Lewis died 3 June 1861 in Oconee County, SC. His children 2 sons, one of which was Richard b. ca 1835 my G-G-GF. There were also 5 daughters.

Richard m. Hannah L. DICKSON b. 9 March 1826 d. 20 Jan 1910. She is buried at Crossroads Baptist Church in Oconee Co., SC. Can not find Richard or his father and mothers's graves.

Richard and Hannah had 4 sons, Marshall, John Lewis and William Virgil (twins) and Pleasant Jasper. William Virgil is my GGF he was b. 21 July 1857 and d. 20 Oct 1918 in GA. He m. Mary Mahala Melissa Elvira SMITH b. 25 June 1865 d. 4 Jan 1926 also in GA. Mary was named for her mother's 4 sisters.

My Grandmother, Lou Alice FENDLEY was born of this union in SC. They moved to GA where she met and married my Grandfather, John L. IRVIN.

Would like any info on FENDLEY Family--(Marshall and William DICKSON are Hannah's brothers) Do not know her parents or other siblings. Can not find any info on SMITH Family that Mary was born into. All of the above except Lewis were born in Pickens District nee Oconee Co., SC. Lewis was born in VA. John L. IRVIN was born in Pike Co., GA.

BIT'S and PIECES

CHRISTOPHER WHITMIRE: 6 May 1871 before Daniel Fowler, Ordinary, of County of Dawson State of Georgia came Nancy Whitmire aged 74 a resident of Barkers District Forsyth Co, GA. That she is the widow of Christopher Whitmire Pvt in the Military of the US in the War of 1812. He volunteered in Capt Benjamin Goss Co, Col Austins Reg. of SC Militia of General Earls division in Pendleton District, SC on 1 Jan 1814 and was discharged she thinks about Savannah GA on 3 July 1814. He was also a Pvt in Capt John P. Benson's Co, SC Militia. That she has received land warrents the amount not recollected. That she was married under the name of Nancy Reese by James B. McKinney at her brothers house (Jacob Reese) to said Christopher Whitmire on the 17 Dec 1814 as from the family record by the birth of oldest child. Her husband died at home in Forsythe Co GA on the 14 April 1868 and she has not remarried. Her Post office is Dixon, Dawson, Forsyth Co. State of GA. Sg: Nancy Whitmire X. Wit: Ausbon I Tayler, Jesse Wallis.

ADDITIONAL:

Nancy's Post office was in Dixon in Dawson Co GA but her home was located 4 miles from Dixon and in Forsyth Co., GA.

A document included in the file was dated 18 June 1878 and signed by their two eldest sons: George W. age 62 a resident of Dawson Co., GA b. 9 Jan 1816 and James M. age 58 resident of Dawson Co GA b. 14 Nov 1819. They moved to GA ca 1835 and their parents were married 1 Jan 1814.

A document from Elisha and Manerva Murphree of Dawson Co., GA ages 72 & 67 state that Christopher and Nancy had lived in Pendleton District, SC near Pickens and later in Forsyth Co., GA. They knew Christopher and Nancy as neighbors for 45 & 50 years.

A Document dated 14 Jan 1878 from Cherokee Co., GA written by Miles N. Holden age 88 of Cherokee Co who was a Notary Public and wife Mary Holden age 83 stating that Mary was present at the 1 Jan 1814 marriage of Christopher and Nancy performed by Justice of the Peace, James B. McKinney at the home of Jacob Reese of Pendleton, SC.

Addenda: In 1907 when their son William Reese Whitmire filed an Eastern Cherokee Application he stated that the brothers and sisters of his mother Nancy were: Absolum, Margaret, Polly Holden, Lucinda and Minervia Reese.

Daughter Eliza when she filed, said her mother's parents were Jacob and Susan Harris Reese.

Christopher Whitmire b. ca 1794 was s/o Samuel Whitmire. Samuel was the brother of Henry Whitmire of Pendleton District, SC. Henry also m. a Nancy Reese.

REV. PENSION: WILLIAM ENTRIKEN-- Born 28 Feb 1762 York Co., PA d. 2\3 Nov 1844 m. Sarah Hunnicutt. Enlisted while residing in Laurens Co SC July 1777 under Capt. William Jones as a Minuteman and marched to Georgia and placed under Capt. William Baldwin and Col. Stewart to guard the frontier. Served fourteen months on the Florida Expedition in the spring of 1778. Served three months in 1779 and two months in 1780 under Capt. Charles Saxon. Joined Capt. Alexander Irvin and Col. Clements in March 1781 and was in the seige of Augusta. Enlisted during June 1781 and served one year under Capt. James Stallings and Col. James Jackson in a Georgia Reg. of Light Dragoons and in battle near Savannah. Returned to SC at the end of this tour and acted as a scout until the end of the war. A Sgt at some time. Removed to Georgia and returned to Pendleton Dist, SC. No. SC W3532 BLWT. 26272-160-55.

