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# Gen. Easley Died At Age Of 47

**EASLEY** — Gen. William King Easley, the man for whom Easley was named, died at the age of 47 after a lifetime of accomplishment more fitting a man twice those years.

Lawyer, planter, legislator, and railroad promoter, he was born Jan. 28, 1825, on his father's "Riverside" plantation in the present Crosswell community. His parents were John Allen Easley and Elizabeth King Easley, the latter a daughter of John King, recognized as one of General Washington's body-guard.

After being educated in private schools, he read law and was admitted to the S. C. bar in 1850. He practiced law in New Orleans until a yellow fever epidemic prompted him to return to Pickens. Later, he opened a law office in Greenville Courthouse, retaining his home in Pickens.

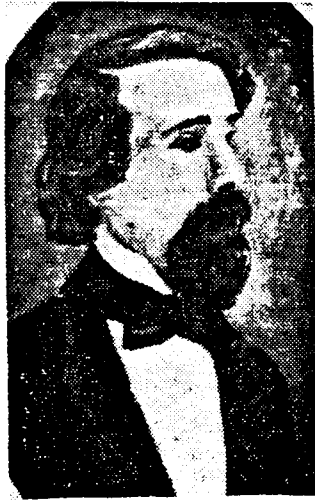
In 1852 he married Carolina Sloan, daughter of Thomas Sloan and Nancy Blessingame Sloan of Pendleton. They had eight children.

A historian says "it was William King Easley who made the fiery and sensational speech at the Pickens District Convention

on Dec. 10, 1860, at which a resolution was passed for the district to secede from the United States of America."

Mr. Easley was also elected a delegate to the State Secession Convention, and was one of the signers of the Ordinance of Secession. There is some dispute as to whether he attended as a delegate from Pickens or Greenville District.

This pioneer leader raised a

company of cavalry in Pickens and Greenville Districts and was mustered into the Confederate Army in Charleston with the rank of major. He contracted yellow fever and returned home after a short period of service.

Easley was elected to the House of Representatives in 1865 and was instrumental in the reorganization of the state militia, serving as adjutant general. From this, he retained the courtesy title of "general" the rest of his life. He was active in relief work in his devastated state, even distributing a gift of corn from the state of Maryland.

After the war, it was through his leadership that the railway now the Southern, was run through Pickens County. He was the first attorney general of the Southern Railway Foundation. While in Atlanta on railroad business, he was suddenly taken ill and died within a few hours, in July of 1872.

He was buried in the family cemetery at the Riverside plantation, a few miles east of Easley, the town named for him. The neglected cemetery is still at that site.



**MR. AND MRS. JAMES LEWIS!** He was born July 26, 1807 in the Pickens District and died March 25, 1883. He was a farmer, and one of the commissioners designated to select



the new Pickens county seat. His wife, Mary Stewart Lewis, was born in 1811 and died March 26, 1883, the day following her husband's death.



Letter written by Archibald "Henson" Ellison in 1921 "An Incident in the Life of Captain A.H. Ellison given in 1929 to his daughter Mrs Agnes Ellison Hutchinson of West Union SC age 99 (in 1977), widow of William Hutchinson who died in 1948, members of Richland Presbyterian Church.

About the first of May 1865, I returned from the war to my home which was about four miles from Easley on the Greenville Road: I had been away practically eight years, having worked for four years for a tobacco company in North Carolina before enlisting in the Confederate Army. Some ten days later a company of Northern troops composed of twenty-five or thirty men from a brigade stationed near Anderson SC came into our community, ransacking the homes, taking money, watches, silverware and other valuables from the people.

When they were ready early next morning to leave their camp which was within one-half mile of our house, someone fired from ambush where a squad of men were hiding, and killed one of their men. The Yankees fled, not knowing who had attacked them. I heard the firing and in a few minutes I saw them coming by my home. They asked me to tell them the nearest way out to Easley's Bridge on the Greenville road as they were to meet their comrades at Greenville. Having received this information from me, they voluntarily told us that they had lost one of their men. My brother Monroe and I promised to see that he was buried in the Turner burying ground nearby. When we went to see Mr Turner, he and his son Ben went with us to the camp where we found the body of the soldier who had been killed. Returning to the Turner home, we prepared as best we could his body for burial. We buried him that same day.

That Afternoon two of those soldiers in citizen's clothes came back to ascertain the facts about the killing and the burial. They seemed quite satisfied for they gave me the soldier's name and regiment. I cannot now recall the name--so that I might cut it on the marker for his grave, a service which I gladly rendered. Having thanked us they rode away and we thought the incident was closed.

