

FAITH CLAYTON

We were saddened by the death of Miss Faith Clayton, Dec. 17, 1993. She was a Charter Member of the Pendleton Chapter of SCGS, as well as a member of many other local state and national organizations. We will always be indebted to her for guidance, leadership and generosity in helping develop and preserve our cherished family histories. The following was printed in <u>The Greenville News</u>, Dec. 19, 1993:

Faith Clayton, formerly of Central, a former member of the state Industrial Commission, died Dec. 17, 1993, at Laurel Hill Nursing Center in Pickens. She was 86.

She was formerly associated with the South Carolina Employment Security Commission as a manager of the Liberty Office. She also served an eight-year term as commissioner with the South Carolina Industrial Commission. She was a graduate of Central Wesleyan College and was a former public school teacher in Mississippi and in Pickens County.

After her retirement, she took up the study of genealogy, and in 1984, she donated her extensive collection to Central Wesleyan College where it is now housed in the Faith Clayton Family Research Center. She was the oldest alumna of Central Wesleyan College.

Surviving is a sister, Mrs. Fred (Angie) Parham of Latta.

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

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
COST INCREASE:

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

SOON TO BE PUBLISHED

The Pickens Sentinel, Historical and Genealogical Abstracts: 1872 - 1893

abstracted by PEGGY B. RICH AND MARION A. WHITEHURST

For over a year, Rich and Whitehurst have been abstracting the ca. 1872 through 1893 entries found in *The Pickens Sentinel*, the major newspaper of Pickens County for almost 100 years. For those unfamiliar with the work of Mrs. Rich and Mrs. Whitehurst, they abstract far more than just births, deaths, and marriages — they abstract the entire newspaper: articles, notices (legal and personal), ads, etc. Researchers in other parts of the U.S. have commented that *The People's Journal: Pickens South Carolina*, 1894-1903, Historical and Genealogical Abstracts (a previously published newspaper abstract by Rich and Whitehurst) is one of the few, truly well done, published newspaper abstracts.

Potential buyers should consider the purchase as an investment that will save hundreds, if not thousands, of dollars in time and labor. Consider your cost to (1) go the library (time after time), (2) locate microfilm, (3) thread it, (4) then read it — all just to located one name or information about a particular subject you wish to research, (5) rewind it, and (6) re-shelve it!



- 4. SAMUEL WARREN--SC Rev. Pension No. BLWT. 1859-300. Born 1760 d. 30 Nov 1841 Col. Samuel Warren was the son of Rev. Samuel Fenner Warren who officiated as the faithful pastor of old Eutaw Church for 31 years and died in 1789, buried in the church yard at the old Eutaw Church.
- Col. Samuel Warren, his son, is buried in the same grave. He was born near the spot where his mortal remains repose, and at an early age was sent to England for his education, under the care of his uncle, John Warren, Bishop of Bangor, but when war ravaged his native state, his gallant spirit impelled him to fly to her rescue. At the age of 18, when leading his command against the British lines, he received a bullet in his leg, but supporting himself upon his sword until another struck him on the knee, and shattered the thigh bone, he fell, was taken up from the field in Savannah, his thigh was amputated, he survived and continued to perform staff duties in the army.

Served long in each branch of the Legislature, was made President of the Senate and was offered the appoint of Governor, which he declined. Late in life he removed to the district of Pendleton, and there died suddenly on the last day of December 1841 (should be November) in the 79th year of his age. He resided on the Three and Twenty Mile Creek below Pendleton Factory. He was a gentleman of considerable means and lived the life of a bachelor.

His household consisted of himself and Lydia Ann Perdreau, his ward and adopted daughter, whom he educated and reared most tenderly. This young lady married John Miller, a son of John Miller, the Englishman who was the editor and proprietor of "Millers Weekly Messenger" afterwards called the "Pendleton Messenger". Col. Warren gave all his property by will to Samuel Fenner Warren Miller, a son of the above first named John Miller. History of Old Pendleton District and Genealogy of Leading Families pg 31-33 by Col. Col. Samuel Warren died at his residence near the village of Pendleton, SC on the 30 November in the 81st year of his age, one of our Revolutionary Worthies. He lost a leg at the attack on Savannah. 

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

Let's Make the Censuses More Useful! Anderson Record, Anderson County Chapter SCGS

Mrs. Adelyn Stegall Stevenson, 170 Little John Trail, Atlanta, Ga. 30309-2622 had brought up a very useful suggestion - that the 2000 census include the **Maiden Name Only** of married women responding to the enumerator.

