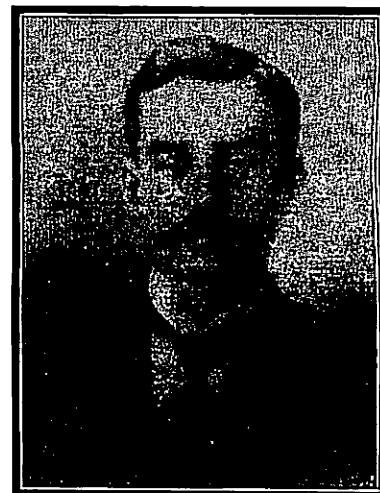

*The abstractor attempts to include information concerning sheriff sales in Pickens and Anderson districts. Many items are listed for several months. Check before and after the sales for same information.*

**October 31, 1832**

Married on Tuesday evening the 23d inst., by the Rev. **W. Magee**, Mr. **William Townes**, to Miss **Chloe**, daughter of **W.F. Clinkscales**, Esq.

Also by the same on Thursday evening, the 25<sup>th</sup> inst., Mr. **Joshua Burriss** to Miss **Rachel Clements**, all of Anderson District.

The plan suggested in last week's paper having been approved by many, notice is given, that a meeting will be held at this place on Saturday the 3d of November next, of such of the Voters of Pendleton district, as are friendly to the call of a state Convention for the purpose of agreeing on, and recommending a ticket for delegates. It is particularly desirable, that there should be a good attendance from the distant parts of both Anderson and Pickens Districts."

**Mary Duff**, Executrix and **Wm. R. Duff**, Agent, will have an estate sale on the late residence of **James Duff**. It consists of Negroes, horses, stock, corn, fodder and house and kitchen furniture.

Citizens met at Pickens Court House on November 5, 1832. Capt. **David Sloan** was Chair and **R. Creswell Esq.**, Secretary. Maj. **Wm. L. Keith** read a resolution passed by the group. Resolved. That this meeting do concur in the nomination made at Pendleton and unit in support therefore. **Col. Hunter** is mentioned.

Lost a brown silk umbrella. Inquire at printing office.

An election will be held on November 12<sup>th</sup> as require by law. Two days of election at Anderson, Pendleton and Pickens and one day at each of the other places in the district. The managers to meet on the third day at Pendleton to count the votes and declare the election. Managers selected:

- Pickensville – **Thomas Blassingame Jr.** in place of **Thomas Edmondson**, resigned.
- Mays – **Allen Elston** and **James Blackstock** in place of **John T. Humphreys** and **J. Williams**, resigned.
- Masseys - **Michael S. Edmondson** in the place of **Thomas Fitzgerald**, resigned; and **Daniel Inman** in place of **Daniel Jugman**, improperly appointed.
- Lays – **Lemuel Nicholson** and **John Knox** in place of **Wm. Nicholson** and **Jas. M'Kinney**, resigned.
- Bachelor's Retreat – **Thomas R. Sheelor**, in the place of **Foster Perry**, resigned.
- Craytonville – **Hugh Gantt** in place of **Meredith H. Brock**, resigned.

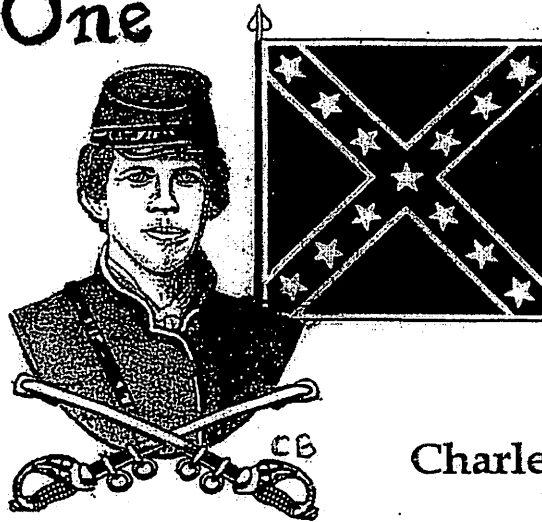

# THEY FELL TO THE SOUTHERN CAUSE

Confederate Soldiers of the Eastern Division of  
Pickens District, South Carolina, Who Died  
During the U. S. Civil War, 1861-65

