I am trying to find someone that has researched the STEPHENS and TROTTER families and would be willing to talk or help me with these lines.

For sometime I have been confused about the true parents of my great Grandmother, Nancy Laler Childress STEPHENS, born 9 Jan 1876, died 27 Feb 1920 in Pickens Co., SC. She is buried at Secona Baptist Chruch Cemetery. Her death certificate #2502 lists her parents as Berry CHILDRESS and "Lizzi" SUGS, both of Pickens Co., SC. I think the confusion is that she is listed in the family line of Charles CHILDRESS and Mary Elizabeth McADAMS in the Pickens Co., Data Base. She was very possibly the last child born to William Berry CHILDRESS and Sarah Elizabeth SUGGS. One family member tells me that a Pickens County 1880 census record shows her listed with William Berry CHILDRESS and Elizabeth family line. This would make Charles an older brother. Documents are always the best proof. Any help would be appreciated.

**NOTE:** Nancy Childress died in 1920 Pickens Co., SC. If you could find the Funeral Home that buried her it would probably shed some light on her. The Dillard Funeral Home is the only one that I know of in Pickens at this time. There were two others in Pickens Co.: Easley area (Robinsons) and in Liberty (Gantt) now Liberty Mortuary. Dillard and Robinsons are easy to deal with, but Liberty is very difficult, they will not let you look at the old records. They stated they are their private files and will stay that way. LC

MARRIED: Robert R. Pilgram of Pickens age 32, Farmer, born Pickens son of Amos Pilgram married 1 March 1859 to Telthea Averelle Yates of Pickens age 26 daughter of William Yates. Probate Court Pickens Co SC

MARRIED: G.W. King born Pickens age 21, Farmer, son of Thomas J. King and Sallie King married 5 May 1859 Mary J. Fennell age 22. Probate Court Pickens Co SC

MARRIED: Elias M. Young born Pickens age 20 son of John and K. Young married 11 Sept 1859 M.A. Smith age 17 daughter of Joseph Smith born Anderson SC. Probate Court Pickens Co SC

MARRIED: On Thursday evening 12 inst by the Rev. D. Humphries at Anderson Village, Mr B.F. Crayton to Miss M.E. daughter of Capt J.P. Benson, all of Anderson, SC. Greenville Mountaineer Issue: 20 Jan 1843

MORGAN: Died in this District (Greenville) on the 28th ult Mrs Elizabeth Morgan widow of Mr Jesse Morgan dec'd in the 66th year of her age. She was a member of the Baptist church and has left 8 children. Greenville Mountaineer Issue: 6 Jan 1843

**OATS FAMILY**: As told by Annabel Oates Tollison for the Easley Progress Issue: 12 Sept 1929 She was the daughter of William Rufus Oates s/o Rufus and Mary Ann Germaine Oates:

Robert Oats and Fannie Reed Oates (English and Scotch) and their six children came from Cumberland Co PA in the winter of 1777 or 1778 to North Carolina. One son William Oates (1731-1815) married Jane Sloan (1744-1819) and settled on Muddy Fork Creek in Cleveland Co. NC. They had nine children. One son William Oates (1777-1856) married Elizabeth Epsey in 1806 and settled in Cleveland Co NC. They had 14 children.

Rufus Oates (s/o William and Elizabeth Epsey Oates) b. 1812 NC d. 1876 Easley, SC married Catherine Cargil in 1845. They had one son, John Mason Oates who died from typhoid fever while fighting in the War between the states. In 1852 Rufus m. Mary Ann Germaine and came to Pickensville, SC from Shelby NC when he was 21 years of age. His sister Fannie Oates m. William McMahan was already living in the Georges Creek Community (Easley SC) Rufus was a magistrate, millwright (mechanic) and one of the largest land holders in the upstate of colonial SC. Rufus Oates purchased 1500 acres of land between Hwy 8 and 135 and Brushy Creek Roads. His home site was located on the spot where Geer Baptist Church now sits.

