than one given name, but as late as 1600, it was said there were only FOUR PERSONS in all England who had two given names. In 1620, when the Mayflower sailed for America, not a man or woman aboard had a middle name.

"Even one hundred and fifty years ago, double names were uncommon....and the law was dodged at times by compounding names, such as ANNANARIE. As much as they dared, beginning in the 1700's parents evaded the 'one name' law. But even one hundred years ago, custom was against the middle name. Only three of the signers of the Declaration of Independence had middle names; the first five Presidents of the United STATES had only one name each.

#### AN ALEXANDER FAMILY DURING THE CIVIL WAR

Contributed by member Ayliffe J. Bogle, 26 Pioneer Trail, Marietta, GA 30068

The complete family of Fountain Alexander, listed below has been extracted from "Alexander Families, of Upper South Carolina", compiled by Peggy Rich and Marion Ard Whitehurst, narraative by Jerry L. Alexander, privately printed 1988.

The letter which follows the family listing below was written by Henson A. Alexander to his brother and sister-in-law, David A. and Sarah (Anderson) Alexander in the summer of 1862 while stationed on the Chickahominy River near Richmond. According to Ms Bogle, he was born about 1843 in Pickens Co., SC, son of Fountain and Emelia (Watson) Alexander. Henson died near Petersburg in early 1865. At the time of the letter, his brother David had enrolled at Pocataligo and was quartered at Camp Goldsmith, dying of disease 29 April 1863. Of three brothers, only Milton survived to return to Pickens County and family.

Richmond, Virginia Dear Brother & Sister Chickahominy River June the 4th 1862

Its with great pleasure I embrace the present opportunity of droping you a few lines to let you no that I am well at the present hoping when those few lines comes to hand They will find you all well and doing well I received the letter which you sent me and Brother Milton I was glad to hear from you all and to hear you was all well Milton has not got the letter yet the reason why he is at Richmond or Petersburg in the hospitle & I dont no for sure which of the places he is at yet he has not wrote to me since he went to that hospitle where he is at now and I dont no where to send the letter to for him to get it till he write to me I dont no how he is getting along for I have not heard from him since I saw him last he was not so but what he could go about it is the same old disease that is working on him his side and back hurts him so he cant muster nor he says he cant toat his Knapsack he has not done a days service cince came in the Service nor I dont think he ever will be any service here at all for the rest of the neighboring boys They are all well except Anderson Barton he has been verv sick for some days past he has got that typhoid fever he is in the hospitle at Richmond Iheard from him today one of our men went to the city to day he said he saw a man that stayed with him last night and he told this man that I told you went to the city that he was very bad off last night and he expected that he was dead by that time but I dont no whether it is so or not William Aanderson went there this morning to see about him he has has not got back yet if he gets back before I close this letter I will tell you the truth of it & if he dont get back before I close you must not tell his Ma about it nor you must not tell no other person so she can get hold of it for I dont no whether it is so or not nor if it aint so I dont so I dont want you to tell it at all I wanted to get to go with William to see him but there was no chance for he had to beg pretty hard to get to go bv himself I went to the hospitle at Ashland with him and waited on him till he was caried to Richmond and then I had to return to my Regt I hated to have to leave him but I had it to do a man has to do just as he is commanded to do he cant do as he pleases if he could to of got to stayed with him I could a waited on a heap better than he was I (k)now and a nother thing I would to of been a heap better satisfyed

I will tell Something about where we are camped and what sort of situation we are in we are stationed on the Chickahominy River and we have got no only just our blankets stretched up and that is a bad makeshift shure our Regt has been marching nearly all the time for two weeks in the mud and rain it has been raining ever night for two or three nights and it has been raining here today nearly all day it has rained some as hard a rains as generly rains for the last week some of us can keep sorter dry and some dont for they cant keep dry under a little blanket stretched up we are stationed on one side of the Chickahominy and the yankys on the other side We are in a piece of wods and we can go out in the field two or three hundred yards from our camp and see the yankys out the other side they bombed a piece of woods on this side of the river yesterday they thought that some of our men was in this piece of woods they threw a good many bombs in that piece of woods we could stand and see the smoke from their canons They threw some over our heads the other eavning and our men sent som back but the yankys did no harm nor I dont no whether our men any or not they have been fighting a good deal below Richmond I cant tell you mutch about that fight but our loss was very heavy in killed and wounded bu we whiped them badly from what I can hear the fireing was in hearing of us the loss on their side was supposed to be double of ours and the prisnirs taken about six hundred You will be apt to hear of the fight in the paper if you take the paper Wm Anderson has just arrived he says Anderson is not dead but he is very low you can tell his Ma that he is very bad off but Wm Anderson thinks there is hopes of his recovering yet which I hope he will Brother I dont no whether I will ever see you nor none of the rest of you again or not but if it is not the lords will hope we will be prepaired to meet in heaven where there is no wars nor rumors of wars but I hope it is the lords will for us all to meet again on earth

You must write to me as soon as you get this letter and fail not we are looking for a battle at any hour but I am not able to say when it will come off Our troops is all around Richmond and whenever the fight dose come off it will be one of the bloodiest battles that ever was fought to my opinion & I think it will last for several days. So I must come to a close for This time So when this you see remember me though many miles apart we be




