Well! I guess buy now all of you have received your January 2001 Newsletter containing a stamp that stated .22 cents postage due, and some of you were required to go to the post office and buy your newsletter out of hock. I will now try to explain this to you.

When Old Pendleton went off of bulk mail and back to the postage stamp. I had the NL weighed and was told it cost .55 cents to mail. I mailed this NL for over one year at.55.

I took the Newsletter, to be mailed, to the post office on the 5th day of January, two days before the rate increase went into effect. By Monday I had received over 50 NL back asking for .22 cents postage. I then went to the post office and talked with the Post Master. He took the NL and weighed it and then said it cost .77 cents. I told him I mailed this NL on the 5th before the increase and he would not budge, so what to do! I had to put .22 cents on the ones that were returned and some of you had to pay the .22 cents. I am very sorry about all of this and hope this problem has been solved, at least for a while.

So...when the February NL came off the press, I took this to the PO and had them to weigh it (twice) and make sure that it cost .55 cents. I was assured it did.

At the January 16th OP Genealogical Meeting, some changes were approved for the NL. To keep from raising the dues, we voted to keep the NL at 24 pages. This can be mailed for .55 cents, with a small reduction in printing cost, we will be able to publish ten (10) Newsletter a year instead of nine (9). This will make up for some of the extra pages. It will cost less to publish 10 than to keep it at the level it is now. So you will be getting a Newsletter in December beginning this year.

Many "thanks" are extended to two people for getting in touch with me with most of the names of the Confederate Veterans picture posted in the January 2001 newsletter. They are: Alice Cox of Fairplay South Carolina and Fred Anthony of Pendleton, Interestingly, the picture had appeared in the newspaper, probably the Pickens Sentinel during the early 1900s. We aren't exactly sure the newspaper or it's date. But we did pinpoint that the date of June 3rd was a date set aside for Confederate Veterans reunions every year until there were no veterans left. The last ones between 1935 and 1941, with only two or three left. A Mrs T.J. Mauldin, President of the Pickens Chapter UDC, at that time, was responsible for keeping these reunions going. The names according to the old newspaper copy are as follows: Left to right (sitting): W.P. Davis, Matthew Hendrix, Rev. J.E. Foster, W.R. (Pete) Price, J -Calhoun Masters, W.E. McCollum, J.H. Gaines, H.D. Boggs, Charlie Childress, J.A. Abercrombie, --Jones, Robert Stewart. (Standing) Mrs T.J. Mauldin, president of Pickens chapter UDC holding the Flag, Elias Day, J. Tyre Looper, John Watson, R.B.A. Foster, D.L. Kay, W.T. Aiken, R.S. Orr, --Hendrix and D.H. Cotle. And yes there was another Confederate in my family line in the picture, Robert Stewart. I only hope that the picture and this interesting information will help others.

FOLGER FAMILY: One of Pickens Countys most interesting citizens, Alonzo Trezevant "Trez" Folger of this city will mark his 90th birthday anniversary Monday. He was born at the home of his grandfather, Dr Alfred Moore Folger at Pickensville on 4 Oct 1864 before the town of Easley came into existance. His parents who made their home in Greenville at the Old Mansion House, where the Poinsett Hotel now stands, came over to visit dr and Mrs Folger at Pickensville two days before their son was born. When young Alonzo was 12 days old his parents took him to their greenville home. The trip was made in a carry-all simething like an old fashined surrey, with carpet and fancy trimmings. However the conveyance was open and during the trip the infant developed a serouis cold with complications. He was so ill that his parents were afraid of losing him and felt that the expert care and treatment that a physician Dr. Trezevant gave him was responsible for their son's recovering from his illness so they addred "Trezevant" to is name, and Mr Folger has been called "Trez" ever since. When the Folgers returned to the Old Mansion House with their baby in Oct 1864, greenville was a much different city from the present metropolis. Instead of pavement, there was mud--mud on all the streets and Yankee soldiers were all over town. Mr Folder was the first Justice of the Peace in Yavapi County, Arizona when there was no law and order in the territory, except the Vigilantes. I put on my six shooter as soon as I put on my pants each morning, he said. The Indians were still on the warpath at that time. He was appointed to the post by Chief Justice Waite, who was in charge of putting law in the territory. In 1888 Mr Folder went out to the Arizona Territory as train dispatcher for the Atlantic and Pacific Railroad and was stationed at Flagstall and Ash Fork. He became agent in charge of all ship supplies when the railway pushed its tacks across the mountains and desert from Albuquerque NM to Mojave CA. He returned to SC in 1895 and later moved to Ottawa Canada. Mrs Folger was Miss Essie Russell of this city before her marriage is no longer living, but they enjoyed 57 years and two months of married life before she died. Easley Progress Issue: 30 Sept 1954







NEW HOPE BAPTIST CHURCH

In the annuals of history there are many missing pages, whether it be in the history of a nation, community, or a church. So it is with New Hope Baptist Church. If only a few missing pages could be recovered we would have a glorious history of her long existence. If only the church book that was turned over to the church July 25, 1835 by Henry Cobb had been preserved or the historical account of the church written by Martin Moss in June, 1840 had been preserved we would have known more of the details of her early existence. Neither of these important records are in known existence today, but there are enough records available to give us at least a glimpse of New Hope's early life and a fuller picture of her life since 1835.

The first recorded conference dates back to July 25, 1835 but from other records we know that New Hope Church was organized before the nineteenth century began. It could possibly be the oldest Baptist church organized in Oconee County. If not the oldest Baptist church, it ranks among the oldest. The Chauga Church dates prior to 1796, but was located in Franklin County, Georgia as Shoal Creek Church until 1811, when it re-located in South Carolina and changed her name. Concross and Beaverdam also date as far back as 1796 and 1797 respectively. Before her name changed to Chauga, Shoal Creek was a very large and influential church playing a great part in the organization of many other Oconee County Churches including Concross, Old Liberty, and Beaverdam.

It is unblievable that a church so far away would throw light on the origin of New Hope. Head of Enoree in Greenvilla county was organized about 1789. This church has a long and glorious history. It produced leadership for many other churches and sent out many "Traveling" preachers during its early years. Its name was changed prior to 1827 to Reedy River and is today a very fine church.

Head of Enoree began recording her records in 1799 and the first canference states "A report was made of the constitution of the Keowee and Little
River brethern, named Shoal Church." This church was constituted with thirteen
members chiefly of the Yubb and Taber families. Most of them had been members
of Head of Enoree. The charter members are: George Tubb, Solomon Taber, Jacob
Waldon, William Taber, Genies William Taber, Mary Tubb, Susanah Taber, Sarah
Tubb, Elizabeth Tubb, Mary Taber, Anne Reed, Lyda Shepperd. Anne Flor. Nothing
is said as to when the church was constituted. Dr. Joe M. King of Furman
University and author of A HISTORY OF SOUTH CAROLINA BAPTISTS assures me that
it was in 1795. This date comes from research in connection with his book.
Since 1799 is the first recorded conference of Head of Enoree it is resonable
to believe that the constitution could have taken place in 1795 and that it
was recorded in 1799. This is not unreasonable since an illustration is found
of such action in the 1835 New Hope records of recording actions that transpired before 1835.

Shoal Creek Church entered the Bethel Association in 1800 with 29 members; James Courtney and George Tubb being the delegates. Nothing is said about the Pastors during those early years other than that Isaiah Stephens became a member in 1800 and later became pastor. He was ordained by the Head of Enorce sometime after 1791 and sent out as an itinerant preacher. It is quite possible that he was instrumental in the organization of Shoal Creek.
