## Locating Family Cemeteries

Robert Dodson, Anne Sheriff, Paul Kankula and Gary Flynn are trying to locate all cemeteries in Anderson, Oconee and Pickens counties. The following excerpts were taken from the People's Journal and Pickens Sentinel Newspapers books by Peggy Rich and Marion Whitehurst. The People's Journal Newspaper. Taken from *The People's Journal. Pickens, SC, 1894-1903, Historical and Genealogical Abstracts*. Compiled by Peggy Burton Rich and Marion Ard Whitehurst.

17 May 1894. Mrs. Nannie Smith, wife of W. A. Smith died the 14 (May) at her residence in Pelzer, SC. She was buried at the **family cemetery in Central Township**. Mrs. Smith leaves a husband and several children.

13 Sep 1894. William U. Hunt died Monday at his home in Easley Township. He was buried at the **Martin Hunt Family Cemetery**. Mr. Hunt was about 64 years old and leaves 5 sons and 4 daughters.

18 Oct 1894. Mrs. Ella Robinson, wife of T. C. Robinson, died last Monday of consumption at the age of 39 years. She was buried at the **family burying ground Liberty, SC**. Mrs. Robinson leaves a husband and six children.

11 April 1895. Betsy Rackley is expected to die at her home near Nine Forks Church (Dacusville). She was buried beside her husband at **the family burying ground**.

31 Oct 1895. Ed Arail, colored, age about 13 years died the 23 Oct 1895 and was buried **near Enon**.

6 Feb 1896. Mrs. Elizabeth Hester nee Whitmire, widow of the late Carr Hester, died at her residence in this county Sunday on 26 Jan 1896 at an advanced age. She was born 21 Mar 1798 and was almost 98 years old. Mrs. Hester was a member of the Methodist Church and was buried in **the family burying ground at Jocassee, SC**. (Keowee Courier)

26 Mar 1896. Mr. Baylus Stephens died last Friday at the residence of his son L.D. Stephens about three miles from town and was buried in the **family cemetery**. He was 81 years old and leaves seven children.

28 May 1896. John I. Williams was buried at the **family cemetery near his home**. (Cross Roads Baptist Church.) Cedar Rock, SC.

4 Jun 1896. Mrs. Durham, wife of Buck Durham died 29 May in the Mile Creek section at the age of 83 years. She was buried the next day in the **family burying ground**.

24 Sep 1896. Miss Lillie Williams, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. B.H. Williams of Cedar Rock, SC died last Tuesday morning and was buried in **the family burying ground**.

17 Dec 1896. Charles S. Robinson died at his home at Twelve Mile last Monday at the age of about 56 years. He leaves a widow and a brother Dr. G.E. Robinson of Liberty. Mr. Robinson served in the Confederate Army, 1<sup>st</sup> SC Sharpshooters, later Quartermaster, 2<sup>nd</sup> Rifles, Orr's Regt. He was buried at the **family burying ground**.

10 Aug 1899. Miss Amanda Nix died at the home of her parents Mr. and Mrs. W.D. Nix of Eastatoe on 30 Jul 1899. Burial was at the **family burying ground**. She was a member of the Baptist Church.

Mrs. Nancy Wooten (nee Pressley) died 10 Jan 1901. Burial was at **New Friendship Cemetery**. Where is this?

22 Feb 1877. Mr. Van B. Hendricks a citizen of the county was shot and killed about 15 miles from Greenville Court House by Hubbard Garmany on Monday the 12<sup>th</sup> instant. He was buried at the **family burying ground at Liberty Station**. Mr. Hendricks had been wounded by Redmond a few weeks ago. (Details.)

18 Mar 1886. The town council of Liberty purchased a lot **between the Baptist and Presbyterian** churches for a cemetery.