A week later, however my brother and I saw five soldiers ride up to our gate, when we walked out to meet them they told us curtly that we with our brother, William and Ben Turner were under arrest for the killing from ambush of one of their men. They carried us to Turner's house where we found a company of soldiers waiting for the court at which we were to be tried for this crime. All the witnesses except the four of us being colored men, our evidence was taken first. We all swore that we knew nothing of the crime. The negroes swore that we might have done it, one adding that he thought we did and believed that Henson Ellison was the leader.

The Captain, then called Sergeant Joseph H. Eason, detailed our four men with him, and gave them orders to burn our house and take my life, saying "Someone has to pay for his life and it may as well be this one as any other." Bewildered I did as they told me to, setting out to lead the way to my house and instructing them also how to find the Easley Bridge. Walking along, I gave the Mason's sign of distress and found that Sergeant Eason, to, was a Mason as he returned it. Although I did not discover it just then, I found that another Mason in the group had also caught the sign I had given, for he was to befriend me within the next few minutes. The soldiers set fire to the house and while it was burning, ordered me to follow them. I went with them to a plantation road that led through a patch of woods nearby, offering the information that this road would lead them to Easley Bridge. Almost without my realizing what was taking place, my unknown Mason friend had said to the other three "Lets gallop up boys, I don't care to see this done" and off they had ridden leaving me with Sergeant Eason.



Within a few seconds he had fired his pistol into the air, had shaken hands with me and had said "Goodbye and good luck to you", giving me his name and address as Joseph M. Eason, Dayton Ohio--a name I will never forget.

While Sergeant Eason and his men were going on their way, I returned whistling up the old road to the burning house to join my sisters. I found that my two brothers had been released and were with them already. All night we sat around the smoldering ruins of what had been our home and from which we had saved practically nothing.

The soldiers reported in Greenville that they had burned the Ellison home and had shot Henson Ellison. On the next day a number of my friends came over from there to attend my funeral, only to have me greet them personally on their arrival. A Fraternal pledge had been fulfilled, my life had been spared. Signed: Archibald Henson Ellison. Submitted by his daughter Mrs Agnes Ellison Hutchinson b. 19 May 1878 d. 27 March 1981 and her husband William Isaac Hutchison b. 8 Sept 1869 d. 11 April 1948 both buried Richland Presbyterian Church, Oconee Co SC.

A Short History of the Ellison Family recorded in 1921 by A.H. Ellison and given to his daughter Mrs Agnes Ellison Hutchinson in Aug 1929 and published 9 March 1975.

About the year 1810, five Ellison brothers moved from North Carolina to the upper part of South Carolina. Their names were as follows: Joel, Miles, James, Matthew and John. Matthew later went to Jackson Co, GA where he married and reared a large family. John went to Alabama when a young man, not married. I know nothing more of him. Joel married and settled in the upper part of Laurens Co SC. He too reared a large family of whom I know but little. Miles settled in Anderson Co, near Williamston SC. I know very little too of his large family. James who is my grandfather married Polly Cox and settled in the upper part of Anderson County on Brushy Creek, they reared nine sons and three daughters whose names are William, Joel, Matthew, James, John, Hugh, Thomas, Lewis and David. Barbara married a Johnson, Nancy married a Ballentine and Polly married a Prather. All lived to the age of maturity but are dead at the present date 1921.

William Ellison who was my father was the eldest son of James Ellison. He married Miss Sophronia Nichols d/o Archibald and Nancy Nichols of Anderson Co. They first settled about one and one half miles north of what is now Belton. It was at this place that I was borned 22 Dec 1839. In the year of 1841 we moved to Pickens Co and settled on Little Georges Creek on the road leading from old Pickensville (now Easley) to Greenville Courthouse, about four miles east of Easley. My father and mother reared six children: James Monroe, Archibald Henson, William Matthew, Mary Jane, Martha Ann Elizabeth and Nancy Poole Ellison. All are living at this date (1921) except Mary Jane each has married and reared a family.

