

The lands of Dyson Stephens all that certain piece parcel and trust of land of fourteen hundred acres which Samuel Stephens dec'd seized situate and being in the District of Pendleton aforesaid on waters of Twelve Mile River and including all the land of the said Samuel Stephens dec'd which lie together and adjoin the tract on which the said Samuel Stephens lived at the time of his death all of which are supposed to contain fourteen hundred acres. Lands purchased by John Clayton at Public sale of Pendleton District for two hundred and thirty dollars and thirty seven cents being the higest sum that was bidden to be paid to the widow. 6 October 1828.