1 Jul 1886. Sam Hallums, colored of Liberty Twp., departed this life on the 25<sup>th</sup> ult. at the age of 75 years. During slavery he belonged to Thomas Hallams, who provided in his will that Sam should be allowed to choose whose servant he would be. Upon the death of his Master, Sam chose to remain on the old homestead with his maiden Mistress, and he continued to serve faithfully and honestly as long as he was able. In return, he was rewarded with a good home, friendly hands, who carefully ministered to his last wants and saw him decently buried in **their family graveyard**. Sam's life and character speaks well for the faithfulness of the old issue of the colored race.

21 Oct 1886. Abraham, the 7 year old son of Mr. R.A. Hester died last Thursday. He was kicked by a mule two weeks ago. He was buried in **the family burying ground**. Dr. Riley preached the funeral.

18 Nov 1886. Miss Rebecca Boroughs, the 15 year old daughter of Mr. James E. Boroughs, died on the 14<sup>th</sup> inst. Burial was in the family burying ground.

24 Mar 1887. Harriett, wife of Charles Rosamond, colored, of Hurricane Twp. died last Sabbath. She was buried **near her home**.

28 Apr 1887. Mr. Edward Gillespie, son of Mr. Jason Gillespie of Hurricane Twp. died the 19<sup>th</sup> inst. He was 15 years old and was buried in **the family burying ground**.

23 Jun 1887. Ann Clayton, colored, died on the 14<sup>th</sup> inst. Burial was **near Glassy Mountain**.

6 Oct 1887. Frank, an 8 year old son of D.J. Taylor of Slabtown, died the 28<sup>th</sup> ult. **Buried at the new church**.

3 Nov 1887. Mrs. Martin Curry died at her home in the upper part of Easley Twp. last Saturday. Her remains were interred at the **burying ground near Duke's Shop**.

3 Nov 1887. Mr. Jack Walker of Eastatoe Twp. has recently buried three children, two last week in one grave. It is thought they died of diphtheria.

5 Jan 1888. Arthur a nine year old son of Mr. E.F. Looper died last Sunday of meningitis. Burial was at the **Baker burial ground**.

26 Apr 1888. Miss Bettie Watson, a sister of Mrs. O.W. Garrison, died in Walhalla on the 16<sup>th</sup> inst. She was about 70 years old and was buried in the **Watson family burying ground**.

3 May 1888. The **new grave at the top of the hill beyond Mr. Abe Mauldin's** hard by the road excites curiosity and comment.

24 May 1888. Mrs. Nettie Turner, wife of Lewis Turner, died of paralysis on the 15<sup>th</sup> inst. at about 75 years of age. Her remains were interred at the **family ground near William Sizemore**.

3 Oct 1889. Miss Sallie Smith, daughter of Mr. Benson Smith of Piercetown, died on the 25<sup>th</sup> ult at the age of about 14 years. She was buried at the **Mullinex burying ground**.

20 Mar 1890. Gabriel Ferguson, colored, about 100 years, died near Glassy Mountain last Sabbath. He was buried in the **burying ground for colored people near where he died**.

3 Apr 1890. Celia, wife of Elias Anderson, colored, died at her home in Pickens on the 25<sup>th</sup> ult. at the age of 44 years. She was **interred somewhere in the neighborhood of Easley.**

18 Apr 1890. Mr. Jeremiah Smith died at his home in Pickens Co. on Wednesday the 2<sup>nd</sup> inst. of paralysis at the age of 83 years. He was buried in Anderson County in the **family burying ground on Mr. Silas Kay's plantation.** He leaves a wife and two children. Anderson

22 May 1890. Miss Aurie Craig, colored, died at the home of her mother near Six Mile on the 18 May 1890 at the age of 15 years, 3 months and 3 days. **Burial at Mile Creek** by Rev. M.W. Crew.

6 Nov 1890. Matthew Ferguson, an old and respected colored man of Liberty Township, died at the A. O'Dell place last Saturday. He was 65 years old and was **buried at the Ferguson graveyard.**

13 Nov 1890. Mrs. Catherine Lewis relict of Jacob Lewis died at her home on the Lewis Homestead Tuesday the 11<sup>th</sup> inst. at the age of 76 years. Burial was at the **family burying ground.**

20 Nov 1890. Col. J.E. Hagood presented the town with an acre lot just outside the corporate limits on the Glassy Mountain Road for a cemetery.

