# HAROLD B. SIMPSON CONFEDERATE RESEARCH CENTER AND MUSEUM

This center is located on the campus of Hill College in Hillsboro, TX about 50 miles south of Dallas on I35. In addition to the museum, the library contains:

- ----Over 3,500 books, brochures and pamphlets on the Civil War with emphasis on Confederate military history.
- ----Reference books on the Civil War including "The Official Records", Southern Historical Society Papers", "Confederate Veteran" and Confederate Military History."
- ----Capsule histories of ALL (Not just Texas) 3,220 Confederate regiments, special units and Confederate ships.
- ----All service records of Hood's Texas Brigade, Texas newspapers published during the war, 1860 Texas census, post returns of U. S. forts in Texas (1848-61), and an information file on Texas Confederate soldiers.
- ----Original letters, documents, maps and photographs. Extensive file of magazine and newspaper clippings from the period.
- ----Subscriptions to 55 magazines in Southern & Military history.
- ----Publishers of numerous books on the Confederacy.

The Center also contains a large collection of World War II information, especially on Texxans.

The Center WILL conduct research in their library at a very reasonable rate. Mrs. Peggy Fox, very capable and friendly, is a full-time researcher for the library. She told me to write her first WITHOUT sending any money. Once she determines what, if any, information they can supply, She will write back with a price to mail. Some Southern Roper "Trees", A book of Clues. June Roper Walton, Compiler and Publisher. Printed 1991 by One Stop Printing, Smithfield, NC. Soft cover, 8 1/2 x 11, 391 pp. incl. all name index. Order from June Roper Walton, P. O. Box 748, Four Oaks, NC 27524, cost \$30 incl. postage and mailing. Note:- Please mention Pendleton Chapter in your order and Mrs. Roper will contribute \$2.00 to the Chapter.

The compiler published 1986 her own direct line, "KNOWN ANCESTRY OF SAMUEL CLYDE ROPER AND TYRE LEE ROPER". She had so much material left over, including coordinate families, that she assembled it into book form. Your reviewer wishes that such a book of data on his family had been available. As Mrs. Walton points out, this is useful research material but cautions those who use it that they should check the original source to confirm the data.

The data has been arranged by County and State and together with the index makes searching the data quite easy. No doubt, both of Mrs. Walton's books would be of interest to those searching the Roper line as well as the large number of coordinate families.