The Confederate soldier depicted on the cover is William Franklin "Frank" Looper (1832-1864). The drawing was based on a photograph taken during the Civil War. Frank Looper was one of the sixteen children of Joseph Looper, Sr. (1807-1898) and Sarah Hester Looper (1811-1894), who resided in the eastern division of Pickens District, South Carolina. The Confederate soldier died October 30, 1864, at Lynchburg, Virginia, having been mortally wounded in action while serving in Company B, 37th Battalion Virginia Cavalry, C.S.A. The deceased soldier was survived by his wife Sarah Jane Satterfield Looper (1839-1915) and the following three children: Martha Emma Looper (1857-1934), who eventually married Jessie Childress (1855-1884); Joseph Burdine Looper (1858-1927), who married Nancy Jane Burdine (1862-1935); and William Perry Looper (1861-1949). William Franklin Looper's body was brought back to Pickens District and buried in the cemetery at Crossroads Baptist Church. Five of Frank Looper's brothers and six of his brothers-in-law also served in the Confederate Army.

**Houston Abercrombie** died at New Market, Virginia, in 1864 as a result of a battle wound.

**Elijah Agnew** (b. ca 1820), who served in the Confederate Army, died during the Civil War.

**D. Frank Alexander** died while serving in the Confederate Army during the Civil War.

**David A. Alexander** resided in the northern part of Pickens District, and he died in a military hospital in Charleston, South Carolina, in February 1863.

**Henson A. Alexander** (1843-1865) resided in northern part of Pickens District; killed in 1865 during the Petersburg Campaign in Virginia.

**James Prier Alexander** (1833-1863) was killed at Chancellorsville, Virginia, in 1863.

**Jasper Lafayette Alexander** (1840-1862), a Confederate soldier, resided in Hurricane Township; died of disease March 20, 1862, in a hospital in Columbia, South Carolina.

**Jefferson Parsons Alexander** (1838-1862) resided in Hurricane Township; died at his home in 1862 while on medical leave from the Confederate Army.

**Nathan Alexander** (b. ca 1840) died while serving as a Confederate soldier during the Civil War.

**Lafayette W. Allen** resided in the northern part of Pickens District; died at Richmond, Virginia, during the Civil War. He was a native of Abbeville County, S. C., and married Elizabeth Keith of Pickens District.

**John Henry Anderson** (b. ca 1828 - d. 1861) died of pneumonia at Richmond, Virginia, July 6, 1861.

**William Anderson**, who served in the Confederate Army, was killed near Frayser's Farm, Virginia, in 1862.

**Daniel "Bud" Anthony** (1846-1863) died of measles in 1863 while serving as a Confederate soldier.

**John Harvey Ariail III** (1838-1862) resided in the Enon Church Community and died while being held as a prisoner of war at Indianapolis, Indiana.

**Samuel Albert Ariail** (1842-1864) resided in the Enon Church Community and died of battle wounds received during the Wilderness Campaign in Virginia.

**William Ira Ariail** (1818-1861) resided in the Enon Church Community and died of typhoid fever at Manassas, Virginia, in 1861.

**John E. Archer** (1830-1865) resided in the Brushy Creek area of Pickens District, South Carolina; died July 16, 1865, three months after the Civil War had ended. He served in the 1st South Carolina Cavalry. His tombstone in the Barton-Archer Family Cemetery in Pickens County reads as follows:  
 "In memory of John E. Archer who lost his life in a bold but patriotic act of July 16, 1865, in his 35th year. He had been a noble soldier in our war for Constitutional rights."

**Silas A. Arnold** (1826-1863) resided in the Eighteen Mile Creek area; died during the Civil War.

**James Adolphus Bagwell** (1826-1864) died of typhoid fever at Camp Douglas, Illinois, on December 20, 1864, while being held as prisoner of war.

**R. A. Banks** died in Charlottesville, Virginia, January 1, 1862, while serving as a Confederate soldier.

**B. C. "Bett" Barnett**, a Confederate soldier, was killed at Gaines' Mill, Virginia, on June 27, 1862.

**Isaac Barnett** (1822-1864) died at Richmond, Virginia, and was buried in Hollywood National Cemetery (Section V, Grave No. 681), at Richmond, Virginia.