At the age of eighteen I, A.H. Ellison went to Rockingham Co NC and engaged in the Manufacture and sale of tobacco, continuing in this buisness until the outbreak of the Civil War. I joined Army in Sept 1861 at Charleston SC enlisting in Capt John Westfields Co F. Second SC Cavalry and ordered to Virginia and put in General Wade Hampton's Brigade, Gen J.E.B. Stuarts Cavalry, Lee's Army of Virginia. We remained in VA until 1864 when our Regiment was ordered to Wilmington NC here we remained until the fall of Fort Fisher at the mouth of Cape Fear River. When the enemy took Wilmington we fell back to Goldsboro and joined General Johnson. We were with his command when General Lee surrendered at Appomatox, and remained with General Johnson of course until he surrendered at Greensboro NC about the 20 April 1865. Our Company marched through to Greenville SC and disbanded on the 25 April 1865. I married Miss Martha Agnes Steele 2 Sept 1869 d/o

the late William Davis and Margaret McElroy Steele of Oconee Co SC. After living for one year in Lexington SC we settled in Oconee Co SC where ten of our eleven children were born.

My wife, Martha Agnes Steele Ellison died 24 Jan 1921 at the age of 75 years. I am now living with my daughter Mrs W.I. Hutchison at West Union SC. Sg: A.H. Ellison

August 1929: I am now in my ninetieth year, having had many trials but have much for which to be tahnkful. I can see very well and am remarkably active for my age, still going where I please, working my garden and looking after the chickens as I have always done. Sg: A.H. Ellison