19 Feb 1891. Mr. James A. Alexander died at his home in the Crow Creek Section last Sabbath at the age of 43 years. His remains were interred at the **Herd burying ground.** Mr. Alexander leaves a wife and six children.

19 Mar 1891. The lot donated by Col. J. E. Hagood to the town for a **public cemetery** was staked off last Monday. It is located just outside the corporate limits of the Glassy Mountain road.

27 Aug 1891. Mrs. Polly Bates, widow of the late Joseph Bates, died Friday at the age of 84 years. Burial from Ebenezer Baptist Church. *Daily News*, 23<sup>rd</sup> inst.

17 Sep 1891. 17 Sep 1891. Capt. James A. Griffin has had nice monuments erected over the graves of his father E.H. Griffin, Sr., his brothers J.C., Edwin, William and his sister Mrs. Susan Wyatt, all buried at Twelve Mile graveyard on Col. Hagood's farm. The work was done by Capt. Thomas White of Anderson and Mr. Willie White superintended the work.

1 Oct 1891. Mrs. Sarah Elizabeth Dickson died, at the home of her son D.S. Craig, Esq. in Walhalla, the 21<sup>st</sup> inst. She was born the 4 Jul 1937 near Old Pickens where her father the late Fountain Alexander lived. Her mother having died when she was very young, she for many years lived with her uncle Pleasant Alexander at Pendleton. She married W.H. Craig and he died the 30 Dec 1876. By this marriage she had one son who survives. **She was buried at the new cemetery** (details).

8 Oct 1891. Clemson College now has at work 147 Negro convicts. They are required to work but are well cared for. The stockade has been increased in size and there is a hospital. Only three or four convicts have died and they were buried at the **graveyard once used for servants of the Calhoun estate.** Captain Perry and 18 guards have charge of the convicts. Mr. Jule Shanklin has charge of all the stock (details).

22 Oct 1891. Hense Byrd and Joe Hendricks have the contract for removing the bodies from the Methodist Churchyard **and reburying them in the town cemetery.**

5 Nov 1891. Louis, the 4 year old son of Mr. & Mrs. E.B. Lathem, died last Sabbath. He was buried at the **G.W. Lathem homeplace burying ground.**

19 Nov 1891. Easley desires to have a public cemetery for the town. It is always best to have the **burying ground outside of the town.**

19 Nov 1891. Mrs. R.M. Pickens, of Greenville, died at the home of her husband in that city last Friday. Her remains were interred at the **Pickens family graveyard.** She was a sister of Mrs. J.B. Newberry of this place.

10 Dec 1891. Dr. John W. Crymes, a dentist of Williamston, died yesterday at his home at the age of about 60 years. He married a daughter of E.J. Pickle of Williamston and leaves a widow and 4 children. The remains were buried in the **family burial ground in the lower part of the county.** *Daily News*

17 Dec 1891. Mr. E.A. Hunnicutt, son of Mr. J.B. Hunnicutt, died the 7<sup>th</sup> Dec of typhoid fever at the age of 21 years. Burial was at **the family cemetery**. *Keowee Courier*

31 Dec 1891. A child of Lawrence Lathem died last Sunday night and was buried in the **family burying ground** near Enon.

7 Jan 1892. Caline Bowen, colored, died at the home of her son William Bowen on the 31 Dec 1891 at the age 84 years. **She was buried at Tabor**. She was a former family servant of the late John Bowen.

21 Jan 1892. Jimmie Johnson, the 19 year old son of Mr. S.M. and Mrs. Ellen Johnson, died near Major on the 12<sup>th</sup> instant. He was buried at **Shannon graveyard** by Rev. T.C. O'Dell.

10 Mar 1892. Notice. The Pickens Cemetery is to be used exclusively for a burial place for bodies of white citizens of the town of Pickens. The bodies of others cannot be interred there without a special permit from the town council previously obtained and paid for. The terms of the deed by which the lot is held require this. G.W. Earl, Intendant.

