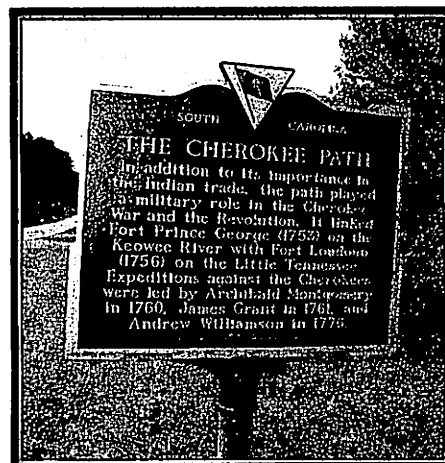

"The aged Col. Alexander Kilpatrick (1718-1805), James' father) was buried on his original Coneross land, at the top of a pine covered knoll above Snow Creek, about ¾ mile west of the plantation house. The crudely carved letters "A.K." are still faintly visible on the rough, half-buried sandstone that marks his grave. Family graves surrounding Alexander's cannot be identified; they are buried under debris and the headstones scattered." *Alexander Kilpatrick of SC and his Descendants*, Historical Southern Families, v. 22. Baltimore: Genealogical Publishing Company, 1978. p. 134.

On July 10, 2009 David Stapp sent an e-mail to Paul Kankula reporting that he had found the Old Kilpatrick Cemetery. He indicated there were two distinct cemeteries; one being a slave cemetery with about 75-100 burials and another white cemetery with around 10-15 burials. [Not sure how it knows it a slave cemetery and a white cemetery.] The land is currently owned by the Graber brothers. Found one grave in slave cemetery "Wilston/Milston. 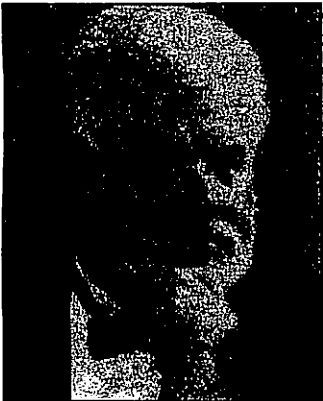
Katie Campbell, A Local Genealogist

Federal Census for Upstate on the Internet

News from Paul Kankula

Doing research in the "Golden Corner" of South Carolina (Anderson-Oconee-Pickens Counties) might be time consuming because of how these counties were formed. Based on your time-period, you might need to research all (3) counties.

- In 1789 Pendleton County was formed as part of the 96th Judicial District from Indian Land.
- In 1795 Pendleton County was placed in the Washington Judicial District.
- In 1799, Pendleton County was named Pendleton District by the State legislature and Washington Judicial District was discontinued.
- In 1826/27, Pendleton District was divided into the Anderson & Pickens Districts.
- In 1868 the state legislature decided to change all districts to counties.
- Current-day Anderson County represents the old Anderson District.
- Current-day Pickens County represents part of old Pickens District.
- Current-day Oconee County represents part of old Pickens County & added Indian Land.
- In 1986, Pickens County annexed Oconee land that included Clemson College & area extending SE to Anderson County.

Federal censuses were taken in SC at ten-year intervals beginning in 1790. They are available on microfilm through 1930. <http://www.us-census.org/states/southcarolina/> . The 1890 schedules were destroyed, except those for Civil War veterans and widows, which are at the SC Department of Archives & History. Federal indexes are available for 1790, 1800, 1810, 1820, 1830, 1840, 1850, 1860, and 1870 in book format.

Ross was born in Delaware, raised in southern California and is now retired in Redmond, WA. He worked in aerospace at North American Aviation/Rockwell from 1952 though 1975, then worked for Martin Marietta on the Space Shuttle's External Tank in New Orleans, Florida, and California. His ties to Oconee County is through his mother's family. Her mother was Olivia Edwards Osborne, daughter of Lulu Lanier and William Richard Osborne. His mother's father was Walter Donaldson Hopkins, a laborer who worked for Olivia's father. They left SC for Franklin Co., GA after 1913. In searching his genealogy, Ross found that his father's great grandfather was the enumerator of the 1850 Federal census of Washington County, Georgia. He then decided to transcribe his work for the USGenWeb Census Project and couldn't stop there. He has transcribed some (70!) Federal Censuses, including all of Washington County, GA. He's now concentrating on Oconee County.

THEY FELL TO THE SOUTHERN CAUSE

Confederate Soldiers of the Eastern Division of
Pickens District, South Carolina, Who Died
During the U. S. Civil War, 1861-65

Frederick W. Garvin (b. 1843) was killed at Sharpsburg, Maryland, while serving in the Confederate Army during the Civil War.

L. Armistead Garvin (1832-1864), a Confederate soldier, was killed in Virginia during the Wilderness Campaign of the War of the Rebellion.

Robert May Garvin (1848-1865), who resided in the area presently known as Central, died of measles at the age of sixteen years while serving in the Confederate Army.

Samuel J. Gary (1845-1862), of the Enon Church Community, died June 7, 1862, at Richmond, Virginia, at the age of seventeen years, one month and four days.

Thomas N. Gary (1847-1865) died January 1, 1865, at Charleston, South Carolina, while serving in the Confederate Army.