"Full names would be more desirable, rather than initials, as any one of the 26 letters of the alphabet tells no more than another. In the case of females, request that (their) full maiden name only be given, the question of (marital) status is answered in the 'now married, widowed, divorced, separated, never married' category.

Since the census is taken to tell us about ourselves, it seems a most logical beginning would be to provide space for full names of all. It appears to be rather discriminating to encourage married females to omit the name of their birth family...This change of emphasizing maiden surnames, and full names of both men and women is most important."

If you think that is a good idea, then write MRS. HARRY SCARR, ACTING DIRECTOR OF THE CENSUS BUREAU, DEPT OF COMMERCE, WASHINGTON, DC 20233, and send a carbon to your CONGRESSMAN.

7. DAVID SADLER/SADDLER SR.—Applied for pension 6 May 1833 in Anderson County, South Carolina. Born 31 August 1762 in Pennsylvania, record taken from his father's family Bible—Moved when a boy to York County, SC. Drafted in 1779 when 16 years and 4 ?months old under Lt. Hemphill and marched to Bacon's Bridge under Gen. Williamson three months. 2nd tour: Immediately after another three months ending with the battle of Stono, was at Mobley's meeting House, with Col. Neill, under Col. Bratton's fought Tories under ?Hook (Hauk's Defeat) was killed. Volunteered under Capt. McClure in the summer of 1780—joined Sumter and attacked at Fish Dam Ford in the night and we retreated, Sumter was wounded in the shoulder the next day, was at William's Plantation, Rocky Mount, McClure was killed at Hanging Rock, crossed the Santee after Sumter's

wife, was ambushed near Wright's Bluff, went home but returned, was with Sumter as long as he had a camp.
South Carolina Rev. Pension No. S9471 born Pennsylvania.
David Sadler buried Roberts Cemetery in Anderson Co SC.

David Saddler was son of Richard Saddler of Fishing Creek, Chester SC. Richard Saddler's house was built on Fishing Creek some 20 feet from the water, often it was surrounded with water, thus to be as safe as possible from the lurking Cherokee Indians, who often waylaid them while going for water, or when washing.

David Saddler married Col. Bratton's eldest daughter. Col. Bratton is buried at Bethesda in York Co., SC. History of Upper County SC Vol II. pg 61 and 63 by John H. Logan

David Sadler married Miss Eliza Bratton of York Co., SC. History of Anderson Co., SC pg 158 by Louise Ayer Vandiver

David Sadler a Rev. Soldier who lies in Roberts Church yard. He was one of the early settlers in the county, and died in 1848. History of Anderson Co., SC pg 75 by Louise Ayer Vandiver

8. WILLIAM GRANT--wife Mary--Applied for pension March 1835 in Anderson District, SC. Born Augusta Co., Virginia 3 August 1761 as recorded in his father's old Prayer Book, now in his possession. Lived during the war on Pacolet River near Pinkneyville, in what is now Union District, SC.

Made his 1st tour: Nov 1779 as a volunteer in Minute Service in Spartanburg Regiment of Union District under Capt. Joseph McJenkins, Lt. Col. Stein, Col. Brandon's Regiment stationed 10 miles from Charleston until 10 March 1780.

2nd tour: Nov 1780 called out under Capt. William Grant, Major Joseph McJenkins, Col. Thomas Brandon and ordered to Fooses Ford. At Blackstock an engagement and General Sumter was wounded, so all scattered and went home.

3rd tour: Nov 1780 appointed 1st Lt. in Capt. William Grant's Co. by Col. Thomas Brandon, joined Gen. Morgan at Grindal Shoals, Pacolet River, was a volunteer under Col. William Washington at Hammond's Old Store, was at Cowpens, went to Rutherford, Sherrill's Ford on Catawba River and nearly to Yadkin. 4th tour: called out by Gen. Sumter in Spring of 1781, Capt. Grant was then at Neill's Mills so he as Lt. gathered volunteers and went with Col. Brandon to join Gen. Greene at Congaree Fort, was captured at Orangeburg Fort where they took 80 tories and some British under Col. Fisher—was sent home to raise men, did so and joined Capt. Jolley of Col. Brandon's Reg. went to the seige of Ninety—Six.

5th tour: called on to raise men Aug 1781 and join Gen. Greene, went to Ancrum's Old Place where I joined Col. Corps under Major Jolley, was taken sick and left in charge of the sick, finally went home, was sick all winter.

6th tour: Spring of 1782 under Major Fair was on guard at Orangeburg.