31 Mar 1892. Mrs. M.D. Cantrell died at the home of her husband the 27<sup>th</sup> inst. Burial was at the **family burying ground of the late Jacob Lewis**. (Buried New Mountain Grove Cemetery).

31 Mar 1892. Mrs. Evans Nicholson a daughter of M.D. Cantrell died last Monday. Her husband survives but is seriously ill. Burial was at **Lewis burying ground**. (Buried New Mountain Grove Cemetery)

7 Apr 1892. **Mrs. M.D. Cantrell and Mrs. Evans Nicholson were not interred at the Lewis burying ground but at Mountain Grove Church.**

21 Apr 1892. Miss Lizzie Gillespie daughter of Mr. John Gillespie died the 13<sup>th</sup> inst. She was about 15 years old and was buried at the **family burying ground near Borrough's Mill**.

5 May 1892. Jim Duke, colored, was killed on the Air Line Railroad the 29<sup>th</sup> ult. He was buried at **Tabor beside his father William Duke**.

26 May 1892. The wife of James Lankford, colored who lives near Easley, died last Monday and was buried in the **burying ground near town**. There were 39 vehicles and about 200 footmen in the funeral procession.

23 Jun 1892. Clarisa Leona, the eldest daughter of Mr. Lemuel C. Reid of Gates, died on Friday the 17<sup>th</sup> inst. at the age of 9 years. Her remains were interred in **the family burying ground**.

13 Oct 1892. Malinda Lofton, colored, was accidentally killed in Atlanta last Friday. Her remains were brought to **Old Pickens and interred**. She was the daughter of George Jenkins and for many years a servant to Mrs. S.P. Bruce (details).

27 Oct 1892. Cato Edens died last Friday of typhoid fever and pneumonia and was buried at **Oolenoy** (details).

1 Dec 1892. Mrs. Jane Hendricks, wife of George K. Hendricks, died last Monday at her home three miles north of Pickens. Her remains were interred at the **Gilstrap burying ground**.

5 Jan 1893. Mrs. W.U. Hunt, wife of W.U. Hunt, died at her home near Dacusville on the 28<sup>th</sup> ult. She was buried in the **family burying ground**. Mrs. Hunt was a sister of Capt. A. Blythe of Greenville, SC.

16 Feb 1893. Mr. James Robinson died at his home 1 ½ miles from Easley Tuesday on 7<sup>th</sup> inst. He was raised in Anderson Co. and was about 60 years old. Mr. Robinson married 1<sup>st</sup> Miss Harper and 2<sup>nd</sup> Mrs. Darcus Jamison. There was no issue. He was buried at **Jamison graveyard**.

2 Mar 1893. J. Mattison Leach, who lived on Crow Creek, died the 21<sup>st</sup> ult. at the age of 73 years. Burial in the **family burying ground**.

27 Apr 1893. Mr. L.A. Slaton's son that was badly kicked in the stomach by a mule died the 19<sup>th</sup> inst. He was buried in the **family burying ground**.

The Court of Sessions and Commons Pleas met at Anderson last week. Judge **Evans** presided. **Jonathan Campbell** was convicted of the murder of **William Browning**, and sentenced to be hanged on the 22d inst. **Edward Sherman** was found guilty of manslaughter, in killed **Reuben Parker**, and sentence to remain till the first day of next Court in gaol, and then to be branded in the hand. The Court at Pickens is in the session this week.

# RICHMOND



## CIVIL WAR EPICENTER IN VIRGINIA

The city of Richmond is now the second largest metropolis in the mid-Atlantic state officially known as the Commonwealth of Virginia. Since 1779, it has been the state capital, having replaced colonial Williamsburg as the seat of government in the tidewater region. Throughout most of the four years of the U. S. Civil War, Richmond also served as the ephemeral capital of the Confederate States of America. An historic Southern city, Richmond is located at the falls of the James River in the eastern part of the state. That river is a tributary of Chesapeake Bay near the Atlantic Ocean. In 1637, a trading post was established at the present-day site of Richmond. Then, in 1739 a hamlet, or town, was laid out there and named after Richmond on the Thames River in England.

