**JESSE HALL:** Of Pickens District State of South Carolina, Planter, being weak in body and afflicted with disease, but being in perfect mind and memory and being mindfull of my mortality do this 2 April 1838 make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following: To be buried at the discretion of my family. To my beloved wife the use of my personal estate of every description during her natural life or widowhood on the conditions that it be kept on the plantation whereon I now live for her support and the four children which are now with us, VIZ: Mary, Nancy, Ruth and Henry and should any of the children leave the family to be entitled to an equal share of what may be remaining of said property. At the death of my wife to be equally divided between such of aforesaid children as may be then living who have not received their share.

To my son Thomas Hall the tract of alnd where on I now live to include all my real estate on the condition my wife and children which are before named shall be entitled to live on the same while they remain single. Said Thomas Hall to take care of and supports his mother during her natural life or widowhood and take charge of his brother George at the death of his mother or at any time previous should his mother require it and keeps and supports his brother George during his natural life. I have other children who are not named in this will who are near and dear to me which I think I have heretofore done justice to and hope they are satisfied as I consider I have on there leaving me given them an equal share to those who are remaining with me. Exors: Thomas Hall and Zachariah Hall. Sg: Jesse Hall X. Wit by: D. Sloan, Richard Harris, William Hall X. Prov. 4 Nov 1833. Thomas Hall qualified as Executor 5 Jan 1835, Rec (no date). ## NEW HOPE BAPTIST CHURCH CON'T

*Until 1835 few specific details are known about the church. Many unknown saints toiled hard to keep the torch of hope alive during those rugged years. We must remember that at the beginning of the church this territory had been the object of Indian trouble until only a few years prior, and the country's independence was barely 20 years old. We know only a very few of those great Christians who had the determination and faith to start something that would be one of the landmarks in Oconee County for all of these years and stand even today as one of the outstanding rural churches in the county.*

*Probably the Tubb Family ranks as the first great name. George Tubb was a charter member and messenger to the association in 1800. Evidently he had taken active leadership in his former church, Head of Enoree, and was a leader in the organization of Shoal Creek and of great influence. The Tubb name appears in various places as devout and active church workers, but by 1835 none of them appear on the membership roll. It is unknown just how much influence the Courtney's had during these years but most probably was very high. The Head family served well during the early years and continued for many years as outstanding members as also did the Cobb family.*

*It is not certain when Reverend A. A. Cobb moved his membership. He seemed to be a very influential person and most probably served as pastor during a period prior to 1835. John S. Cobb was given a letter of dismission September 12, 1835. Henry Cobb, clerk for a period prior to 1835, and his wife Abigail were given letters November 7, 1835 which removed the influential Cobb name from the church roll.*

*George Head and his wife Angelina were granted letters November 26, 1836. Henry Head was given a letter of recommendation October 29, 1836 because he was going to travel. Just what this traveling meant is not clear but there were preachers who "Traveled", preaching wherever*

they found an opportunity and witnessed to people. So, it appears that he was a preacher. On December 24, 1836, Henry, his wife Mary, and daughter Sarah were given letters, thus removing the Head name from the New Hope roll.

Eden Wimpsey, Benjamin Laurence, Robert Kell, and Benjamin Head were all leaders whose names do not appear in 1835. Benjamin Sego was influential in 1823 and remained so until sometime after 1835.

The Morgan name has long been associated with New Hope. The first time it appeared in this connection was that Morgan Morgan was a messenger to the association in 1814. He died January 14, 1836. Thomas Morgan appears as messenger in 1825. The Morgans assumed many places of leadership down through the years thus making a great contribution to the ongoing of the church. The Brewer, Hunnicutts, and Hubbards share with the Morgans in a long series of leadership. The Moses, Garretts, and Cannons were also leaders for several years prior to and after 1835.

Joseph Brewer was ordained as a deacon in 1835 and remained a leader for at least 30 years. He was elected as the church's first treasurer in 1837 and served for many years. It is indicated by tradition that he served for more than 50 years. This could well be true because a "Nickel" treasury was begun in 1893 with J. A. Kelley as treasurer. Mr. Brewer was probably well on in years by that time and gave way to younger and more energetic men. Ezekiel Hunnicutt was ordained with him in 1835 and served for almost 20 years. He left New Hope in 1851.

The ordination of Brother Brewer and Hunnicutt reveals the procedure of ordination during the early years. They had already been elected to Serve and the following account is given from the records for November 7, 1835.

"The members of the Presbytry met, present Rev. A. A. Cobb, Rev. Benjamin Neighbors and Deacons Sego and John Ferguson, who invited Bro. Elder J. R. Smith to sit with them, and then they appointed Bro. Smith, Moderator and proceeded.

The Moderator read St. Paul's character of a Deacon. Enquiring of the Church whether the brethren set apart are the characters described which was unimously agreed to.

The brethren were then examined and found qualified and ordained. Prayer was led by Bro. Neighbours. The charge by Bro. Smith and the right hand of fellowship by the Presbytry."