**William M. Barrett** (1831-1862) resided in the Dacusville area; died August 30, 1862, at Summerville, South Carolina.

**Anderson J. Barton** resided in the Eastatoee Community, and he was killed in 1863 at Chancellorsville, Virginia.

**Benjamin Franklin Barton** (1826-1861) died of battle wounds November 12, 1861, at Culpeper, Virginia.

**G. B. Barton** resided in the Salubrity area (Liberty), and he died of consumption shortly after the Civil War (May 29, 1865).

**T. J. Beecham** died of disease in the summer of 1862 while serving in the Confederate Army.

**George Bentley** was killed during the Civil War while fighting in the Army of the Confederate States of America.

**John H. Black**, a Confederate soldier, resided on headwaters of Wolf Creek and died during the Civil War.

**George W. Barzali Boggs** (1828-1862) resided in the Salubrity area (Liberty) and was killed at Williamsburg, Virginia, in 1862.

**Henry Garner Boggs** (1821-1863) of the Salubrity area (Liberty) died June 7, 1863, while serving in the Confederate Army.

**Thomas Hamilton Boggs** (1823-1862) served to rank of lieutenant colonel and died at his home in the Salubrity area (Liberty) while on medical leave; he was buried at Carmel Presbyterian Church in Pickens County, South Carolina.

**Daniel Payne Bolding** (1836-1861) died of disease November 25, 1861, at Sullivans Island, South Carolina.

**Green B. Bolding** (1836-1862) was killed January 18, 1862, while serving as a Confederate soldier.

**Thomas Borroughs**, a Confederate soldier, was killed at Sharpsburg, Maryland, during the Civil War.

**George W. Bradley** (1839-1865) resided in the Enon Church Community and was killed at Wills Valley near Lookout Mountain, Tennessee.

**Robert Newton Bradley** (1838-1862) resided in the Enon Church Community and died of wounds at Richmond, Virginia, in 1862.

**Warren D. Bradley** (1825-1864) resided in the Enon Church Community and died while on medical leave at his home.

**Jeremiah C. Brasswell**, a Confederate soldier, was killed at Richmond, Virginia, during the Civil War.

**Thomas P. Brasswell** (1842-1865) resided in the Shoal Creek/Crosswell Baptist Church area and died in 1865, while serving in the Confederate Army.

**John Lawrence Breckenridge** (1846-1864) resided in the lower valley of the Keowee River; killed at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia, May 12, 1864.

**James Brewer** (b. ca 1843) resided in the Dacusville Community and was accidentally killed in a railway accident during the Civil War.

**Jim Brock** resided in the Dacusville Community and was captured by Union troops; he died while being held as a prisoner of war.

**Joseph F. Brock** (b. ca 1842 - d. 1862) died of battle wounds received while serving in the Confederate Army.

**William Orel Brock** was killed while fighting in the Army of the Confederate States of America during the Civil War.

**Andrew Pulliam Brooks** (1839-1865) died while being held a prisoner of war at Elmira Prison in New York State on August 16, 1864.

**Marion Brown** (b. ca 1842 - d. 1862), a Confederate soldier, was killed at Gaines' Mill, Virginia, June 27, 1862.

**James F. Burdine** (1845-1863) resided in the Pumpkintown/Oolenoy area, and he died November 16, 1863, while serving in the Confederate Army.

**Richard Henry Burdine** (1840-1862) resided in the Georges Creek area, and he died May 5, 1862, while serving in the Confederate Army.

**James H. Burdine**, a Confederate soldier, was killed at Campbells Station, Tennessee, during the Civil War.

**John A. Burdine** (1834-1864) resided in the Dacusville area and was killed in Virginia in 1864.

**Thomas M. Burdine** (1842-1864) resided in the Dacusville area and died of wounds at Petersburg, Virginia, in 1864.

**William C. Burdine** resided in the Georges Creek area and lost his life at Franklin, Tennessee, November 20, 1864, while serving in the Army of the Confederate States of America.

**John J. Burton** was killed July 21, 1861, during the First Battle of Bull Run at Manassas, Virginia.

**John William Callaham** (1835-1864) resided in the Salubrity area (Liberty) and died of wounds at Petersburg, Virginia.

**Daniel Cantrell** was killed during the Battle of Antietam near Sharpsburg, Maryland, on September 17, 1862.

**Henry Carson** was killed at Frayser's Farm, Virginia, while serving as a Confederate soldier.

**Nathan C. Carson**, who resided in the Enon Church Community, died at Richmond, Virginia, during the Civil War.

**James Thomas Chamblin** (1841-1862) resided in the Salubrity area (Liberty) and was killed at Frayser's Farm, Virginia, June 30, 1862.