During both the American Revolution and the U. S. Civil War, Richmond played weighty roles in our nation's development. Patrick Henry (1736-1799), a Virginia-born leader in America's pursuit of independence from Britain, delivered his celebrated "... give me liberty or give me death!" oration at Richmond's St. John's Church in 1775. The church was raised in 1741 and still stands today at East Broad, between 24th and 25th streets. Thomas Jefferson (1743-1826), a native of Virginia and the third U. S. president, designed the Virginia State Capitol in Richmond, having based his depiction of the building on La Maison Carree in Nimes, France. The cornerstone of the capitol was put in place in 1775, and the building was completed three years later. Virginia is famous for the many U. S. presidents born there. The graves of two of them, James Monroe (1758-1831) and John Tyler (1790-1862), are situated in Richmond's well-known Hollywood Cemetery, located at Cherry and Albemarle streets. Jefferson Davis (1808-1889), president of the Confederacy, was also buried there. John Marshall (1755-1835), a native of Germantown, Virginia, who served for 34 years as chief justice of the United States Supreme Court, raised his children in the oldest brick house in Richmond. Built in 1790, the dwelling still stands at Ninth and Marshall streets in

the city.

When the Civil War began in 1861, Richmond's population numbered about 38,000 persons, and the city was then one of the few substantial commercial, industrial and medical centers of the South. In the second half of the nineteenth century, the city's railroads were already well connected to many sections of the Southeast. Among the dominant diversified industries in the state capital was Tredegar Iron Works, which was destined to become an essential producer of military armaments for the Confederacy during the Civil War.

In 1861, the Confederate senate passed legislation authorizing the transfer of the capital of the Confederate States of America from Montgomery, Alabama, to Richmond, Virginia. President Jefferson Davis signed the legislation into law July 21, 1861. Subsequently, President Davis also moved to the new capital where he and his family resided at Twelfth and Clay streets in a fine house that is now the Museum of the Confederacy. The removal of the Confederate capital to Richmond was launched despite the fact that the new seat of the Southern government would be only 106 miles due south of the Union's capital of Washington, D. C. Consequently, Richmond became a prime target of Federal troops during the greater part of the North-South military conflict. For almost four years, battles raged around the city as Confederate troops gallantly defended their nation's capital in battles fought at the following places near Richmond (and at the dates indicated): Drewry's Bluff (May 15, 1862), Mechanicsville (June 26, 1862), Gaines' Mill (June 27, 1862), Beaver Dam Creek (June 26, 1862), Malvern Hill (July 1, 1862), Parker's Battery (May 1864), Cold Harbor (June 3, 1864), and Fort Harrison (September 29, 1864).

Because of Richmond's strategic location, and its importance to the Confederacy, it became a primary supply depot for Southern troops in Virginia. Moreover, its hospitals overflowed with sick and wounded soldier's who were transported from surrounding battlefields. Richmond's population soon swelled to more than 100,000 persons

as government officials, military troops and support elements, opportunistic exploiters, prostitutes, camp followers and Yankee prisoners of war, arrived in the city. In order to hold captured Union soldiers who were brought in from nearby battlefields, some tobacco warehouses in Richmond were converted, and the infamous Libby Prison was established there to house thousands of captives.

Chimborazo Hospital in Richmond, the largest military hospital ever established, treated 76,000 sick and wounded soldiers during the war. It was located atop Church Hill near the city. Samuel Preston Moore (1813-1889), Confederate surgeon general, played a key part in establishing the hospital. He was educated at the Medical School of South Carolina in Charleston. (The surgeon general was buried in Hollywood Cemetery, and his grave is very near Jefferson Davis' last resting place.) Another South Carolinian, Phoebe Pember, who once resided in Aiken, South Carolina, was a Confederate nurse who served as head matron in one of Chimborazo's medical units. She held that demanding and gut-wrenching position from December 1862 until the end of the Civil War. Her parents were Jacob and Fanny Levy, residents of the early Jewish community of Charleston, South Carolina. Many soldiers from Pickens and Anderson districts of South Carolina were patients at one or another of Richmond's military or civilian hospitals. Some of those troops died at the city and were interred in Hollywood Cemetery or in another of the numerous close-by necropolises for Confederate soldiers.