7th tour: 1 July 1782 joined as Lt. in Capt. Grant's Co under Major Jolley ordered by Gen. Pickens to Bacon's Bridge. Major Jolley died soon after my return.

10 Nov 1834 Joseph McJenkins of Pickens District stated he was Capt. in Second Spartan Reg. of SC Militia under Col. Thomas Brandon in Nov 1779 and testified to Grant's service. Others who testified were: 2 March 1835 Aaron Guyton, Sandford Vandiver, John Harris, Esq., and Miles Norton.

29 June 1853 Mrs Mary Grantt stated she was about 70 years of age and her maiden name was Mary Burchfield and married William Grant 5 June 1803, by Rev. Charles Rice, in Pendleton District, SC, now Pickens District that William Grant died 28 Aug 1851. Dicey Burchfield stated July 1853 that she wittnessed the marriage. According to statement by John Maxwell aged about 61 years issue of Wm and Mary Grant were: William, Richard G., Celia wife of James Forrester, Catherine (now deceased) and Noah Grant.

Mary Grant died 25 March 1863--her will dated 22 Jan 1859 prob. 6 July 1863 names William, Celia w/o James Forrester, Dannelly, Noah Grant Exor: Noah Grant and John S. ?Lart--On 7 Oct 1867 Noah stated he and Celia Forrester were the only heirs of Mary Grant. Celia Forrester was in Habersham Co GA 23 Aug 1867--Noah Grant of Pickens Co SC took oath of allegiance 25 Aug 1866 age 48 years. South Carolina Rev. Pension No. W1757 BLWT. 26273-160-55.

Mr William Grant died in this District on the 28th, aged 90 years and 25 days. Mr Grant held the commission of Lieutenant in a company commanded by his father in the Revolution. A long resident of the neighborhood where he died.

Pendleton Messenger Issue: 4 Sept 1851

William Grant bought 150 acres 9 March 1795 on Conoross Creek of Keowee River from Nathan Austin. Anderson Co SC Conveyance Bk B pg 420-431

On the dividing line between Anderson and Oconee Counties of SC is an old grave. It lies half in each county and in it rest William Grant. Mr Grant was a properous man, and something of a money lender. He was a rather rough old fellow, lived in a two story cabin, went barefooted and did pretty much as he pleased. History of Anderson Co., SC pg 76 by Louise Ayer Vandiver

9. WILLIAM HUBBARD--born 1761--Applied for pension 4 March 1833 in Anderson District, SC. Born in Halifax Co Virginia, moved to Guilford Co NC while young then to Anderson County, SC about 1792. Drafted in Guilford NC while in his 16th year in Capt. Campbell's Co., Col. Martin, Gen. Lincolm and marched to Charleston and served four months. Attached himself to Capt. Oldham's Co., Gen.

Moore, Gen. Butler and served forty five days. Then attached himself to Capt. McDow's scouting party and served three months. Attached himself to Capt. Peter O'Neall's Co., Col. William O'Nealle for three months. Substituted himself for Deunk Rogers and served six weeks. Stated William Magee and William Robinson were acquainted with him. George Oldham stated he had known him since a boy. William Hubbard stated on the 23 Nov 1835 that he was in his 74th year of age. Buried Slabtown Cemetery, Anderson Co SC. NC-SC Rev. Pension S21310 BLWT. 36728-160-55

The Anderson Gazette announces the death of Mr. William Hubbard of that district, aged 97 years. He was an old Revolutionary Soldier, distinguished for the active part taken in the times that tried men's souls. Keowee Courier Issue: 6 February 1858

William Hubbard's will is in Pickens Co., SC Probate Court, but does not give any information. He died 10 January 1858 married Jane Reeder b. 1759 died 8 July 1835 daughter of Simon Reeder who died in 1797. Buried Pickens Chapel or Slabtown Cemetery in Anderson Co., SC. Issue according to Leonardo' Andrea--William Hubbard Jr. married Martha Waddell--Sarah Hubbard married James Smith--Susannah Hubbard married Phillip Prater.

10. NICHOLAS BISHOP--South Carolina Rev. Pension No. S17847 Born 1760 d. November 1843 m. Jane Dickson b. 1758 d. 17 Aug 1842.

Mr Nicholas Bishop settled near Pendleton early in the year 1800 on land adjoining Dr. Hall. He came from Charleston, SC. Left two daughters Jane and Dorcas who never married and resided at their father's home on Big Garvin Creek and lived to a good old age and were buried at the Old Stone Church.

