Will: of Asa Clinkscales 23 Oct 1847 Prov 5 Nov 1847 Anderson Co SC Bk B pg 240-241 Wards: John and Katharine Kay. Land bought of my father in law's estate. Wife Nancy to raise and educate our children. My six children: William Berry, Robert Marshall, Sliers or Silas Wesley, Alexander Evins, Benjamin Thaddeus, Abner Lewis Clinkscales. Wit: Amariah Felton, Mary Clement, Elizabeth Hall.

When Asa died and in his will, his wife was Nancy. I found the below and I cannot explain it:

Sarah C. McWhorter: Pickens Co SC Clerk of Court Pk 2-A 28 Dec 1858...Rec. 23 Jan 1859.... I Sarah C. McWhorter for the natural love and affection I have for my beloved son Dr. Abner L. Clinkscales of Macon, Georgia. In consideration of one dollar to me paid by Dr. A.L. Clinkscales, I do sell, bargin, and convey a negro girl named Louisa and her increase if any. Wit: L.N. Robins, M.J. Robins. Sg: Sarah C. McWhorter X.

QUESTION: How is Dr Abner Lewis Clinkscales her natural son? when he is the son of Asa and Nancy Lewis Clinkscales? Nancy was still living when Asa died, so Asa did not marry again. How does Sarah C. McWhorter fit into this??

MARGARET PRATER/PRATHER Margaret died 1850 in Benton Co AL or Pickens District, SC. Pickens Co SC Probate Box 27 Pk 325

Margaret Prater dec'd of Pickens District estate was adm. 27 Aug 1852 by Miles M. Norton who was bound unto the Ordinary in the sum of \$250.00. Margaret Prater was late of Alabama.

4 Jan 1851 Samuel Fraser and Bethshabe Fraser of Hall Co., Georgia appointed Garner Evans of Pickens District their attorney to receive their distributive share of the estate of Margaret Prater dec'd.

QUESTION: who was this Margaret Prater/Prather?? who did she marry?? How was she connected to Samuel Fraser/Frazer and Bethshabe Fraser? Bethshabe Hamilton Fraser was the daughter of David Hamilton b. 3 Jan 1750 Scotland d. 14 Nov 1837 Pickens District, SC m. 24 Jan 1807 York District, SC to Jane Rennick b. 1755 York District, SC d. 23 Jan 1843 Pickens District, SC.

A John Prater/Prather b. 1776 Guilford Co NC d. Sept 1851 Benton Co AL with his estate adm 1 Sept 1851 in Pickens District SC m. 1st Mary Boone, they had one daughter who married John A. Gunter. John Prater m. 2nd Elizabeth Unknown, m. 3rd 7 March 1839 in Benton Co., Al to Eliza Clark, m. 4th 30 Dec 1841 in Benton Co., AL to Jane Dowdle.

Was Margaret a d/o John Prater or one of his wives? or was she a d/o David and Jane Hamilton and sister to Bethshabe Fraser? Can anyone help?

In 1802 Shoal Creek left the Bethel Association to become a charter member of the Saluda Association. Item 13 of the 1802 Bethel minutes reveal, "Nine churches petitioned for a definition in order to form a new association: their request granted, the names of these churches are Big Creik, Fork Shoals, Burffy Creek, Cross Roads, Sicona, Keowee Woolenoy, Middlefork, Saluda and Shoal Creek. These churches are near the mountains in the south west part of this state." Messengers from these churches with a member of others met on November 5, 1803 at Old Salem meeting house, four and one-half miles northwest of the city of Anderson and formed the Saluda Association.

In 1811 Eden Wimpey was the only delegate to the association. The report stated that there were 56 members and \$1.87 gifts. The gifts in 1814 amounted to \$1.00 with Morgan Morgan and Henry Head as delegates. Benjamin Laurence was the delegate in 1815. That year there was one baptism, one excommunicated, two deaths and a total of 59 members. In 1818 'The name of Shoal Creek church in Oconee County, was changed to New Hope."

From 1815 to 1823 we have only two bits of information: the name change in 1818 and that Robert Kell was a delegate to the association in 1821. The gifts that year amounted to .50.

This brings us to a discussion of the location of the church. The first church stood near the Isaiah Hammond home place on the east side of Little River near Robinson shoals on the road leading from Old Pickens to the Jarrett bridge on Tugaloo River. Mr. J. L. Hammond has old deeds to verify the fact that James Morgan owned the land where the church stood. According to Mr. Hammond a farm building stands on a rock that the original church building was built upon. It is possible that with the shift of population the church was moved in 1818 and changed the name to New Hope. Tradition says that it was moved to what is known as the Bugaroo Field. A cemetary known as the old lew Hope cemetary marks the area of its location. The Bugaroo Field is about three or four miles from West Union and about three miles from the present location of the church.

It appears that there must have been some kind of difficulty during the period from 1815 to 1823 because the membership dropped from 59 to 23. It could have been the trouble and disagreement over the name change or about the location. Also in 1823 there were five members restored to fellowship which reveals a previous broken fellowship. The next few years reveal a process of excommunication of members and receiving people by letter with the membership going no higher than 27. It took many years to gain the membership to the number it was in 1815.

It is uncertain as to when the church moved from Bugaroo Field. From the tone of information at my disposal I feel that there are two possibilities: one is that the church moved sometime prior to 1826. The other possibility is that it was located near its present location in 1844 when a new church was built. I strongly favor the latter possibility because the church appointed a committee to see where the building should be built. We do know that the church came into its present property October 16. 1869 when "Brother Fringe offered a deed from the German Colonization Society signed by Jacob Schrader. President, and P. Breamon, Sec-Treas. Conveying to John C. Fringe, Robert Wilson, and E. G. Hunnicutt, trustees of New Hope Baptist church, two and one-half acres of land on which to build a church." This deed was recorded in the Clerk of Court's office in Deed Book A, page 460, on March 19 1870. The church was built by Mr. Fringe in 1870.

The colonization Society deed being unknown, the Knox family gave a clear title to the church for the property in 1881. The present Sanctuary stands on property given to the church in 1964 by Wilson E. Dodgens.



time, but upon arrival in Virginia hel John Watson (subject of this sketch), United States from Holland. was directly placed in the fighting ranks. He was a member of the Palmetto Sharpshooters and most of his active service was with General Jenkins' brigade, Longstreet's corps. He still recalls with pride the times he saw General Lee and the mighty "Stonewall" Jackson.

Mr. Watson cannot recall all of the battles in which he took part but remembers the Seven Days battles around Richmond which included Mechanicsville, Gaines' Mill, Savage Station, Frazier's Farm and Malvern Hill. He also fought at Second Mamassas, the Wilderness, Sharpsburg, Lookout Mountain, Chicamauga (the last great Confederate victory of the war); was among reinforcements sent' to Petersburg and surrendered with Lee's army at Appomatton. He was never seriously wounded and had only two furloughs during his three years of service-both on account of sickness, typhoid fever and pneumonia.

After the surrender Mr. Watson walked from Appomattox to Salisbury, N. C., and from there rode and walked back home to find a land of

desolation.

Mr. Watson's father joined the Confederate army at the beginning of the war and died during the first year. His brother Irvin also served in the armv.

After the war he married Miss Sur san Williams and they labored together until 1910 when she passed sway.