Sergeant Frederick Bischoff, Jr. (1837-1896) of the German settlement at Walhalla in Pickens District, S. C., was wounded in action while serving in Co. "C", Orr's Rifles. He was then admitted to Chimborazo Hospital. In February 1863, this very literate soldier penned a letter (in German) and provided his eyewitness description of the hospital. An English-language translation of part of that letter is provided below:

This hospital is in the open on a hill several miles from Richmond, and a half-mile from a stream called the James River. It is divided into five divisions of 16 wards or houses, 80 feet long by 30 feet wide and six feet high. There is no ceiling and the flooring is planks laid together. Each ward has 40 beds arranged in rows of ten. In the center there are two stoves to heat the entire place. Among the curiosities here now are the biggest rats I have ever seen in my life. They are so bold they come into the hospital during the daytime. At night they jump upon the beds, tables, and benches making terrible noises. Several of the fellows set

traps and catch them at night, skin and pull the fur over their ears, and then salt and fry them on the stoves. They say the rat is tastier than a squirrel, and judging from their appetites, it does seem so. However, my appetite is not so ravenous.

In addition to the previously mentioned Hollywood Cemetery, six national cemeteries at or near Richmond contain the graves of Civil War soldiers, and they are as follows:

■ **City Point National Cemetery** at 500 North 10th Avenue, Hopewell.

■ **Seven Pines National Cemetery**, located at 400 East Williamsburg Road.

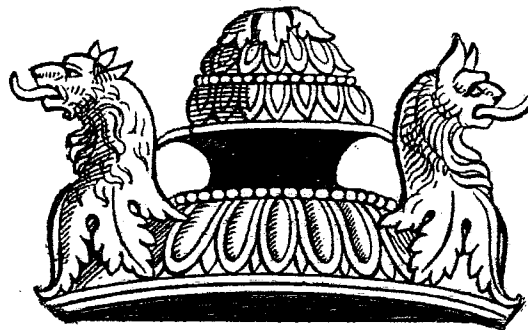
■ **Cold Harbor National Cemetery**, located east of Richmond on State Road 156 and contains about 2,000 graves of soldiers.

■ **Richmond National Cemetery** at 1701 Williamsburg Road. This is the largest of these national cemeteries, and it contains the graves of 7,100 soldiers, most of whom are unknown.

■ **Fort Harrison National Cemetery**, located eight miles southeast of Richmond and on Varina Road. It contains the graves of soldiers who died at about forty sites in Virginia.

■ **Glendale National Cemetery** on State 156 (Willis Church Road) and near the site of the Battle of Malvern Hill.

General Robert E. Lee's Army of Northern Virginia played an important part repulsing Union forces during the Seven Days' Battles before Richmond. Union troops once pushed to within four miles of the city, but they failed in that effort and did not capture the city until the final days of the Civil War. On April 2, 1865, the last remaining members of the Confederate government abandoned the city and followed orders to burn the remaining stockpiles of Confederate arms and other military equipment. Their fires destroyed a large part of the city. On the following day, Union General Ulysses S. Grant and his troops took Richmond. Today, Richmond has a population of over 200,000, and it is a vibrant commercial, cultural and government center. But many footprints remain, and they reflect the city's historical role during the U. S. Civil War.



# MORE CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS

**David C. Reid** (b. ca. 1843) enlisted in Co. C, 1st South Carolina Rifles (Orr's Regt.) when he was eighteen years of age. He was captured by Union troops in 1864. This soldier also served in Co. B, 2nd South Carolina Rifles (Moore's Regt.). His home was in the western half of Pickens District, S. C. (now Oconee County).