Grandmother owned slaves because I saw a picture of the home where she and two very tall and very black women were standing in ghe backyard of the home working. These two women are buried in the Oates Cemetery (on Hwy 123 behind Qunicey's Restaurant) One man slave was named Mose

Rufus and Mary Ann had 13 children.

Of Rufus Oates children: Sarah Oates m. Samuel Roper, Fannie Oates m. John O. Sheck, Jasper Oates m. Louella Fowler and then Janie H. Welborn and had no children, Newton Oates m. Ester Margaret Stott and Mandy LaBoone, Little Sis died while a baby, Joseph Oates m. Fannie Tanner, Jesse Oates m. Wallie Watson, John Oates never married, William Rufus Oates m. Fanny Williams of Easley SC, Mary Roxie Oates m. Jay Smith, Samuel Oats m. Miss Harris of Central SC, Henry Oates was killed while a young man, Augusta Oates m. William Johnson of Easley.

Rufus Oates b. 13 Nov 1812 Cleveland Co NC d. 18 April 1876 Easley, Pickens Co., SC Wife: Mary Ann Germaine b. 29 June 1830 VA d. 8 july 1897 Easley, Pickens Co., SC. Both buried in the Oates Cemetery in Easley.

Margarette Swank submitted the following: From History of Brecknockshire, England/Wales by: Theophilus Jones 1930-- In Brecknockshire, England is located the Merthyr Church and if I am reading this correctly in Vanoleu Parish: is found the graves of: David ap David Morgan departed this life 1602, Roger\_\_\_\_\_sonne to John ap Llew ap Morgan ap Sir David Game of Peyton, knight, he had issue, children now living VIII, Watkins, John, Rowland, William, Margaret, Anne, Elizabeth and Roland, he died 1600. The daughter of John Games of Aberbran and not legible. This tombstone certainly covers the remains of Roger Vaught a great grandson of the first Watkin Vaught of Merthyr who married Sibil the d/o John Games of Aberbran son of Llewelyn ap Morgan ap Sir David Gam. (Gaines in America)

NOTE: Explanation of the ap in the names above: means son of and in the early English days the son did not carry the name of the father but his last name changed. Very difficult to put on a data base.

Llandevailog Church: Anne wife of William Powell of Dan-yr-eglwys in this parish who died 7 Jan 1788 aged 52 years: Jennett d/o William Powell d. 29 July 1802 aged 40 years. William Powell died 6 Jan 1810 aged 88 years. John Powell of Gloandwr in this parish d. 23 July 1826 aged 61 years. Also of William Powell of Dan-yr-eglwys d. 19 June 1829 aged 67 years. Mary wife of William Powell d. 26 Sept 1831 aged 84 years. John Jones of this parish son of the late Thomas Jones of Pitingwyn d. 12 May 1835 aged 68 years There is more on the Jones if you are interested contact Margarett as the dates are in the 1850's.

Richard Watkins of this parish and remains of his wife John and three children viz: Thomas d. 30 Jan 1772 aged 22, Elizabeth his daughter and wife of Edward Prythereh d. 18 Dec 1773 aged 30 and William d. 11 June 1777 aged 30. Also Richard Watkins d. 20 Sept 1780 aged 66 and Joan his wife d. 17 Feb 1782 aged 68. Also Isabella relict of David Thomas late of Glan-dwr in this parish d. 7 Oct 1808 aged 80. In this history we find the mention of Rowland Hughes who married Mariana the daughter of Dr Timothy Awbrey the issue of this marriage died young their mother m. 2nd John William Awbery. (NOTE: Rowland Hughes is in the early Bucks Co PA Records). There is much in this book on the Gam Family (Gaines and the ancestors of the Gaines in SC).