**H. Elan Chapman** was killed at Fort Harrison while serving in the Confederate Army during the Civil War.

**Isaac A. Chapman** (b. 1825) died of disease while serving in the Confederate Army during the Civil War.

**John F. Chapman** (1844-1864), a soldier in the Confederate Army, was killed during the Civil War.

**John W. Chapman** (b. ca 1836) was killed while serving in the Confederate Army in Virginia during the Petersburg Campaign.

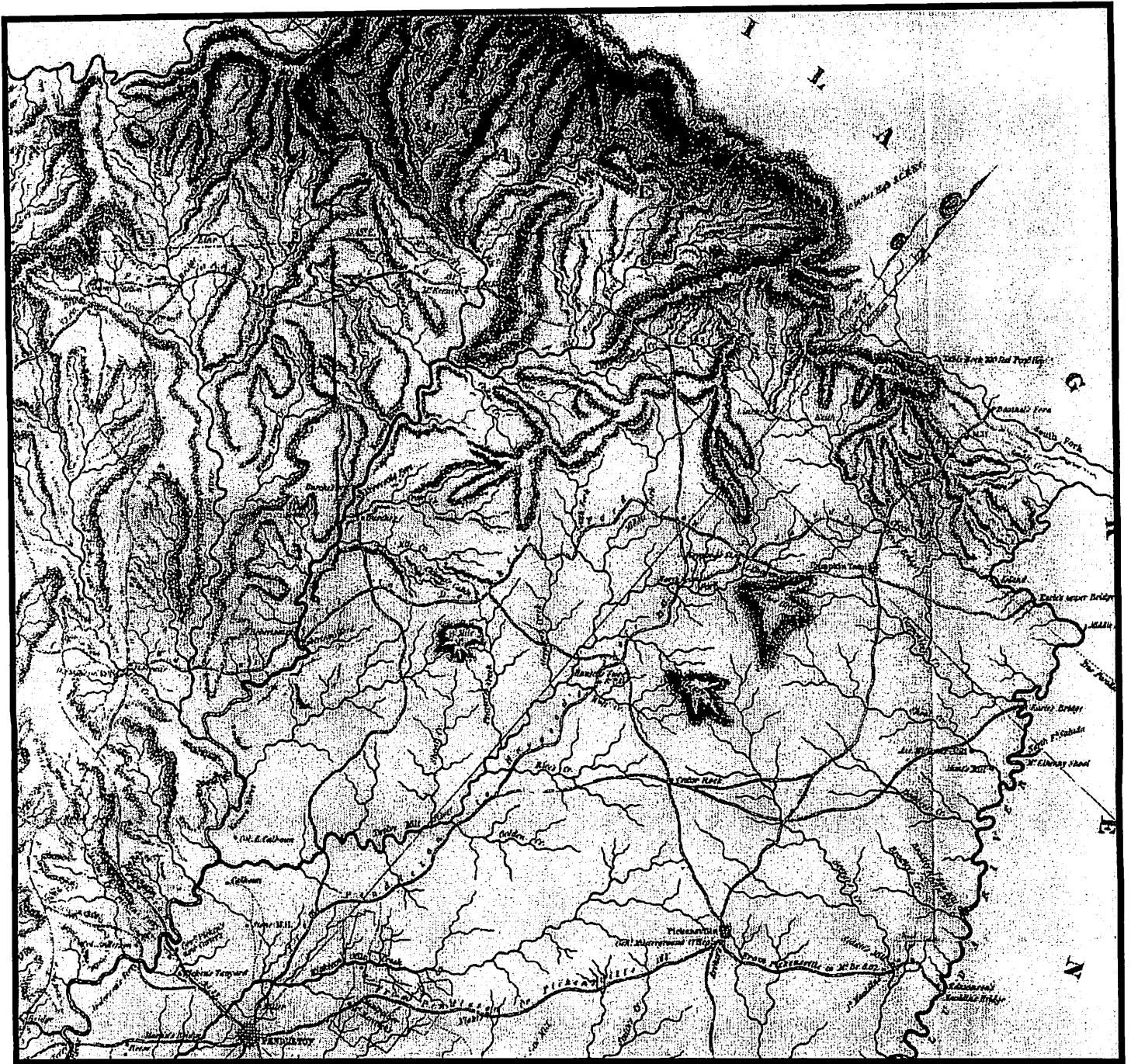

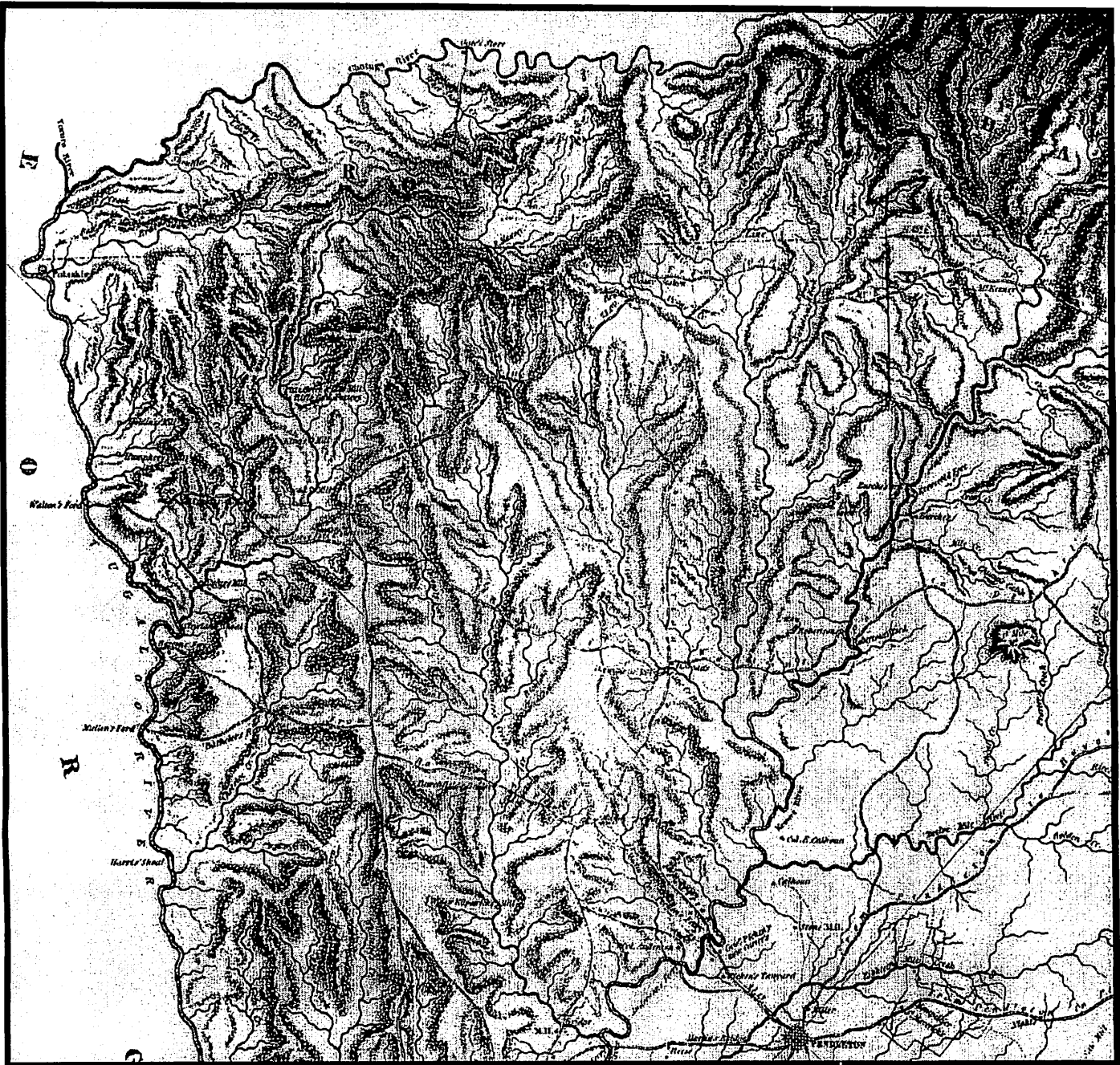

Zachariah Taliaferro was born in Amherst County, VA in 1759. At the early age of 18 he became a private soldier in the Revolution War. After the war he studied law, and was admitted to practice Virginia and later in South Carolina. He settled on the headwaters of 3 & 20 Mile Creek near Pickensville, where he practiced law until the courts were abolished in 1800. In 1802 he returned to Virginia and married Miss Margaret Chew Carter, a daughter of John Carter and Hannah Chew, his wife of Caroline Co., VA. After the removal of the Court House from Pickensville, he removed and settled on the homestead, three miles east of Pendleton, and continued to practice law at Pendleton until 1826 when the District of Pendleton was divided. He died in 1831 and was buried in the family graveyard on his homestead which he devised to his daughter, Margaret M. Taliaferro, who married Major Richard F. Simpson.

