The only reason I am writing this note on the opened envelope is to send you the address correction you see above. Please enter it into any records you have there in Newport News.

I am an associate member of three other chapters, but Old Pendleton is my "Home Chapter" I come from York County, S.C., where I was born. My GETTYS immigrant ancestor settled in Lancaster County, in that section known as "The Waxhaws". My mother had ancestors in Pickens District, but she herself was born in White County, Georgia. Her Pickens District people were BARNETTS and HOODS. She had JENKINS and CORBIN ancestors in old Anderson District

Fun, ain't it?

My husband and I are both avid genealogists. He has been researching 61 years now, and I have been collecting data 47 years. We met and married in 1967 and continued to research together! We attend The National Genealogical Society's annual Conference in the States every year, and also the Conference put on by the Federation of Genealogical Societies every year. Both are superb. We missed, for the first time, our South Carolina Genealogical Society's Workshop back in July because we were in Washington, D.C. attending the National Institute on Genealogical Research, sponsored by the National Archives every year

And we have just returned from a glorious two-week stay in Ulster. We did some research while there and are pleased to report that it is "do-able". You know that many people throw up their hands about researching in Ireland because of the destruction of records in 1922, but IT CAN BE DONE if one is not lazy, is dedicated, is willing to dig and sweat and be patient. It is not for the faint-hearted or for those who want someone else to dig it out for them and hand it over on a silver platter. It takes WORK. And TIME.

We are doing as much traveling as we like and can do while we are able. I am 74 and Harry is 80. Who knows what tomorrow will bring? We are "picking flowers" (and ancestors) while we can. Fast comes the night.

We're off next month for Arkansas's annual workshop.

Hope you are well, and that all is well with you. I mailed my dues for next year to our Society the day before your letter came in!

WILLIAM HENRY CAREY

Death of Willian Henry Carey who died at his home in Honea Path on 23 March 1915 after a protracted illness. The body was carried to Seneca, his old home, and interred in the cemetery there after funeral services conducted by his pastor, Rev. E.S. Reaves of Honea Path, and Rev. T.M. Galphin of Seneca.

The deceased was born at Old Pickens 8 April 1853. His brothers were John C. Carey deceased, James P. Carey of Pickens, N. Boone Carey and Frank M. Carey of Seneca, Z.G. Carey of North Carolina and L.W. Carey deceased. He had one sister, Mrs Pickens Huffman deceased. He was married 4 Nov 1880 to Miss Sallie A. Perritt of Greenville who survives him. Of this union there are four children who survive their father: L.R. Carey of Paris, Texas, Mrs Joe McConnauey of Lenoir, NC, Miss Winona Carey of Honea Path and Harry W. Carey of Charleston.

The deceased joined the Baptist Church at Elberton, GA in 1884. He had been a resident of Honea Path for three years and engaged in the cotton brokerage business, associated with his brother F.M. Carey. Mr Carey was a man of unquestioned business integrity and was held in high esteem by all who knew him. Pickens Sentinel Issue: 1 April 1915

March 1848 WILLIAM TUCKER, Grievance

(original spelling)

May, about 15, Dejarnet Tucker was as the Court House and when he started home he fell in company with Milford and he asked him what he ment by saying all the Tuckers were lyers and he said becaus old Bartley Tucker swore a lye and Esqr. Hall has a copy of it. I twok Bro. Gray and went to Bro. Hall's and told him wht I had understood about farther swaring of a lye and asked him if he had a copy of it and he answered me he had. I ask him kindly to let me see if and if it was so. I had no more to say about it he would shew it to me. I told him to bring it to the Meeting House on Saturday and let us be reconsild. I told him I would not prevent the Comunion but he would see we would not Comune. By axident we was prevented that day.

I then twok the second step with Bro. Hall on Wednesday weak after the Comunion. I took Bro. Gray and B.D. Tucker and went and seed him again and intreated him again to let me see that oath and his excuse was that it was mislaid, lost or burnt. I told him to look and try to find it and bring to our next Meeting. He replyd to me if he had it he would not bring. I told him I was biterly hurt with him on that act and that I would tell it to the Church. His answer was that it should not go into the Church if he could help it. I then came home and on the same day lurn to the knowledge sume eight or nine yeares agow Bro. W.A. Hall and Bro. Reubin had sum difficulty in their Sand Business and they agreed to leave the matter to Esqr. John Black and Esqr. Z. Hall and they met at Bro. W. Hall's and in conversation Bro. Hall said to Esqr. Black that Bro. Reubin was a Chip of the old Block for the old man Tucker swore it lye and that he had a copy of it. (When I askd the questions he said he never shewed it nor mothed it to no man.)