BOWEN FAMILY: Thomas J. Bowen was born in Pickens Co., SC near Easley, 20 June 1844 and is the son of John and Elvira Hunt Bowen. He was reared on his fathers farm and at seventeen years of age enlisted as 2nd Sergeant of Co E 2nd SC Rifles. He was promoted to orderly sergeant after the battle of Wills Valley and as such served to the end of the war, surrendering at Appomattox. During the entire time of the war he returned home but twice in each case on account of wounds. He participated in the battles of Gaines Mill, Frayer's Farm, Second Manassas, Will's Valley, Knoxville, Wilderness, Fort Harrison and the seige of Petersburg. He was severly wounded at 2nd Manassa being shot through both thighs and lost four months service consequently and again at the Wilderness he was put out of the combat for about three months by a wound in the right arm. He still has in his possession the balls with which he was shot on these occasions each being an ounce minnie. At the Wilderness his clothes were pierced fourteen times. Since the war Mr Bowen has followed farming in Pickens County having a pleasant home, about 2 miles south of Easley. He is a member of Hawthorn Camp U.C.V. He was married 20 Dec 1866 to Miss Emma C. Briggs, and they have seven children, five sons and two daughters. From Confederate Military History. Pickens Sentinel 25 June 1891

**HAGOOD-HOLDER:** The confusion of: Benjamin Hagood and Benjamin Luther Holder. I may have uncovered some info that will help on this matter: Benjamin Hagood b. 1 Dec 1788 Edgefield SC d. 28 Feb 1865 Pickens District SC m. 1st early in 1823 JANE ROPER b. 1805 Pendleton District, Pickens Co SC died in late 1823 Pickens District (issue unknown but believe she had Zacheriah Hagood) and probably died at his birth. Benjamin then had an illegitimate son by Sally Holder viz: Benjamin Luther Holder b. 23 March 1825 Greenville SC d. 29 Jan 1918 Pickens Co SC. Figuring the 9 months delivery, his affair would have taken place about June of 1824, just before his marriage on 4 July 1824 to Adaline Ambler.

Aaron Roper Sr--Pickens Co Equity Pk 70 states daughter Jane Hagood with heir Benjamin Hagood and issue if any unknown. That Jane Hagood died some years before the parents. Aaron Roper d. 17 Sept 1855 Pickens and his wife, Rachel Meredith Roper died 20 Sept 1855.

NOTE Herman: The Old Pendleton Data has Aaron Roper Sr. daughter Jane listed as Mary A. (Jane) who died 1919 in Georgia. This may be Mary A. but not Jane Roper Hagood as Equity states she died many years before her parents. Now folks doesn't this just drive you crazy wondering why he did not marry Sally Holder? Maybe one day this will surface. Linda Cheek

Cousin, Clyde Kelley has pictures of the Holder and Davis family in his possession and gave me permission to use: one of Rev. Benjamin Luther Holder a Baptist Minister for 60 years and one of his wife Caroline Malinda Ferguson (names on back). Clyde's wife Lucy Davis was related to this Holder family throught her dad Arthur Demetrius Davis who was son of Demetrius Hampton Davis and Addie Holder Davis. Clyde also brought pictures of Demetrius H. Davis's brother Ewell Euphrates Davis and his wife Annie Holder Davis. The Holder girls Addie and Annie were sisters and daughters of Benjamin Luther and Caroline Malinda Ferguson Holder.

MARRIED: Samuel Cherry Esq, merchant of this Village, married on this evening (5th) by the Rev. Mr. Brown, to Miss Susan Reese, youngest daughter of Mr Thomas Reese, deceased, of this District.

Dear Linda:

In reference to the location of the family cemetery of William King Easley (1825-1872), it is not located in the town of Easley. It is situated near Crosswell Baptist Church near the west bank of the Saluda River and not very far from the point where Highway 123 crosses the river.

The cemetery isovergrown with poison ivy and weeds---at least that's the way it was when I was there several years ago. It is near a trailer park.

About twenty years ago, William King Easley's grave and that of his wife were moved to Springwood Cemetery on North Main Street in Greenville. Dr. John M. Field's grave is still situated in the old Family Cemetery, along with several graves of various older members of the Easley family. The graves at the Easley Family Cemetery are listed on page 86 of Volume Three of the Pickens County S. C. Cemetery Survey. But there is no mention in that book that William King Easley's grave has been moved to Greenville.