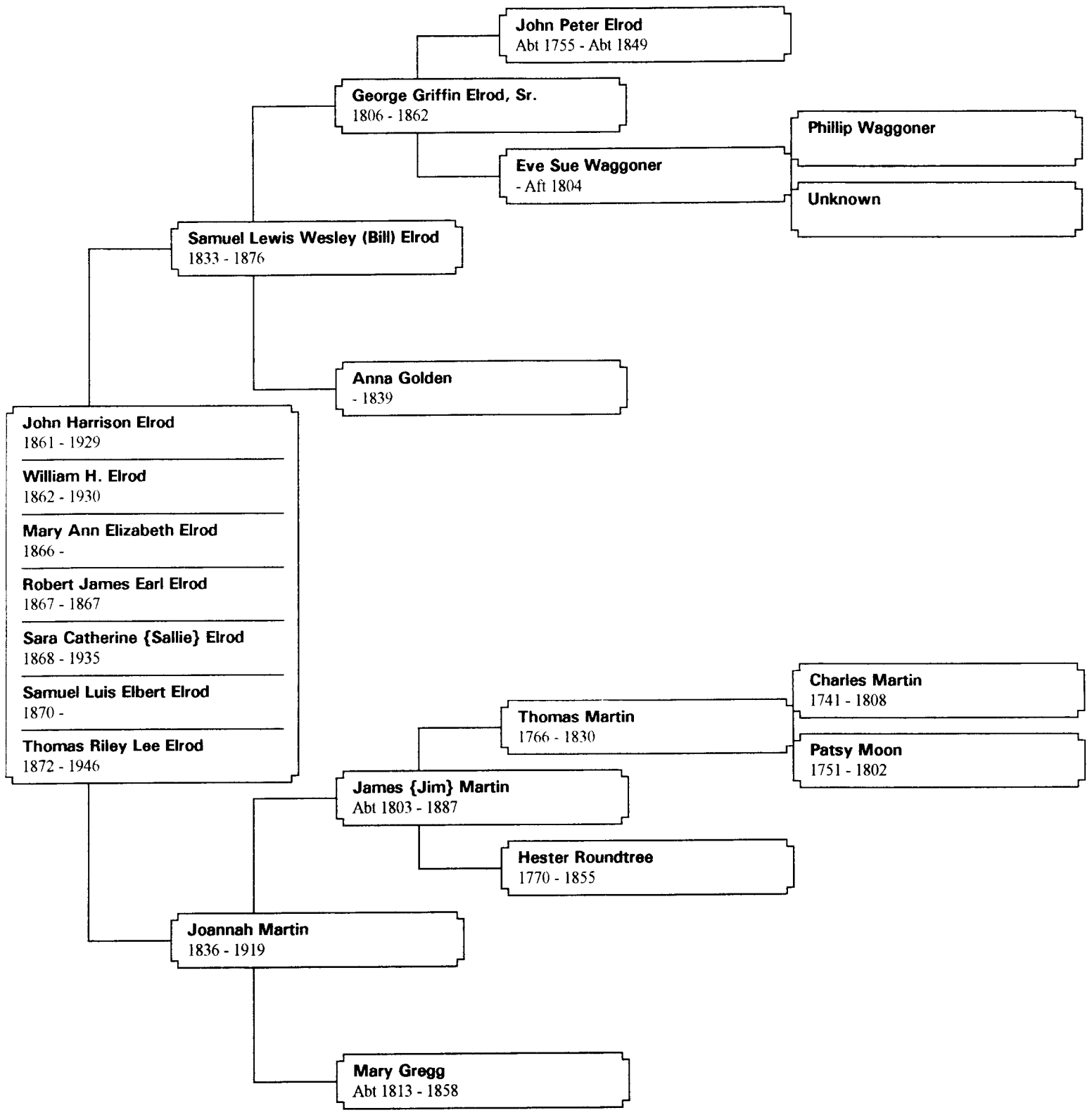

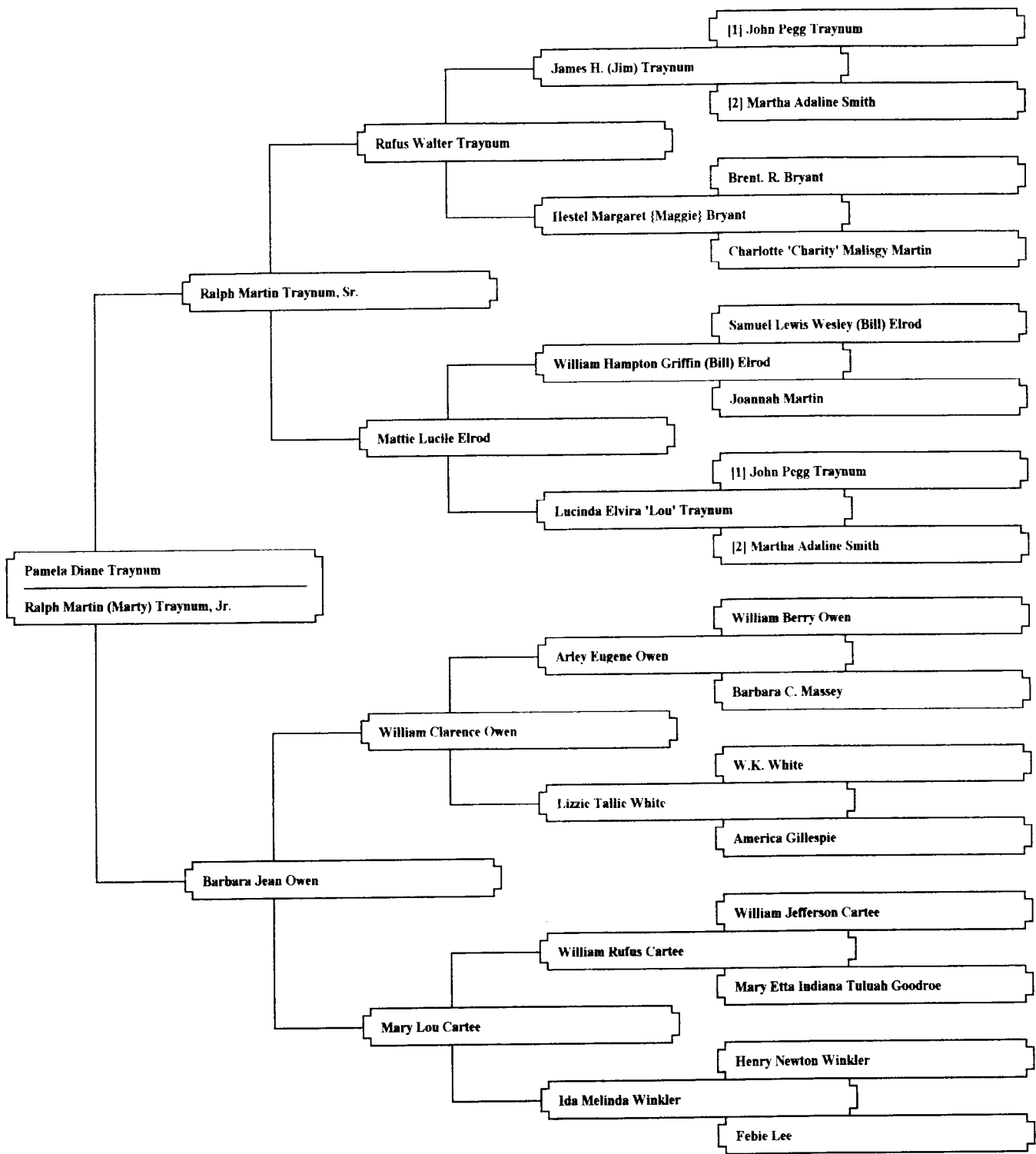