SWISS FAMILY: On yesterday a family of Swiss arrived at this place from Augusta--This family, we understand, are to be followed by a number of their countrymen, who desire settling in this District for purpose of raising sheep. These people are said to be industrious, to have money, and to be entirely unprejudice against our southern institutions. They will add materially to the industry and we hope be a valuable abquisition to the community.

The Editor of the Edgefield Advertiser may, perhaps, abate a little of that astonishment of which possessed him at sight of those of his fellow citizens who were hardy and adventuresome enough to quit the ancient hills of Edgefield for Pickens when he reflects that people come, not only from the wide and winding Rhine, but from placid Lerran even to settle here.

WILL: JOHN WILSON: I John Wilson Sr. of South Carolina Pendleton District being of sound mind and disposing memory etc. My loving wife Elizabeth shall have her maintenance during life from the profit of the land and dwelling whereon I now live--To my son Robert five shillings sterling, to my daughters: Sarah, Mary Ann Jennet, Agness, Elizabeth and Hannah each five shillings sterling--to my youngest sons John and Hugh after my death the tract of land I now live on containing two hundred acres lying on Saluda River, Pend. Dist., to be equally divided between them--Exors: my two sons John and Hugh. Dated 5 April 1812 Sg: John Wilson Wit: Samuel Houston, Henry Cobb and William Rogers X. Prov date not given. Anderson Co SC Will Bk A pg 289. (NOTE: believe his daughter Sarah m. James Hugh Ellison?)

MARRIED: On Thursday evening 27 inst. by Rev. Wm McWhorter, Col E. R. Doyle to Miss Susan Dendy all of this District. Keowee Courier, Sat 29 March 1851.

EQUITY: Pickens SC: Abraham Duke, Harriet Duke and Ransom Duke VS: Joseph Dolleson, Melinda Dolleson, Benjamin Cannon, Washington Cannon, Carter Cannon, James Cannon, Margaret Marshbanks, Judy or Judith Kendrick, Elijah Cannon, Martha Brown and William Gilstrap. The complaints having filed their bill of complaint and it appearing that Joseph Dolleson, Melinda Dolleson, Benjamin Cannon, Washington Cannon, Carter Cannon, James Cannon, Margaret Marshbanks, Judy or Judith Kendrick, Elijah Cannon and Martha Brown defendants reside without the limits of this Satae and are ordered to reply within three months from this date 21 March 1857.

STEWART: Robert Stewart b. ab 1748 near Newbern, Craven Co., NC. When he was young his father moved to Cumberland Co., NC and afterwards settled in Wilkes Co., GA, before Robert was grown, prior to the Revolutionary War. Robert lived in Wilkes until his marriage about 1772 to Nancy Holloway, he then moved to Ogeechee. He served in the Rev. War from GA. Robert and Nancy moved to Upton Creek in Richmond Co and after war they again went to Ogeechee where they remained a short time. About 1793 they moved to Lacona in Pickens District, SC where Robert applied 7 Mar 1833 for a pension when 84 years old. He died 8 Dec 1835 and Nancy died 5 Dec 1843. Issue of Robert and Nancy Stewart: William, Elizabeth m. Richard Thompson, Mary m. Nathaniel Harbin, Robert, Abraham, Sarah unmarried in 1853, Nancy m. John Hudson. Ancestral Hendricks Family
From FRONTIER HENDRICKS BOOK vol 1 and MANUSCRIPT vol 2
Synopsis by Herbert D. Hendricks

Data obtained from Colonel Meredith Hendricks, 11746 Lucknow Lane, La Plata, Md 20646 from research by Dr. JOHN SCOTT DAVENPORT of Holmdel, NJ published in a book called FRONTIER HENDRICKS vol. 1 and a manuscript for vol 2 and an analysis of the Hendricks data by Gene Hays of Loves Park, Ill. in a letter to Col. Hendricks dated 19 March 1995. Col. Hendricks is the person to contact about the book and manuscript.

I have taken the liberty to organize some of the above information from FRONTIER HENDRICKS and Gene Hays in a more ancestral chart fashion and put some comments into the parts that concern a James, David and Henry Hendricks which first show in Newberry Co., SC by official records. My comments are based on Herbert Dupree Hendricks' Family History and research of South Carolina Records, Zula Atwood's SMITH COUSINS FOUR data on our Hendricks family and the most gracious information supplied by Mrs. Mary Hunt Copeland of Greenwood, South Carolina on the Hendricks of South Carolina. In addition there is information on Moses Hendricks m Susannah Glenn. In the FRONTIER HENDRICKS book and manuscript there are many many more Hendricks of PA, MD, Delaware, some VA., NC, SC, some Ga., TN and KY.