Many thanks for publishing my article about Elias Mullinax and his illegitimate children by a slave. I've already had several favorable comments about the article from members of OPD.

# OPEN LETTER TO KEEPERS OF THE GENEALOGICAL FLAME

January 1, 2000

Dear Friends:


I am pleased to announce that the Confederate history project has been expanded to include soldiers who served from the Anderson District of South Carolina. This enlargement of the scope of my research enterprise will allow coverage of all the geographic area within the westernmost tip of the state, which presently includes the counties of Anderson, Oconee and Pickens (the Old Pendleton District). This research undertaking has also been given a new title, CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS OF SOUTH CAROLINA'S GOLDEN CORNER: ANDERSON AND PICKENS DISTRICTS, 1861-65.

Eventually, I hope to be able to disseminate preliminary lists of Anderson District's Confederate soldiers---just as the names of troops from Pickens District are currently being published in the *OPD Newsletter*. If you know of men who served in the Confederate States Army from Anderson District, I hope that you will let me know about them and share with this project whatever biographical information you might have concerning those soldiers.

Thus far, information has been collected about more than 3,000 Confederate soldiers from Pickens District (present-day Oconee and Pickens counties). But searches are still ongoing for additional data pertaining to some of those men. With the addition of soldiers from Anderson District, the total number of subjects in this project might very well ultimately exceed 5,000 men, all of whom served as Confederate soldiers from the Golden Corner of South Carolina.

In order to prepare biographical sketches of soldiers, the following facts are needed about each of them: complete name; birth and death dates; place of burial; names and dates of parents; name(s) and dates of wife/wives; names and dates of all offspring, as well as those of their spouses; date and place of entry into military service; name of the military unit(s) in which service was performed; any promotions and wounds received while in service; date and place of discharge from service; and any additional facts that ought to be included in the soldier's biographical sketch.

I realize, of course, that few readers of this letter are likely to have *all* of the above-listed needed data about any individual soldier. But whatever relevant information readers might have---and are willing to share---will certainly be welcomed and appreciated.



My sincere gratitude is expressed to the hundreds of members of OPDSCGS and other helpful persons who have already provided useful information. I am sure that many Confederate ancestors would be quite proud of their descendants and relatives who have helped to preserve family history and heritage. We should all bear in mind that love of their homeland guided and sustained most Confederate troops during their desperate defense of the South. My project is designed to honor those brave men who served from our area and to keep their military duty in remembrance. Please help me if you are able. Thank you very much.

Mark Bernard Harden (or Hardin) (1838-1916) served in Co. E, 4th S. C. Volunteers, CSA. His wife was Mary M. (Payne) Hardin (1847-1901). This Confederate veteran died April 26, 1916, and was buried at the Old Stone Church near Clemson, South Carolina

Martin Benjamin Hardin
(or Harden) was born
about 1836. He enlisted in Co. E, 4th
S. C. Volunteers at
Fair Play, SC, on Apr.
14, 1861. He was a
son of Thomas and Cassendine Hardin.



JOHN CALHOUN CLEMSON (1841-1871)

Lieutenant, Co. H, 1st S.C. Artillery, C.S.A. He was a son of Thomas Green Clemson (1807-1888), the founder of Clemson College, and Anna Maria (Calhoun) Clemson (1817-1876). His maternal grandfather was John C. Calhoun, who served as Vice President of the United States. This Confederate soldier survived the Civil War. In 1871 he was killed in a freak railway accident near present-day Seneca, S.C., and was buried in Pendleton, S.C., at Saint Paul's Episcopal Church.