*Several of the men who served until 1885 served for several years including Moses Moss, R. A. O'Neal, James M. Morgan, A. R. Knox, Thomas Dodd, and D. H. Kennemur. J. M. Hunnicutt was an outstanding leader for more than 25 years. Others who were leaders for a shorter period include Patrick Hubbard, Jeremiah Hubbard, Joseph Gresham, R. M. Morgan, R. Hood, A. Jackson, John McAlister, John Bearden, R. Roberson, B. Garrett, William Hood, John Fringe, Robert Wilson, E. G. Hunnicutt, J. B. Crenshaw, Joseph Dawson, and J. E. Hunnicutt. E. H. Kennemur served as pastor from 1852 - 1854 and in other capacities at other times. John Garrett was active as a leader but several times had to confess for his wrong doings. The church manifested a forgiving spirit by forgiving him each time.*

*Shoal Creek must have been organized as a result of the revival spirit that was present toward the close of the eighteenth century. Churches were being organized and then men would be sent out as "Licentitates" and "Itinerants" with a "Letter of recommendation to travel". Had it not been for this type of spirit in Head Of Enorree Church that sent out at least eleven men during the period from 1791 to 1804, Shoal Creek and many other churches may never have been born.*

*It is unknown as to how far these early members traveled to meet for worship. It is reasonable that those first thirteen members could have lived reasonably close together. But by 1800 the church had grown to 29 members and by 1815 to 59. This would indicate that many of them*

F. p. III. Christopher Games, aforesaid, m. Margaret d. Philip ap Thomas ap Hopkin Aubrey of Cantreff.

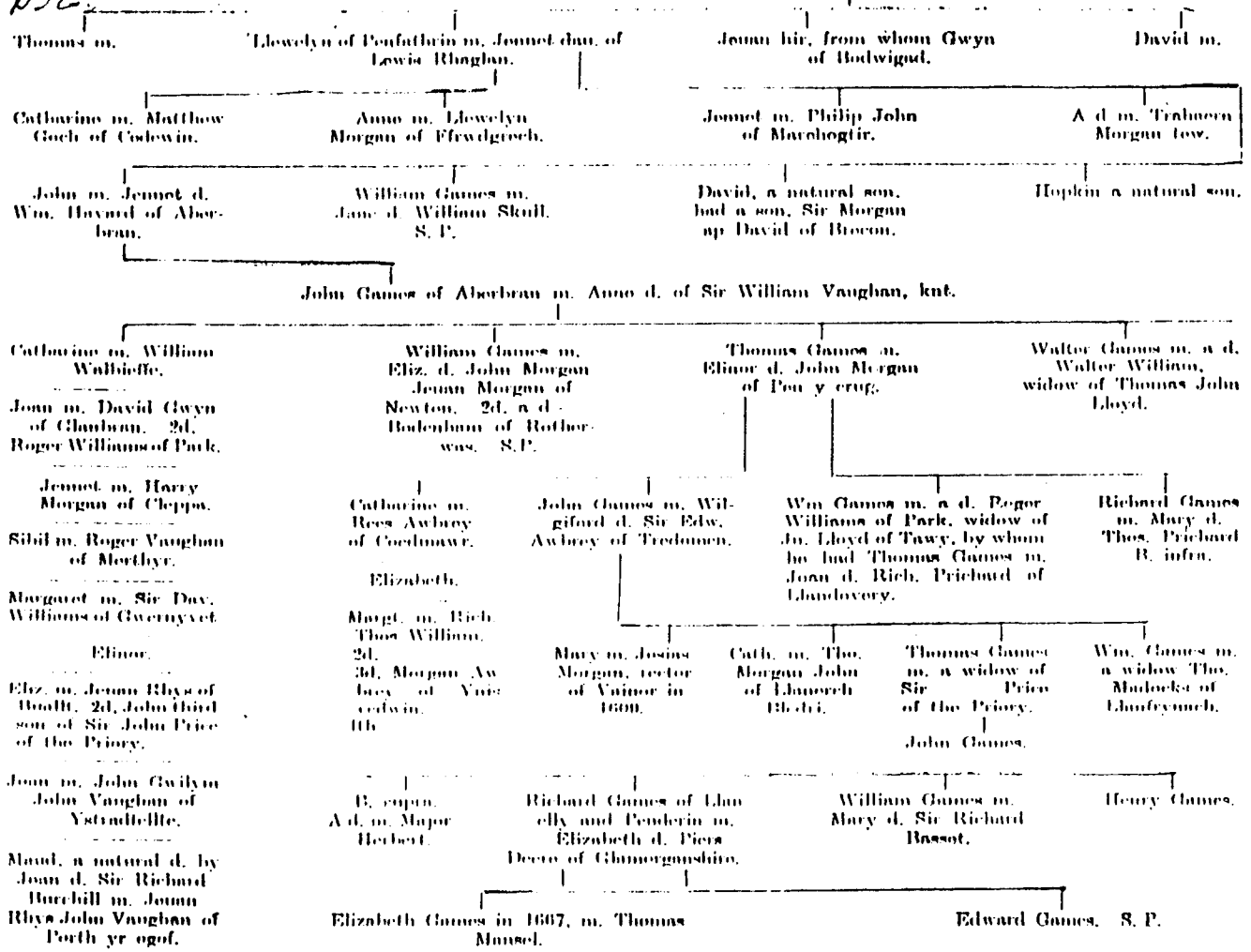