**Evan Reid** (b. 1836) was a son of Thomas Baskin Reid and Sarah (Nicholson) Reid. He served in Co. A, 20th South Carolina Infantry and lost his life during the Civil War. His family moved from Pickens District, S. C., to Mississippi prior to the Civil War. Five of this soldier's brothers also served in the Confederate Army.

**George Reid** (b. 1843) was a brother of Evan Reid (see above) and is believed to have served in the 25th S. C. Infantry. He died during the Civil War.

**George T. Reid** (b. ca. 1845) was a son of Samuel Reid who also served in the Confederate Army. This soldier's grandfather, Joseph Reid, fought in the Revolutionary War, after which he settled at the forks of the Keowee and Little rivers in what became Pickens District, S. C., and was later Oconee County. This soldier entered the Confederate Army with other sixteen-year-old youths and served in Captain C. L. Hollingsworth's company. After the Civil War, he became a prosperous merchant in Chapells, South Carolina.

**H. T. Reid** served as a private in Co. D, 22nd South Carolina Infantry and was killed in action at the big crater explosion at Petersburg, Virginia, on July 30, 1864.

**J. Pink Reid** is believed to have been the Pinckney Reid of Greenville County, S. C., who married Talitha Hendricks of Loopers, S. C. in 1895. J. Pink Reid served in Co. C, Palmetto Sharpshooters and survived the Civil War. In 1901, he attended the 19th reunion of Orr's Rifles at Sandy Springs near Pendleton, S. C.

**James B. Reid** was wounded during the Wilderness Campaign in Virginia while serving in Co. A, 1st South Carolina Rifles (Orr's Regt.).

**James T. Reid** (1834-1912) enlisted in Co. E, 1st South Carolina Rifles (Orr's Regt.) when he

was about 27 years of age. He rose to the rank of captain during the Civil War, which he survived. On January 4, 1866, he married E. Caroline "Carrie" Stribling (1835-1916), daughter of William H. Stribling. This soldier was a son of Samuel Reid, who also served in the C. S. A. despite his advanced age.

**John Reid, Jr.** (b. ca. 1829) was a son of John Reid, Sr. (b. ca. 1785) and Elizabeth Reid (b. ca. 1795). He served in Co. C, 1st South Carolina Rifles (Orr's Regt.) and was captured by Union troops during the Civil War.

**John Bennett Reid** (1846-1926) enlisted in Co. F, 1st South Carolina Cavalry when he was sixteen years of age. His unit was commanded by Col. John Logan Black. After about one year, he was transferred to Co. C, 1st South Carolina Rifles (Orr's Regt.), commanded by Capt. Joseph Norton. He was captured by Union troops during the war and taken to Fort Delaware, where he was held until June 11, 1865. He returned to South Carolina after the war on July 1, 1865. On his parole certificate, this soldier was described as being six feet tall and with fair complexion, light hair and hazel eyes. After the Civil War, he resided in Easley, S. C., where he received a Civil War pension in 1922. In 1927, his widow, Lucy Reid, also received a pension. She died June 9, 1942.

**Joseph "Joe" Reid** (1842-1922) was a son of Thomas Baskin Reid, Sr. and Sarah (Nicholson) Reid who moved from Pickens District, S. C., to Mississippi about 1835. He served in Co. H, 11th Mississippi Infantry. He died January 3, 1922, and was buried in the Reid family cemetery, located about six miles north of Houston, Mississippi.

**Joseph J. Reid** (b. ca. 1839) was a son of Samuel Reid (b. ca. 1802). He was captured by Union troops during the war and taken, as a prisoner of war, to Point Lookout, Maryland. From there this soldier was sent to Elmira Prison in Elmira, New York, where he died of typhoid fever August 30, 1864. He was probably buried in the prison's cemetery.

**Reuben Christopher Reid** (1837-1885) was born near Newberry in Laurens District, South Carolina, on April 7, 1837. He first served in Co. E, (Bozeman Guards), Hampton Legion, from which he was discharged because of "carditis and general ill health."