- Samuel Hardin (b. ca 1830) died of disease at Richmond, Virginia; he served in Co. C, 2nd S. C. Rifles (Moore's Regt.), CSA. He was a grandson of Griffin Hardin. His wife was Sarah C. Hardin, and the couple lived near Snow Creek in Pickens District, SC.
- William Turpin "Bill" Hardy served in Co. D, 1st S. C. Rifles (Orr's).
  He attended Wofford College in Spartanburg, S. C., before the war.
- Charles Harkimer (or Harkhimer) was born in Welltbad, Germany, where he worked as a miner before coming to the United States and settling at Walhalla in Pickens Dist., SC. He served in Co. A, 1st S. C. Rifles. He was born in 1827, and he died at Sharpsburg, Virginia, during the Civil War.
- Bartin E. Harleston served to the rank of corporal in Co. C, lst S.C. Rifles (Orr's Regt.). He resided in the western part of Pickens Dist.
- James Bradford Harlow (1844-1925) was a son of Benjamin Franklin Harlow and Anne Berry Harlow. His father was a native of Massachusetts. This soldier served in Co. D, 5th Georgia Regiment, C.S.A. He was buried at Poplar Springs Baptist Church in Oconee County, S. C.
- William Ashley "Will" Harper (1844-1865) was a son of Thomas Harper (1817-1902) and Elizabeth Ann "Betsy" (Wilson) Harper (1822-1891). This soldier resided in the area that is now Seneca, S. C., and he died during the Civil War.
- Carter B. Harris enlisted in Co. H,
  4th S. C. Volunteers at Belton, SC,
  on October 10, 1861. He died at
  Charlottesville, Virginia, on Feb.
  1, 1862. His mother was Lucinda
  Harris who lived on Town Creek in
  the eastern division of Pickens
  District, South Carolina.
- G. Jesse Harris served in Co. F, 1st S. C. Rifles (Orr's Regt), CSA. He

- was discharged from that unit at Sullivan's Island, South Carolina.
- Handy Harris was born about 1843, and he served in Co. C, 2nd S. C. Rifles (Moore's Regt.). He was a son of Sam Harris (b. ca 1822) and Nancy Harris (b. ca 1829). He survived the war and attended the 44th reunion of Orr's Rifles, which was held in August 1916 at Seneca, SC. At that time he resided on Route 3, Townville, South Carolina.
- J. P. Harris (Is this James Harris?)

  As a result of a battle wound, this
  Confederate veteran received a voucher for the purchase of an artificial limb in 1886. At that time he was a resident of Oconee County, SC.
- James H. Harris resided near Field

  Post Office in the eastern division of Pickens District, SC. He served in Co. H, 2nd S. C. Rifles (Moore's Regt.). He was present at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, when Lee surrendered on April 9, 1865.
- John Harris married Charlotte Jeanes in Pickens District, SC, on March 3, 1859. He was killed at Fort Harrison during the Civil War.
- John Andrew Harris (1838-1863) was a son of Allen B. Harris (b. ca 1809) and Winny B. Harris (b. ca 1814). He enlisted at Pendleton, SC, on June 2, 1861, and served in Co. K, 4th S. C. Volunteers (Sloan's Regt.). He died of disease at Richmond, VA, during the Civil War. He has a marker in the cemetery of the Old Stone Church near Clemson, SC.
- Joseph H. Harris was the husband of Mary M. Harris, and the couple had three children. This soldier was a member of Co. C, 2nd S. C. Rifles (Moore's Regt.), and he was wounded at Gaines' Mill, Virginia. He died at Manchester, Virginia, in 1863 as a result of battle wounds.



# My Great Grandfather

My great grandfather Reuben Winfield (Sock) Lee, Jr. <sup>1</sup> was born on 05 April 1864 in Cheohee, which was then in Pickens District, to Reuben Winfield Lee, Sr. (1823-1910) and Gilly Caroline Ross (1828-1903). Sock was married on 27 December 1884 in Oconee County to Mary Catherine (Kate) Beaty. Kate was born on 31 July 1866 close to Iva in Anderson County to Albert Chesterfield (A.C.) Beaty (1842-1894) and Lucinda Haseltine (Lou) Burton (1840-1910).

Sock and Kate had nine children. They were all born in Oconee County.