Mrs Jane Bishop, wife of Mr Nicholas Bishop, died on the 17th in the 84th years of her age. She was a daughter of Major Michael Dickson who was an officer in the Revolution. Mr Nicholas Bishop aged 83 years died Saturday evening at his residence near this place. 

Revolutionary War Soldiers - The following is a continuation from the June issue of short biographis on Anderson Co SC 1840 Revolutionary War Soldier, Microfilm M704 Roll 507 submitted for publication by Linda Cheek.

The Old Pendleton Chapter extends its deepest-sympathy to Julie Woodson and her family upon the death of her husband William E. Woodson. His presence will be sorely missed by all who knew him.

11. HARMON CUMMINS--Applied for pension 25 March 1819 in Pendleton District, South Carolina, droped under Act 1 May 1820--Applied again 11 Sept 1833. Enlisted in spring 1776 at Sharpsburg, Frederick, now Washington County Maryland within three miles of where he then lived--served in Capt. Cochran's Co. 8th Virginia Line under Col. P. Muhlenberg and marched to Shepherdstown, Fredericksburg and Williamsburg. The 8th Regiment was then sent to Carolina and he was attached to 1st Virginia Infantry commanded by Gen. Mercer and Fleming--etc. wounded in leg at Germantown where he was taken prisoner--returned home and moved to Virginia. Raised in Frederick Co Maryland. South Carolina Rev. Pension No. S21701

Among the pioneer settlers in this section were two brothers-inlaw, Samuel Dean and Harmon Cummin. They had married sisters, Misses James, and the two families came from Maryland some years after the war. Mr Cummin had served as a soldier, but Mr Dean had been rejected upon the grounds of being more needed to keep the Indians in subjection. Mr Harom Cummin lived near Mountain Creek. None of his descendants are in this county now. He was captured once by the British and held on a prison ship. Once he was struck on the head with a great iron key and knocked senseless. He told many tales of the cruelty of the British to their prisoners. Before his death Mr Cummin became bed-ridden. The doctor of all that section of county then was Dr. Thompson, father of the late Dr. Richard E. Thompson. It is believed that Harmon Cummin is buried at Old Mountain Creek grave yard, but it is not certain. In the Dean section there is a spring still known as "The Cummin Spring".

12. JOHN HARRIS--born 1762 d. 16 April 1845

John Harris Applied 9 Dec 1833 aged 71-served during the war under Colonels Andrew Williamston, Andrew Pickens of SC, Clark of Georgia, McCall and Sampson Matthews of Virginia. Under Captains Noble, McCall, Tucker and Johnson. He enlisted with his father at Little River, Abbeville Co., SC. Fought at Cowpens, was shot through the head at Savannah River. After the war he lived in Pendleton District and married a daughter of Gen. Andrew Pickens. From Harrisburg, Pennsylvania--lived at the confluence of Seneca River and Conneross Creek and called his home "Harrisburg". He was a member of the state convention of 1790, sheriff for a short term, and ordinary of Pendleton and Anderson District for about forty years. He practiced medicine and treated most of the prominent people of the district--He was a "Steam Doctor".

His children were: Andrew, Joseph P., Benjamin, Dr. Nathaniel and Eliza Harris who married a Mr. Burns. Rev. Pension No. 23234 History of Anderson Co., SC pg 77 by Louise Ayer Vandiver

Squire, John Harris (born 1762) died 16 April 1845 aged 83 married Mary Pickens, eldest daughter of General Andrew Pickens from Pennsylvania to Abbeville SC to Pendleton District after the Rev. War. Mary Pickens Harris lived to a venerable old age. Written by A.T. Harris of Seneca, SC 24 Nov 1857. History of Upper SC Vol. II pg. 50-51 by John H. Logan

Mary Harris, wife of John Harris, and eldest daughter of General Andrew Pickens, departed this life on the 27 May 1836. A member of the Presbyterian Church. Pendleton District Issue: 17 June 1836

General Andrew Pickens married Rebecca Calhoun 19 March 1765 d/o Ezekiel Calhoun.

John and Mary Pickens Harris had issue: Andrew Harris, John Harris, Rebecca Harris, Mary Harris, Ezekiel Harris, Nathaniel Harris, Thomas Harris, Joseph Harris, Eliza Harris and Benjamin Harris. History of Old Pendleton District and Genealogy of Leading Families pg 190-191 by Col. R.W. Simpson

John Harris, Esq. departed this life on Saturday the 16th April in the 84th year of his age. A tried soldier of the Revolution. He leaves a large family of children and grandchildren. Pendleton Messenger Issue: 2 May 1845

13. WILLIAM MOORE--South Carolina Rev. Pension No. S21391 born North Carolina--Pvt. South Carolina Line--Applied 16 May 1833 age 71.