# Motion Picture Star Has Local Roots

Ann Noland, the talented and beautiful actress who had the leading role in the motion picture "Best Friends" spent part of her early childhood in Pickens County. She also has numerous local roots, including aunts in Liberty and Easley and uncles and cousins in Central.

The Hollywood star is the daughter of the former Christa Lee Hopkins, a Central native, and Col. H.C. Noland.

Ann Noland has appeared in such big feature films as Clint Eastwood's "Dirty Harry," Woody Allen's "Take the Money and Run," and Hal Ashby's "Harold and Maude."

A vivacious and gifted actress, Miss Noland is 5'6" tall, has light brown hair and hazel eyes, and weighs 110 pounds.

Dr. Georgiana McDaniel of Liberty is a great-aunt of the actress, being a sister of the star's grandmother, the late Thelma Hopkins of Central.

Miss Noland's grandfather, the late Chris Hopkins, served in the U.S. Navy during the First World War. He returned to Central after the war and operated an auto repair shop there for several years. The actress never knew her Grandfather Hopkins. He drowned in 1921 while swimming in a Southern Pines, N.C. lake.

Ann Noland's acting career has included roles in "Emil and the Detectives," a Walt Disney production; in "Satin School for Girls"; and in "Pick Up on 101." Moreover, the actress played principal roles in numerous outstanding TV films including "Katherine," "Testimony of Two Men," "The Letters," and "The Class of '63."

TV programs that have also benefited from Miss Noland's acting abilities include "On the Rocks," in which the attractive star had a recurring role. Furthermore, the actress had performed in such leading TV series as "The Waltons," "Baretta," "The Rookies," "Harry-O," and "Sesame Street."

The successful star of film and TV has also performed in the theatre. She appeared on the San Francisco stage in a production of "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest." While living in Germany where her father was stationed with the U.S. Army, Miss Noland appeared in several plays, including "The Glass Menagerie," "This Property is Condemned," and "Finian's Rainbow." All of the plays were produced in Berlin.

Unmindful of the fact that the diminutive actress once lived in Pickens County, many local residents have probably seen Ann Noland in some of the numerous TV commercials in which she has appeared. Another of the actress' accomplishments was dubbing for foreign films. Miss Noland speaks German, and she once dubbed English language voices into the sound tracks of German films that were later released in the U.S.

Miss Noland's mother and grandmother both attended Central Wesleyan College. Her mother is a former registered nurse, having completed professional training at Duke University's Medical College.

An accomplished dancer and skilled choreographer, Ann Noland was enrolled in private ballet classes in Clemson when she was only four

years old. To pursue her serious interest in the dance, the budding young performer once also traveled to England to study ballet.

Because Miss Noland's parents would not allow her to perform professionally until she had completed her education, the aspiring actress enrolled in a Hollywood, Calif., drama college while she was still a teenager. After she had received her degree in drama, the young actress began her professional career in the dramatic arts—a career that has led to performances alongside some leading American actors and actresses.

Miss Noland has visited her great aunt in Liberty several times. She has also visited

relatives in Central, where two of her uncles, Furman Hopkins and Norman Hopkins—along with a number of cousins, make their home. One of the star's aunts, Mrs. Geraldine Hopkins Henderson, also lives in Easley.

"Ann is as good an actress as I've ever seen," said Dr. Georgiana McDaniel. "I haven't seen all of her films and TV programs, but I've certainly been impressed by Ann's talent in productions that I've had the pleasure of viewing," she added.

Miss Noland, who once headed a ballet troupe, presently makes her home in New York City. When she is not at work with her movie or TV roles, the actress keeps active as a choreographer. Her parents now live in Newport News, Va., where her father, a retired military officer, teaches art and photography at Thomas Nelson College.