- 1) Albert T. Lee was born on 11 February 1884. Albert married Clara Belle Vaughn. He died in 1957 and was buried in Bethel Presbyterian Church.
- 2) Mary Elmira Lee was born on 05 January 1888. Mary (see back page) married Burle Creighton Wood. She died on 12 April 1963.
- 3) *John J. Lee* was born on 20 June 1890. He was single and died of typhoid fever on 07 **September 1909** and was buried in Bethel Presbyterian Church.
- 4) William Austin (Bill) Lee was born on 18 August 1893. He served in the U.S. Army in World War I (see back page). Bill married on 01 June 1919 to Hattie Leona Taylor. Uncle Bill died on 03 July 1954 and he was buried in the Wolf Stake Baptist Church with Aunt Hattie. His daughter the late Sarah Elizabeth Lee (1924-1998), my first cousin, once removed, and her husband the late Buddy Roach co-authored Oconee County SC Cemetery Survey Vol. I and Vol. II which this genealogy chapter now offers for sale.
- 5) Charles Beaty (Charlie) Lee, my grandfather, was born on 24 October 1896. He served in the U.S. Navy in World War I. Charlie was a cowboy in Missouri and married on 23 August 1923 in Osceola to Dollie Edna Brissey and they had one son who was my father (see back page). They came back to Oconee County and he became a policeman in Seneca. He died on 02 March 1972 and was buried in the Wolf Stake Baptist Church just six weeks before Grandma was buried there.
- 6) Henry Mack Lee was born on 14 February 1899. Henry married Myrtle Mitchell. He died on 17 Jun 1983 in Lago, Florida.
- 7) Franklin Louis (Frank) Lee was born on 19 November 1902 (see back page). Frank was married to Rosa Chapell. He died on 23 May 1977 in Seneca.
- 8) Gilly Caroline (Carrie) Lee was born on 13 November 1905. Carrie was married to William Macon Huskamp. She died on 23 June 1934 and was buried in New Hope Baptist Church.
- 9) Ruby Edna Lee was born on 27 July 1908. Ruby married Leonard H. Bowers. She died on 21 October 1970.

You may remember that the third child John died from typhoid fever. Three other children and their father also caught the fever, <sup>2</sup> but it was only the father who died from the fever. Sock died on 12 September 1909, only a few days after his son died. Sock's father-in-law A.C. Beaty said that Sock was "sorry and not a good provider." <sup>3</sup> Kate lived with all the children in Poplar Springs. She later died of consumption on 18 October 1915 <sup>4</sup> and she was buried next to her husband's grave and close to her parent's graves in Bethel Presbyterian Church.

<sup>1</sup>A.C. Beaty, my great great grandfather, was the subject of the presentation that I gave about three years ago at this meeting. Almost two years ago, at this same meeting, I presented a story about A.C.'s father John Wesley Beaty, my great great great grandfather. rejoined the grand old Army of Northern Virginia.

At the Battle of Chickamauga on September 19, 1863, Jenkins brigade missed the main action due to delays with the train travel. Jenkins brigade arrived late in the day and was only able to make it up to Chickamauga Creek by sunset, after the savage battle of Chickamauga was over and the Union army retreated. Jenkins was very disappointed but there were more battles to come. The Union army had retreated to Chattanooga. General Bragg then tried to starve the Union army out of Chattanooga. This turned out to be a disastrous course. This siege began in September and ended with three-one day battles starting on November 23, an assertive assault by the Federal army, which broke the siege of Chattanooga. These were the Battles of Orchard Knob, Lookout Mountain, and Missionary Ridge.