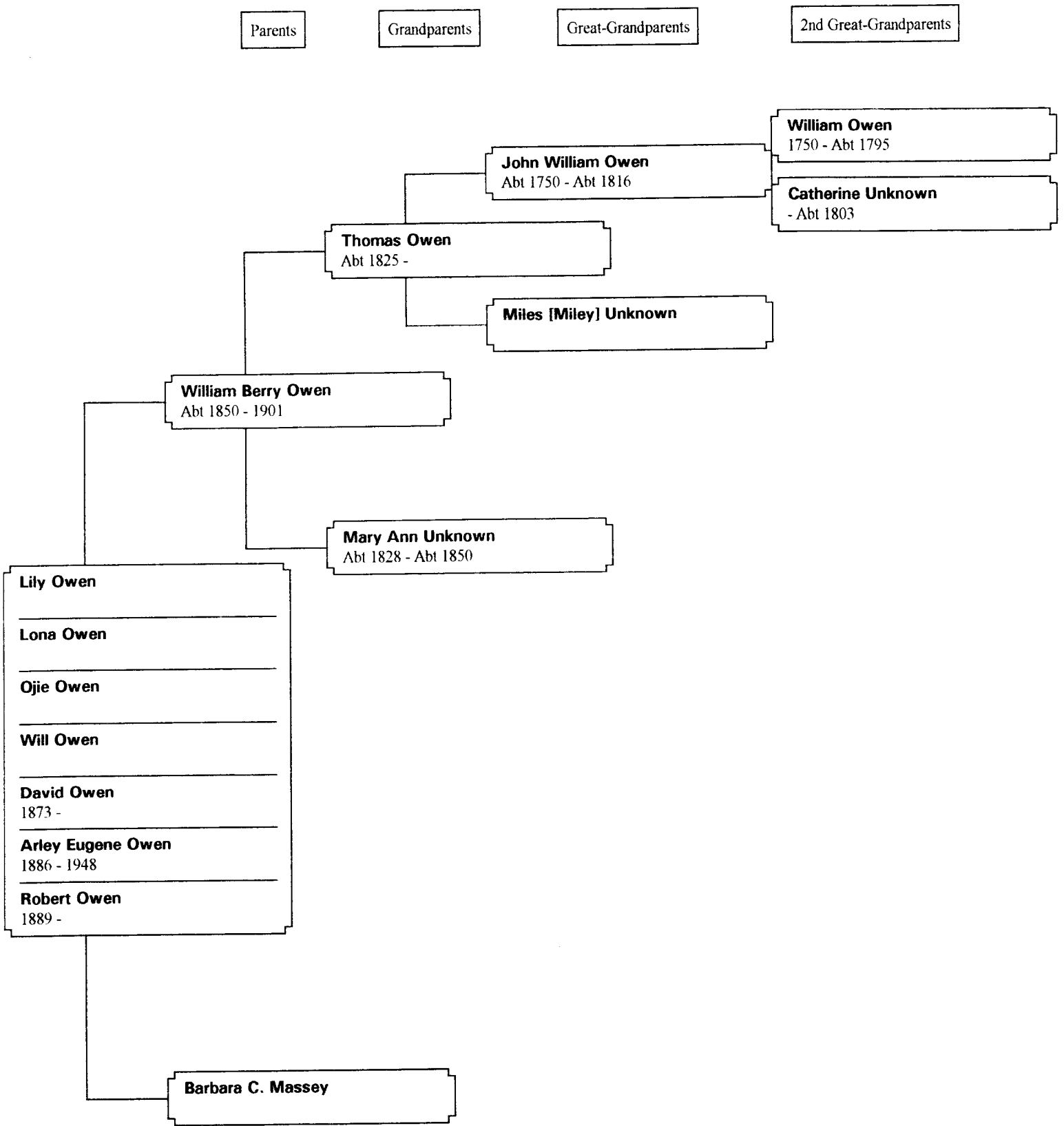

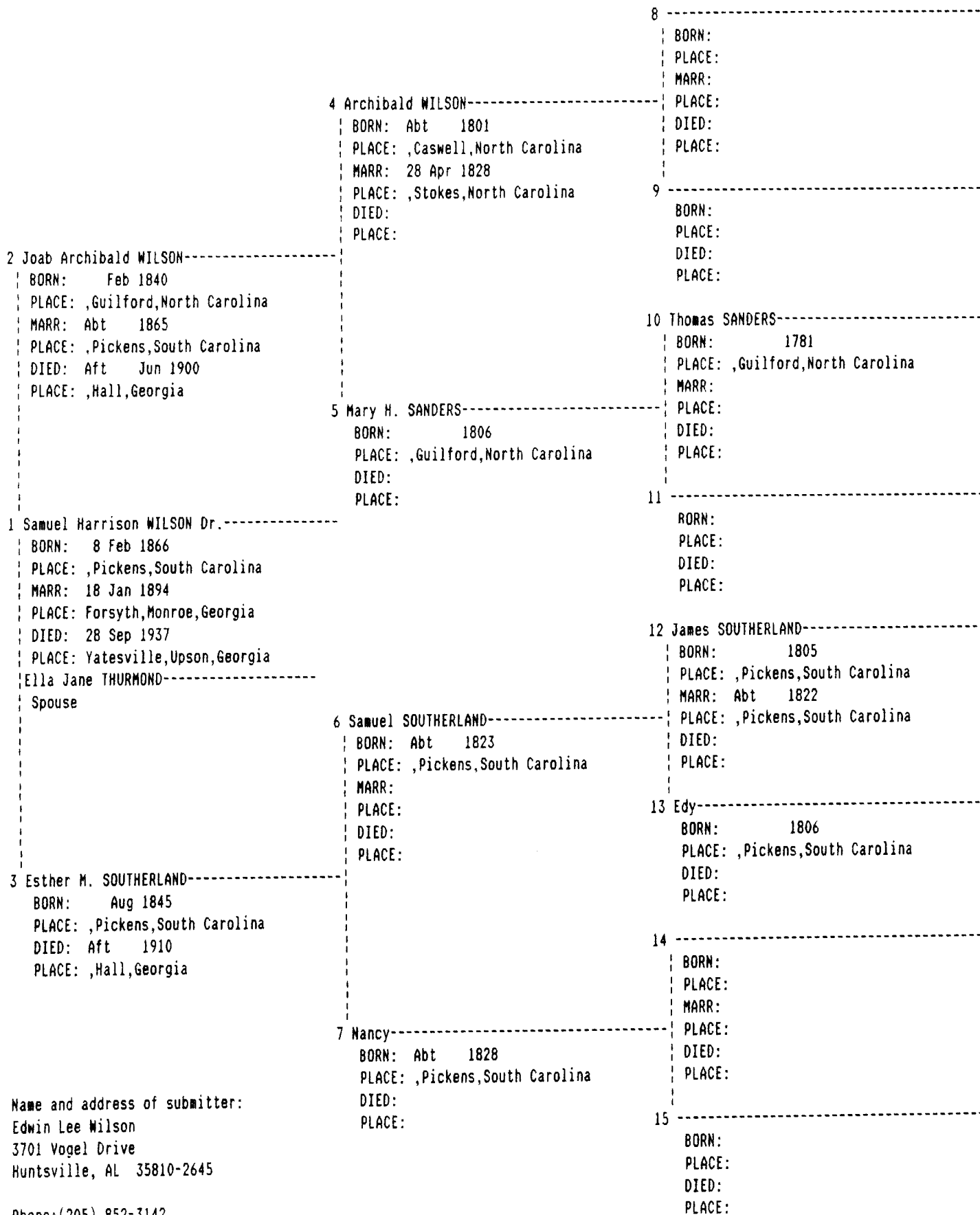

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Zion United Methodist Church: A History



Old Zion Methodist Church
EASLEY, SC

1791-1979

John R. McCravy, Pickens County Historian, reports that "in his many travels through South Carolina in the late 18th Century, Frances Asbury is said to have stopped in 1791 at the old log tavern in Pickensville . . . the old three-story log tavern had a large barn which housed the change horses for the stagecoach which came to Pickensville three times a week . . . While preaching and taking his rest there, he learned of the brush arbor (open air meeting places within a shady retreat of tall pines and oaks) in the area. Before he continued his journey he held services at Mt. Zion, later known as Zion Methodist Church; Happy Hallow, which he renamed Mt. Olivette; and Mt. Tabor."