Clayton Gassaway of the lower Twelve Mile River Valley died during the Civil War while serving the Confederacy.

Henry Gassaway, Jr. (b. ca 1828) lost his life while fighting with the Confederate Army in Tennessee.

William J. Gaston (b. ca 1842 - d. 1862) was killed in August 1862 at the Second Battle of Bull Run (Second Manassas) in Virginia.

James Geer, who resided in the Zion Church Community, situated south of present-day Easley, died of smallpox while serving in the Confederate Army.

William Gibson, a soldier in the Confederate Army, was killed near Weensburg, Virginia, October 7, 1864.

Zackariah W. "Zack" Gibson was accidentally killed April 6, 1862, near Pickens Court House (Old Pickens on the Keowee River) while home on furlough from the Confederate Army.

James Christwell Gillespie (1833-1862), a Confederate soldier, was killed in Virginia during the North/South conflict.

Charles Asbury Gilstrap (1829?-1862) died during the Civil War while serving in the Confederate Army.

John Gilstrap, a soldier of the Army of the Confederate States of America, was killed in Virginia during the Civil War.

John Lewis Gilstrap died at Tunnel Hill, Georgia, September 24, 1862, while serving in the Confederate Army.

John W. Gilstrap (1842-1862), was killed May 31, 1862, during the Battle of Seven Pines in Virginia.

Lewis Gilstrap (1832-1863), who lived on waters of the Little Eastatoee Creek, died in Virginia during the War of the Rebellion.

P. E. Gilstrap, a Confederate soldier, died of disease at Pocotaligo, South Carolina, during the Civil War.

James A. Granger (1837-1862) died of typhoid fever at Lynchburg, Virginia, in 1862 while serving in the Confederate Army.

James Westmoreland Grant (1826-1864) resided in the Anderson Mills area of the eastern division of Pickens District, S. C., and died August 5, 1864.

Bright Gravely (1842-1865), a Confederate soldier, died in 1865 at Richmond, Virginia.

John Gravely, a resident of the northern part of eastern Pickens District, was killed during the Civil War.

Wiley Gravely (1829-1865), a soldier in the Army of the Confederate States of America, died during the Civil War.

Abner Teague Griffin (1835-1864) died of disease at Richmond, Virginia, in 1864, while serving in the Confederate Army.

Robert Young Haynes Griffin (1834-1862), who resided at what is today Pickens, S. C., and who commanded a Confederate Army company, died in July 1862 as a result of wounds sustained during the Battle of Seven Pines in Virginia.

John Archibald Hamilton III (1836-1862), who resided in the Carmel Presbyterian Church area (now southeastern Pickens County) died September 21, 1862, while serving in the Confederate Army.

John C. Hamilton (1831-1861) died of "pneumonia fever" at Charleston, South Carolina, April 25, 1861, at the age of twenty-nine years, five months and one day.

Warren Hamilton (1835-1862) a resident of the Enon Church Community, died of pneumonia at Ashland, Virginia, April 12, 1862.

Carter B. Harris resided on Town Creek waters of Pickens District (near present-day Pickens, S.C.), and he died February 1, 1862, at Charleston, South Carolina.

John Harris a soldier of the Confederate Army, was killed at Fort Harrison during the Civil War.

Thomas Hawkins died of disease in 1862 at Lynchburg, Virginia, while serving in the Confederate Army.

Jasper Newton Hawthorne, who lived in the Bethlehem Ridge area (near the present-day Pickens County Country Club), was killed June 27, 1862, at Gaines' Mill, Virginia.

Benjamin T. Hayes (1829-1864) resided in the Dacusville/Crosswell Baptist Church area and died from battle wounds received in Virginia.

Elijah Hayes (1833-1863) was killed in battle in 1863 near Richmond, Virginia, while serving in the Confederate Army.

Miles Head, who lived in the northern part of Pickens District, was killed at Cold Harbor, Virginia, during the conflict between the North and South.

Absolom Heaton (b. ca 1824) was killed at Frayser's Farm, Virginia, while fighting in the Confederate Army.

Fields E. Hendricks, a soldier of the Army of the Confederate States of America, was killed June 16, 1864, in Virginia.

George A. Hendricks enlisted at Pickensville, S. C. and died of wounds on December 19, 1864, at Richmond, Virginia.

John Fields Hendricks was killed during the Civil War and was buried at Chancellorsville, Virginia.

Lewis Hill Hendricks (1840-1862) resided in the Crossroads Baptist Church area and died of disease at Lynchburg, Virginia.

Milton Madison Hendricks, a resident of the Shoal Creek/Oolenoy area, died February 21, 1862, of congestion of the lungs while serving in the Confederate Army.

Zachary Taylor Hendricks resided in the Crosswell Baptist Church area and was killed in the defense of Richmond, Virginia, during the Civil War.

Abraham Hester died at Pocotaligo, South Carolina, April 22, 1862, while serving in the Confederate Army.

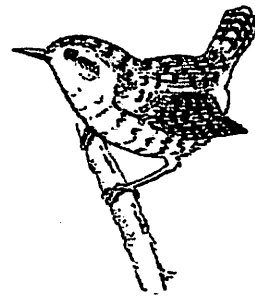