During the Siege effort, General Bragg decided to send General Longstreet and 15,000 troops to Knoxville in an attempt to reclaim the city from the Union Army. In November 1863 Longstreet took 5 infantry brigades including Jenkins to Knoxville. Between November 16 and December 4, Longstreet attempted to retake Knoxville. By poor judgement, bad weather and worse luck, this attempt was unsuccessful. On November 23, 1863, Thomas Beacham was captured. He was held in Knoxville until December 15 when he was sent north to a military prison at Louisville, KY. Along with 5,592 others (prisoners from the Battles of Look out Mountain and Missionary Ridge) he was sent to the Military Prison at Rock Island. Illinois. On January 6, 1864 he arrived at the prison to face another war of disease. This was a new Federal Prison and was later compared to "Andersonville" of the South. Prisoners had begun arriving on December 3, 1863. The temperature was 32 degrees below zero on the day of their arrival. Doctors found 94 cases of smallpox in the first contingents to arrive. There had been no hospital built and the sick had to remain with the healthy. Smallpox, pneumonia and diarrhea claimed 98 prisoners and 3 guards in the month of Dec. 1863. This death rate continued with 231 dead in January and 350 in March. A prison population of about 7,600 was reported in March 1864. By July 1864, the Confederate Cemetery had a population of over 1,300.7 General Robert E. Lee was one of the only Confederate Generals to try an ongoing program of smallpox vaccination. Most others did not consider vaccination a priority and this was the cause of the many outbreaks of smallpox in Federal prisons. Thomas was confined at Rock Island until the end of the war escaping death by disease (possibly he had been vaccinated in the Lee's Army of Northern Virginia). He took the oath of allegiance to the United States on June 17, 1865 and was released to return to his home in GA. In

later years he made his home in Asheville, NC and died there in 1929.

Hartwell and Longstreet's infantry left Knoxville after dark on December 4, 1863 and marched to Blain's Crossroads, about 18 miles away. From there they marched about 40 miles to Rogersville, Tennessee. After several skirmishes with Federal troops they marched to their winter location at Morristown, Tenn. Estimates of 3,500 of the men had no shoes, the winter weather during the march was torture and left a trail of blood. After several weeks a shipment of shoes was very welcome sight. Hartwell's spirits had to be very low at this point. Having lost two sons to the war, he now did not know the fate of his son Thomas. As the Confederates did not retake Knoxville, there had been no way to try to find the grave of James Daniel who had died in Knoxville in November of 1862. The army spent the rest of January in Morristown then moved to New Market, Tenn. until March 1864.

The Brigade rejoined Lee's Army of Northern Virginia in the spring of 1864 and continued to fight until the retreat from Petersburg and the Surrender at Appomattox. The Palmetto Sharpshooters were the largest infantry regiment surrendered a tribute to their devotion and lack of deserters 8

Hartwell was on the last roll Nov./Dec. 1863. He was detailed in the Quarter Master's Department. His name appears on roll of those employed for extra duty at different camps in East Tennessee during March. The nature of service was teamster. After this, he may have been transferred back to the Virginia front to finish the war. The records have been lost. We do know that he came home after the War and lived until 1891. He is buried in Greer, SC at the Edgewood Cemetery. The United Daughters of the Confederacy placed a marker at his grave in recognition for his service in the war.

The memoirs of the Palmetto Sharpshocters is presented in a well written biography of Micah Jenkins called The Struck Eagle: A Biography of Brigadier General Micah Jenkins by James J. Baldwin. Subtitled a History of the Fifth South Carolina Volunteers and the Palmetto Sharpshooters. Mr. Baldwin lives in Greenville, S.C.

The younger sons of Hartwell. Phillip Dallas and Worth Butler, had enlisted or been conscripted into what Thomas Beacham later referred to as "local commands". Worth Butler, born 1847, entered the service in June 1864 at 16 years of age. He entered the Georgia State Troops and was assigned to Company H of Regiment 2-A. When he was discharged on April 25, 1865, he was the 4th Sergeant of the Company. He was in the

would do anything he could to help me.' 'He hoped,' he said, 'that I would get out of the way.' He said, at the same time, 'that he supposed Redmond would kill him, too now, if he got a chance.' But I would not hurt him or any other man, unless they force me to do so. Cantrell told him as much and 'that I would come laughing and if I had anything to drink he would get it. He would be just as good to you as he would to me.'