Zion Methodist Church had its beginning in the year 1828. A wonderful meeting was held in the woods near where the old church stood. The services were conducted by Travis Owens. Here, without an organization or regular preaching place, but under the power of God, the whole community was converted, and a congregation was organized. Before the first church was built, meetings were held in the homes of the people in the community. They began to hold the first home meetings in 1830.

At first, services were held in the home of John Lesley, grandfather of Jasper Lesley, at the spot now known as the Jasper Lesley homeplace, at Rooker Mauldin's home, now known as the Frank Lesley place, and at Hamp Smith's home, now known as the Mattie Smith homeplace. The services were held at regular intervals until 1830, when John Lesley gave the first land for a church. This was an acre on the north side of the road near where our new church now stands. A log church was erected on this spot and was used until 1857.

Charter members of Zion Methodist Church are as follows: Travis Owens, Rooker Mauldin, Hamp Smith, John Lesley, Sarah Lesley, Jim Lesley, Joshua Lesley, Maria Lesley, Tom Smith, Elizabeth Day Smith, Jim Wood, Patsy Wood, John Kilby, Susan Smith Kilby, Tom Waters, Mary Lesley Waters, Mabry Mauldin, Polly Mullinix, John P. Smith, Lemmuel Hamilton, Coleman Smith, Nancy Arrial, Betty Lesley Chapman, Mary Smith Roper, Tom Gentry, William Austin, Jim Brissey, John Espie, Samuel Wilson, Anderson Lesley, John Cantrell, Ben Rogers, W.H. Jasper Lesley, Josephine K. Lesley, Bennett Owens, Samuel Sheriff, Alford (Buck) Sheriff, Mattie Smith, Fletcher Lesley, Betty Mullinix, Betty Ballentine, Lemmuel Chapman, John F. Lesley, Thomas Lesley, Lou Lesley, Lizzie Welborn, Jeffrey Welborn.

At the same time that Mr. Lesley gave the original acre for the building, Mr. Lemmuel Hamilton offered an acre on the south side of

the road to be used as a cemetery. These two tracts of land were deeded to Zion church in 1857 but were not recorded until July 11, 1904.

In 1857, a more substantial church building was erected where our old church stood. When it was completed, Mrs. Matilda Hollingsworth presented a beautiful Bible and hymnal to the church. Also in this same year, with the erection of the second church, Jasper Lesley gave another half an acre to be added to the cemetery. When this property was deeded to the church the following men were trustees of the church: B.F. Lesley, Ben F. Rogers, Coleman Smith, Alford A. Sheriff, and Samuel Sheriff.

The first preacher at Zion that we have any record of is Rev. A.B. McGilvray who came in 1849. He lived in the mountains, and rode horseback to the old log church where services were held.

In April, 1879, the first Sunday School was begun at Zion. Mabry Mauldin was the first superintendent of the Sunday School.

The earliest that any of our older members remembers prayer meetings being held is 1895. Among those who attended regularly were John Cantrell, Sam Sheriff, John Espie, Riley Lesley, Tom Waters, Josephine Lesley, Ben Rogers, and Jim Brissey.

Our old church, which was torn down in 1960, was built in 1905 and 1906 under the pastorate of R.M. Dubose. Church services were held in old Zion School house during the time of erection. During the summer of 1906, Rev. J.F. Anderson preached the dedication sermon. Mrs. Ida Hollingsworth Smith presented a large Bible and hymnal to the church.

Zion Church sent out several preachers. Rev. Rufus Childs preached his first sermon here. Others were Rev. W.H. Arrial, and J.W. Arrial.

Zion Church organized the Ladies Aid in 1913 with five members and has grown until there are 15 active members of the UMW today. In 1915 the Ladies Aid remodeled the pulpit and choir area of the old church, and in 1916 they carpeted the church at a cost of \$54.68. They raised this money by collecting dimes and embroidered the names of the contributors on a square piece of white cloth. Then these pieces were sewed together. Mrs. Sadie Ballentine was president, and Mrs. Mattie Smith was secretary and treasurer.