Among the earliest settlers who came to this section were three brothers, Irish, who had lived for a time in Virginia. They were Eliab, Samuel and William Moore. They built rude cabin homes in the wilderness, that of Samuel was very near what is now High Shoals. Back in Ireland Samuel Moore left a dearly loved friend named Smith who with his wife and two children started on the long journey but while at sea Mr Smith died and was buried beneath the waves. His wife continued the journey with her children and after many trials they reached the home of her husband's friend, where they were warmly welcomed. They made their home with Samuel Moore and waited on his wife Mrs Moore who was almost an invalid. Mrs Smith rode over seventy miles of Tory infested country during the Revolutionary War to take Col. Moore clothes and food. After the war the Moores built Mrs Smith and her children a home near their own and Mrs Smith's descendents still live in the county. FEDERAL CENSUS

Our First Census

As directed by the Constitution as a means obtain information on the actual number of inhabitants living in our early county, The First Census Act was sighed by President Washington on March 1, 1790.

The results of our first official Federal census were sent directly to President Washington and later turned over to the Secretary of State. The National Archives is responsible for administering these records and other basic records of the legislative, judicial, and excutive branches of our Government.

First State Census of the United States, 1790

The following are the original census enumerations for 1790. Schedules for some counties are missing. No schedules are known to exist for Delaware, Georgia, Kentucky, New Jersey, Tennessee, and Virginia; apparently they were destroyed during the British attack on Washington during the War of 1812. The 1790 schedules for Virginia which appear on microfilm were reconstructed from State enumerations.

Original 1790 Census Schedules: 1. Connecticut, 2. Maine, 3. Maryland, 4. Massachusetts, 5. New Hampshire, 6. New York, 7. North Carolina, 8. Pennsylvania, 9. Rhode Island, 10. South Carolina, and 11. Vermont.

Genealogical Importance

Although no Federal records were created specifically to fulgfill the needs of genealogists, the federal census is considered to be the most important and richest source of information for genealogical research. Federal population and census schedules contain a wealth of information for the Campbell genealogists, historians, and researchers interested in topics such as westward expansion, the status of free and slave labor, regional and local history, and immigration.

Often the census also contains evidence for providing citizenship which may be the first step in determining from which county our earlier ancestors came.

The Campbell family historian is very fortunate that a hand our written surname is very free flowing, clear, and very easy to locate in micro filmed copies of early censuses.

Availability

The National Archives has microfilm copies of the original population schedules for 1790 - 1920 and are available for sale by the National Archives. Many area historic depositories and

libraries have copies of census enumerations and population schedules.

Census Information

As a rule, the information gathered in each successive census is progressively more detailed. The schedules for 1790 - 1840 show the names of enumerated heads of household only while other members of the household were simply tallied by age group, sex, and race.

All following enumerations list each individual by name, except for the slave schedules of 1850 and 1860 which show the name of the owner and the number of his slaves by age group and sex. The census of 1850 was the first to record each person's age, occupation if over age 15, and place of birth.

If the parent of a person enumerated in the census of 1870 was of foreign birth, that fact was indicated. The 1880 census added the relationship of each individual to the head of the household.

Mortality Schedules

Beginning in 1850 and through 1880, mortality schedules were taken by census enumerators. If a person died during the twelve-month period which preceded the taking of each of the census, the schedules show the name, the month and cause of death, and state, territory, or county of birth.

Missing Schedules

Most of the 1890 population schedules were destoyed by fire. Fragments do exist for the counties of the following states: Alabama, Illinios, New Jersey, North Carolina, Texas, Georgia, Minnesota, New York, Ohio, and District of Columbia.

Special Censuses

The National Archives also has the 1890 special schedules of Union veterans and widows of veterans for Washington, DC, about half of Kentucky, and for states in alphabetical order from Louisiana through Wyoming.

The schedules give the name and post office address of each living veteran and of each veteran's widow (along with the name of her deceased husband) and information about the service of each veteran named.

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

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

Unfortunately, there is very little available in printed records since Pickens County became a county in 1968.

Birth and Death Records were not required by the State of South Carolina until 1915.

Marriage Records from July 11, 1911, are located in the Pickens County Administration Building, Pickens, South Carolina.

(The only earlier birth, death, and marriage records are from newspaper and church notices, Classification number 929.3)

Wills from 1828 are located in the Pickens County Administration Building, Pickens, S. C.


