Petersburg and here 30 July 1864 suffered death from a mine exploded by the
Federals. Here the surviving Carolinians under the command of Stephen
Elliott by their valor turned a dreadful disaster into a glorious victory.
Erected by the South Carolina Division United Daughters of the Confederacy

JOSEPH CALDWELL--Rev. Pension No. South Carolina R1595 BLWT. 61335-160-55. Died 10 March 1851 wife Tabitha Busby. Enlisted while residing in Anderson District SC and served in the 3rd Reg. under Capt. Godfrey Dreher, Major Hart and Col. Thomson. Under Capt. Owens at battle of Four Holes and under Capt. Gabriel Fridign at Orangeburg. Sometimes a scout.

JOHN PARKER--Rev. Pension No. South Carolina S21414
Born 1753/9 Ireland died 1845 wife Elizabeth Grissom died 1804 both buried
Ebenezer Baptist, Belton, Anderson County, SC. Enlisted while residing in
Abbeville District SC 18 Nov 1775 under Capt. John Irvin and Gen. Williams
and was in the battle at Nailpens and was on Snow Campaign. Sent against the
Cherokee Indians in 1776 while in the same unit and in July 1777 on the
Florida Expedition. During Feb 1778 marched against the Indians while under
Capt. Irvine and Col. Pickens. In the Rangers under Capt John Norwood and
Col. Jackson in May 1779. Served under Cols. Anderson and Pickens and
marched against the Indians during 1780. served under Capt Samuel Moore in
Jan 1781 and was in skirmishes with the Tories. After Moore was killed he
served under Capt. Robert Maxwell and fought Bloody Bill Cunningham at Bull
Swamp.

He lived 1810-1860 in the Zion UMC section of Easley and donated the land on which the first Zion Church was built. (I understand these deeds were not recorded until perhaps 1905.)

We Prier Alexander, Elisha Alexander and Elijah Alexander Jr. are bound unto M.M. Norton Esq. Commissioner of the Court of Equity for Two thousand dollars dated 5 Feb 1849. A petition presented on the 22 June 1848 did nominate and appoint Prier Alexander guardian of the estate and effects of Elizabeth Jane Alexander a minor under the age of twenty one years. Sg: Prier Alexander, Elisha Alexander and E. Alexander. Pickens Co SC Probate Guardianship and Equity Box 1 No. 4

ARMSTRONG

The State of SC Pickens District: James Overton Armstrong, Abner C. Armstrong and Andrew L. Armstrong minors over the age of fourteen years. They are entitled to a share in the Estate of their father, Abner Armstrong who died intestate which they are incapable of managing by reason of their minority. That the mother of said minors is alive. Your petitioners therefore pray that Alexander B. Armstrong their brother may be appointed guardian of their personal estate. All signed. A.B. Armstrong excepted the guardianship and was signed with his mother, Margaret Armstrong dated 4 July 1859. The amount each heir will receive will not exceed seven hundred dollars. Sg: Robt A. COLLINS, RUSSELL

State of SC Pickens District, Susannah Collins late Susannah Russell by her next friend Henry Russell sheweth unto your Honors that she is entitled to a distributive share of the Estate of her father John Russell deceased amounting to not more than two hundred dollars, that her father died intestate twelve or thirteen years ago, that his children, all eight in number, being then alive and of full age after alloting to the widow a portion which satisfied her, made an equal distribution amongst themsleves of the property left by the said intestate except two negroes, which were allotted to the widow during her life--that the widow died about one year age to wit: in the Spring of the year A.D. 1856 one thousand eight hundred and fifty six--that letters of adm. were in 1856 for the first time taken out on her father's estate and the two negroes sold for the gross amount of twelve hundred and sixty dollars which amount is subject to division among the heirs at law of the said John Russell dec'd and to one eight of which your petitioner is entitled. That your petitioner is also entitled to a small contugent interest under her mother's will. That your petitioner had now contracted debts to a small amount which she has no means of paying except from this fund. That she intermarried about ten years ago with Richard Collins, that he is druc on and thriftless and if permitted would nherited by your petitioner. That she had very soon waste the small esta: two children before her marriage with him and has had none since. That your petitioner lived for a number of years entirely dependant on her own exertious and management for the support of herself and her two children and would now be capable of managing economically this estate if freed from liability of her marriage contract. That her said Husband consents that the said property may be settled to her sole use.

In Oct 1861 Robert A. Bowen at the age of 17, left his home, which was situated near the foot of Glassy Mountain, to go to the battle front. His blood was bounding with the quick throb of war and with the eyes of youth he saw nothing but crowning laurels of victory ahead. There was no sadness in him when this young man went forth to fight for his country, they were glad to have him go. His father was too old to enter service, but two sons had already gone ahead and now that the third was gone their hearts swelled with pride that they had three sons defending their own loved Southland.

My father was mustered into service at Old Pickensville. He went from there to Sullivan's Island where they remained several months, then on to Richmond and were stationed there one month before entering service. They did no actual fighting until the battle of Frazier's Farm. This Brigade was the first to open fire, it was a fierce battle, causing great slaughter among our men. My father was struck by a bomb shell which completely destroyed his gun and severly wounded his right hand. Here he was in the midst of a fearful battle with no weapon with which to fight and his hand torn and bleeding, but he was not ready to give up. It has been told me by one of his comrades that he walked up and down the line of men urging them on and begging them not to give back but pretty soon they were compelled to retreat as the enemy had turned their batteries broadsided and were simply mowing our men down. As they moved back a ball struck my father in the hip which felled him to the ground. He managed to get up, seeing a house near by and believing himself seriously wounded he went to the rear of it, finding a cellar door open he crept in, lay down and was not able to move again. This cellar was full of men, some wounded, some dying, and some just cowards hiding from shot and shell, some yankees were among them too.

All the afternoon he lay suffering agonies, and not knowing the extent of his injuries, he could hear the mighty roar of battle outside and at one time he knew that the northern army was between him and his friends but they were repulsed about night and driven from the field. thus making the South victorious.

Col. R.E. Bowen was Captain of my father's company at that time. At the close of the battle he went over the field hunting his wounded men, he would call out the name of his company and his men would answer, as he neared this old house what a welcome sound it was to my father to hear that familiar voice sing out "Company E, SC Regiment," he answered as best he could but could not make himself heard above the groans and shrieks of pain from those around him in the cellar. He begged those around him to help him answer, to answer for him, but no one knew him and paid him no attention the voice came nearer passed and faded away in the distance and he knew he was left unfound, helpless, and perhaps dying, all his bravery and bouyancy left him now and despair settled upon him, he gave up to die.

But a better fate awaited him, about ten o'clock that night his friends found him and carried him to the field hospital. The next day he was carried to Richmond, his wound was found to be in a dreadful condition, his father was telegraphed for, he came at once and brought with him Dr. John Field and in two weeks they carried him home on a stretcher, but it was months before he could walk even with the aid of crutches. For several years he carried his bullet imbedded in his hip bone, a souvenir from the yankees, he finally had it removed by going to Charleston and undergoing a painful operation.