Then, on November 11, 1863, he was conscripted into Co. A, 15th South Carolina Infantry. While serving in that unit near Cold Harbor, Virginia, he was wounded in action by a mini ball that struck his right side and arm about June 9, 1864. He was then a patient at Jackson Hospital from June 10th to June 16, 1864, after which he was granted a 30-day wound furlough. Rueben C. Reid survived the Civil War, after which he worked on the Charlotte-Atlanta Air Line Railroad and helped to lay the rails that were put down through the southern part of Pickens and Oconee counties. This Confederate veteran settled in Oconee County, S. C., where he resided in the Westminster area and farmed. In 1855 he married Elizabeth Townsend (1828-1901), and the couple had four children, one of whom died in infancy. The other children were John Townsend Reid (15 Jul 1862 - 7 Dec 1923); Robert Reid; and Ida Alice Reid (12 Jul 1859 - 2 Aug 1909), who married Henry M. Simpson (21 Mar 1856 - 3 Aug 1900). This Confederate veteran died near Westminster (Oconee County), S. C., on July 23, 1885, and was buried at Westminster Baptist Church.

**K. B. Reid** was a brother of John Bennett Reid who also served in the C. S. A. K. B. Reid was a member of Co. C, 1st South Carolina Rifles (Orr's Regt.). He survived the Civil War and attended the 44th reunion of Orr's Regt. at Seneca, S. C., in August 1916. At that time he was a resident of the Easley area of Pickens County, S. C.

**Lemuel Reid** (1834-1901) is believed to have served in Co. H, 5th South Carolina Reserves. He was a son of Thomas Baskin Reid and Sarah (Nicholson) Reid. Five of his brothers also served as Confederate soldiers. In 1875, this Confederate veteran married Victoria McCullum of Cherokee County, Georgia.

**Samuel Reid** (b. ca. 1805) enlisted in Co. E, 1st South Carolina Rifles (Orr's Regt.) when he was 56 years of age. He was discharged on account of his age during the Civil War. He was a son of Joseph Reid, who was a soldier in the War of Independence. Three of this Confederate soldier's sons also served in the C. S. A. Samuel Reid was the first sheriff of Pickens District. He served one term and then was engaged in farming on a large farm at the forks of the Keowee and Little rivers in what today is Oconee County, S. C.

**Samuel Reid** (1832-1921) was a son of Thomas Baskin Reid and Sarah (Nicholson) Reid who moved from Pickens District, S. C., to Mississippi in 1835. During the Civil War, this soldier served in Co. H, 11th Mississippi Cavalry. He was seriously wounded at Gettysburg, Virginia, and was then captured by Union troops. During the remainder of the war, he was held as a prisoner-of-war. After the conflict, he went back to Mississippi where he died unmarried and was buried there.

**Stephen C. Reid** was a private in Co. A, 1st South Carolina Rifles (Orr's Regt.). He participated in the Battle of Gaines' Mill on June 27, 1862. Then he was wounded in action in Virginia on August 29, 1862. By October 11, 1862, he rejoined his company and was looking "very well", according to the Civil War diary of John L. Brackenridge, another soldier from Pickens District, S. C.

**Thomas Baskin Reid, Jr.** (1831-1862) was born in Pickens District, S. C., and served in Co. H, 11th Mississippi Cavalry. He died of battle wounds on June 27, 1862, which he received during the Battle of Gaines' Mill in Virginia.

**Thomas J. Reid** died while being held as a prisoner-of-war at Elmira, N. Y., on August 30, 1864. He had been captured by Union troops during the Battle of Trevilian Station in Virginia. That engagement was one of the most confusing and ferocious cavalry fights of the Eastern theater of the Civil War. This soldier served in Co. C, 4th South Carolina Infantry (Sloan's Regt.) and in another Confederate unit.

**W. A. Reid** was born about 1839 and served in Co. D, 22nd South Carolina Infantry. He survived the Civil War. In 1902, his name was included on the Civil War pension roll for Oconee County, S. C., and his age then was recorded as 62.