In telling of his capture and escape from the revenuers in January 1877, McKinley noted, "I may say here that the 'Major' did not seem to think that under the circumstances there was anything particularly wrong in his single handed attack upon the dozen revenuers. He certainly enjoyed telling how poor Charlie White had tried to crawl into Amos and how his faithful black mare had 'fanned timber with her indignant heels.'"

At the close of this first session of the interview, Redmond accompanied them back to the foot of the mountain. While on the trail they were suddenly greeted with the summons to 'Halt and surrender! I am a revenue officer.' The voice came from bushes on their right and the sound of hoofs came down the road. It was two of Redmond's friends who brought news that revenuers had captured one of their friends. They told McKinley that the dozen or so revenuers had divided up for the purpose of 'heating up the neighborhood.'

A lookout was kept as they proceeded on down the mountain, Redmond accompanied them even though his enemies were near. He remained with them as they at supper that evening but returned to the mountain as darkness set in. McKinley, after resting for a short while from this unusally strenuous exercise of climbing mountains, decided to go and find him again Tuesday night.

It was so dark that McKinley could not see his hand in front of his face. But the guides knew the way by instinct

and lead him by the arm "deeper and deeper into the darkness." When they reached the meeting place, they lighted a small handlamp, which revealed that Redmond had been following close behind. The sat upon rocks or roots or grass as best they could find.

They had brought Redmond food for his supper and McKinley had carried a kettle of coffee, "at the risk of my neck." Redmond didn't drink coffee and seldom ate meat though there were plenty. He appeared thoughtful as he ate pieces of bread and vegetables. Once he said, "Who can stand this sort of life? It is enough to drive an honest man to do wrong."

McKinley described the scene that night, ".... We sat within a narrow circle of dim light, hedged in by a thick darkness that might have concealed an hundred enemies. The trees seemed to be whispering secrets to each other or warnings to us. The leaves looked strangely as they reflected the light from their under sides. The air was heavy and oppressive and seemed fraught with danger. We looked in each other's faces with feelings not unlike what we might have experienced had all. instead of only one, been under ban and expecting betrayal and a death-dealing volley out of the night at any moment.

".... It was shared in kind by every household for miles around us. One of our party said, 'There is not one man in ten in this neighborhood, be he guilty or innocent, who will sleep in his house tonight!' 'And you say true,' echoed every vote, but mine, within his hearing."

It was almost midnight when McKinley, feeling the ill effects of too much exercise again, concluded this second session. They again returned to the cottage of their host, Redmond with them. There he and Field retired for the night while Redmond and the secret host got blankets and went off into the woods to sleep.

About 1 o'clock McKinley was startled awake by the

young hostess whispering to Mr Field, "to get up, please and strike a light; the revenuers are all around the house! I have heard some one walking in the yard and they always come about this time of night!" Mr Field went to the window and called out, "Who is there?" A voice answered and a whispered consultation followed. Mr Field returned and informed them that it was not revenuers but their prisoner of the day before. Mr McKinley congradulated him within his heart upon his escape. "It was the old story of captors dozing, a sudden dash for liberty, a few bullets dodged, and freedom once more."

The hostess prepared him a late supper and he ate more than any had seen eat before in their lives. Then he departed and continued on his journey "over the hills and far away to his home.... Where he was, no doubt, welcomed as one risen from the dead.... How Redmond——nay, how the whole neighborhood rejoiced over the fact of his escape the next morning!"

Redmond and the host came in from their 'usual' night of sleeping in the woods instead of their own homes. The hostess prepared them breakfast and waited upon them. She could not seem to do enough for Redmond. "The simple-hearted women of the mountains admire him if they do not love him. Neither his name nor his presence have any terrors for them."

His benevolence was widely reported among the mountain folk. He paid off the taxes hanging over the heads of, no one knows, how many poor families. Taking as his pay, "chips and whetstones and other like valuables." One old lady gave him a ram which soon returned to her yard, but he never spoke a word about. He rode five days "working for Hampton" during the election of 1876. On election day he hitched his wagon and team and sent eight or ten old men, who hadn't voted in years and couldn't walk, from their homes to the poll in Eastatoe. He dare not go himself.