IN THE BEGINNING

Albertus Hendricks, born ca 1640, arrives Delaware 1662
(Possible brother Johannes Hendrickson)

In 1697 Albert gave to his son James 100 acres (son James was about 30 years old then), Thomas Bright, Albert's son-in-law received or bought 64 acres; Caleb Pussey bought 60 acres and 20 acres were transferred to John Bayles in 1692 for the use of the mill. 10 June 1701 deeds of 50 acres to son John and 70 acres to son Albert Jr. This left Albertus with about 206 acres which he bequeathed to his son Tobias Hendricks dated 5 Jan 1714/15.

Will of Albertus Henrixson. I Albertus Hennrixson of the County of Chester in the Province of Penn. being aged and weak of body, but of perfect memory, and etc. Gives and bequeaths my whole plantation and estate to son Tobias Henrixson. Son Albertus Henrixson five pounds in money and stock. Sons James and Johannes Henrixson each five shillings. Grandson Albertus Steers five shillings. Three daughters, Elizabeth Bright, Isabel Vanammen and Katrin Harrod --- torn part of will.

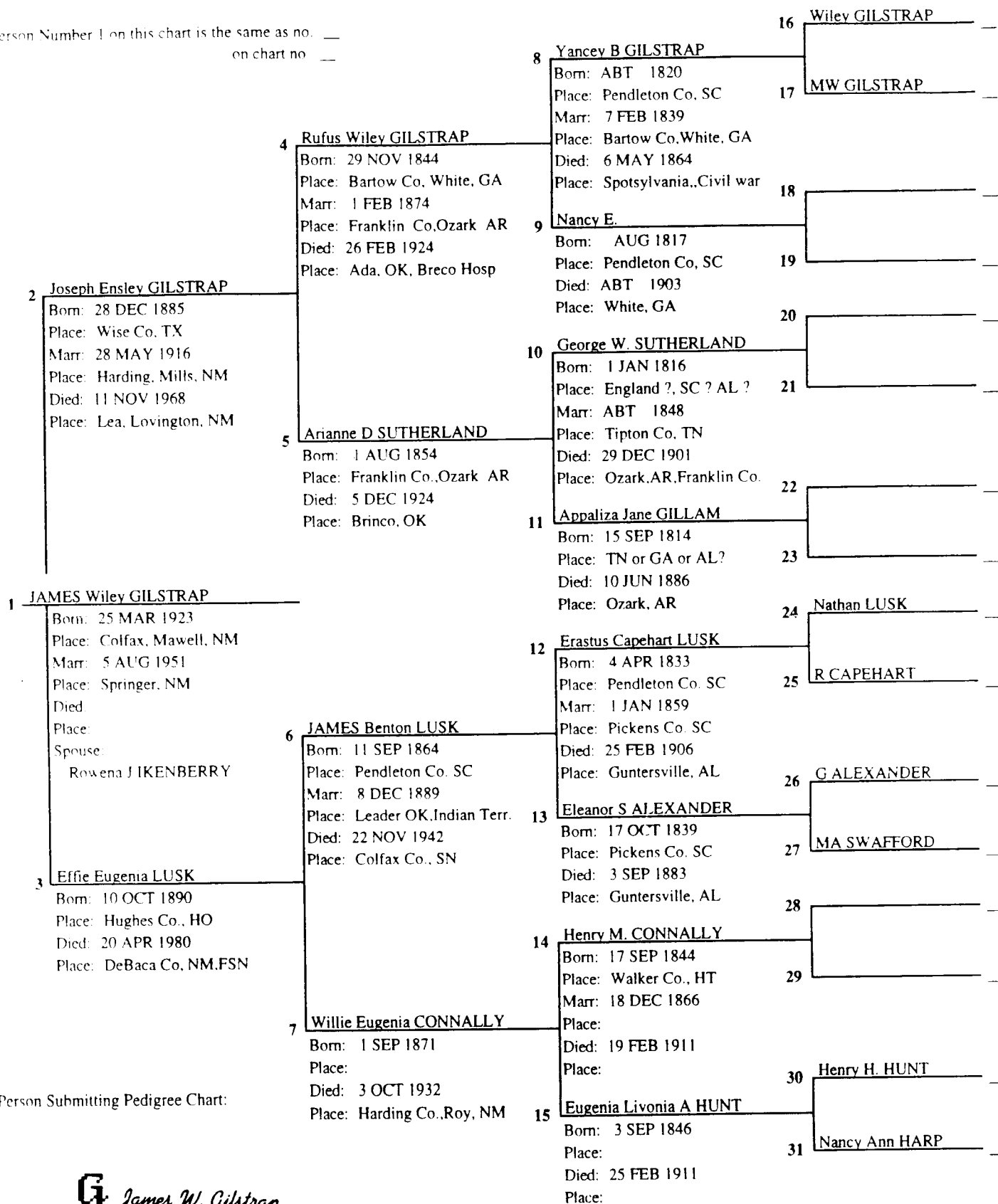
