





Nathan Turner died of disease at Pocotaligo, South Carolina, while serving in the Confederate Army.

John Wesley Vickery (b. ca 1835), who lived in Hurricane Township, was wounded during the Civil War and died during the last month of the conflict.

James C. Wade died of disease at Richmond, Virginia, while serving in the Confederate Army during the Civil War.

Albert L. Ward (1827-1864) died August 17, 1864, while serving in the Army of the Confederate States of America.

W. Tolliver Watkins was killed in Virginia while serving in the Confederate Army during the North/South conflict.

Eli Watson (1822-1862) died of pneumonia April 15, 1862, at Orange County Court House, Virginia.

T. H. Wearnes, a Confederate soldier during the Civil War, died at Lynchburg, Virginia, in 1863.

H. Wharton died at Adams Run, South Carolina, while serving in the Confederate Army.

Thomas A. White lost his life during the Wilderness Campaing in Virginia in the conflict between the North and South.

- George M. Williams, a Confedrate soldier, was killed at Lookout Mountain, Tennessee, during the Civil War.
- James Franklin Williams (b. ca 1832 d. 1861) died of typhoid fever September 8, 1861, while serving in the Confederate Army.
- J. T. Williams, a Confederate soldier, died of disease at Richmond, Virginia, during the Civil War.
- John H. Williams, who lived in the Dacusville area, died during the Civil War while serving in the Confederate Army.
- Samuel S. Williams, a soldier in the Army of the Confederate States of America, died of disease during the Civil War.
- John F. Wilson was killed in battle at Petersburg, Virginia, during the War of the Rebellion.
- Isaac Winchester (1841-1862) was killed September 17, 1862, in Maryland while serving in the Confederate Army.
- Willoughby Winchester (1843-1862) (Note: There were two cousins with this same name and the same birth and death years.) Resided in Antioch Church area; died of measles in Columbia, South Carolina, in 1862.
- Willoughby Winchester (1843-1862) (Note: This man was a first cousin of the above soldier; he had the same name and same year of birth and death as the above. These two men are incorrectly listed in Confederate military records as father and son---senior and junior.)
- Benjamin Cornelius Wooton was killed during the North/South struggle while serving in the Confederate Army.
- Jackson Wooten of Hurricane Township died of disease in Maryland during the Civil War.
- Mancel Wooten (b. ca 1843) lost his life in Virginia while serving in the Confederate Army.
- Warren Wooten, who resided in Hurricane Township and who served in the Confederate Army, died in Tennessee during the Civil War.
- Redmond Foster Wyatt (1825-1864) resided in the Fairview Methodist Church area, situated south of present-day Easley, S. C., and was killed July 30, 1864, at Petersburg, Virginia.
- Alonzo Archibald Young (1826-1864), who resided in the Tabor Methodist Church area, died March 2, 1864, while serving in the Confederate Army.
- Richard Young, a Confederate soldier who lived in Hurricane Township, died of disease in Tennessee during the Civil War.

William A. Young (b. ca 1842 - d. 1861) was wounded during the First Battle of Bull Run at Manassas, Virginia, and died the following day.

Epilogue to "They Fell to the Southern Cause"

This publication contains a list of the names of 386 men who lost their lives while serving in the Confederate Army during the U. S. Civil War and who once resided in the eastern division of Pickens District, South Carolina (present-day Pickens County). The list was compiled in August 1998, following a request for the same from Rick Simmons, veterans affairs officer of Pickens County, as part of his preparations for the creation of a Veterans Memorial Garden and Wall of Valor, which is currently being planned for the grounds of the county courthouse. The tragic military conflict in which these Confederate soldiers served and died was waged in the four-year period between 1861 and 1865. It pitted states of the North against those of the South and ended April 9, 1865, after General Robert E. Lee surrendered the Confederate Army of Northern Virginia to the Union Army of the Potomac at Appomattox, Virginia. The terrible armed struggle has often been described as "the first modern war" because of its warfare innovations, and it was given the official name "War of the Rebellion." Today, the conflict is most often referred to as either the Civil War or the War Between the States, the latter designation being preferred by some Southerners.

Many soldiers from the thirteen-member states of the Confederacy lost their lives during the Civil War: 320,000 of them were killed or wounded; 26,000 died while held in Union prison-of-war camps: 60,000 died from such diseases as typhoid fever, measles and pneumonia; and some of them were accidentally killed---both on and off the battlefield. The 386 men whose names are published herein died as a result of one or the other of those causes. Based on available evidence, more than 3,000 men from the old Pickens District of South Carolina served in the Army of the Confederate States of America. Some of them took part in major battles of the war; others participated in smaller engagements. In contrast to what happened in some army units, relatively few soldiers from Pickens District deserted the Confederate Army.

The names of local soldiers who died during the war were gleaned from the files of information collected as a result of the Confederate History Project. That research effort was initiated in Pickens County in 1985, and it is still an ongoing enterprise designed to collect and disseminate historical, biographical and genealogical data about local Civil War soldiers.

Without a doubt, the present listing falls somewhat short of being exhaustive. Additional names will most probably be added in the future—this because (1) the research project has not yet been completed and (2) active searches for more soldiers are still being conducted. Indeed, additional names are presently being added to the



project's files from time to time, and some are for men who were war casualties. On the other hand, the present roster is probably fairly inclusive. Perhaps it reflects the long period of time in which rigorous searches have been conducted, as well as the extensive and exemplary input that has been made by many members of the Old Pendleton District Chapter of the South Carolina Genealogical Society.

One of the problems dealt with in the preparation of this list was that of determining whether a soldier's home was in the eastern or western division of Pickens District. This issue was especially relevant in the case of men who resided in the valley of the Keowee River, which was once the rough dividing line between the district's eastern and western divisions. Thus, readers who might find errors in this respect are urged to notify the Confederate History Project. Persons who know of additional local men who lost their lives in the Civil War are also strongly encouraged to write to the Confederate History Project.

Harold King a member wrote his concern for mistakes in the 1790 census. (https://max.ps.nih.gov/harold-king.ac.rr.com. In the 1790 census for Pendleton District, SC, there is a Solomon King listed. In the WPA census list he was listed as King Solomon by mistake so when you do a search look for the last name Solomon, then look at the actual census records for Solomon King. He is listed on the same page in the original records as John King. There are deeds listed in 1785 for a Solomon King, Sr., and a Solomon King, Jr., in Pendleton District, SC. Solomon King does not appear in SC census records in 1800. Does anyone have information on Solomon King, Sr., and Jr. in SC in the 1785-1790 time period?

Ratcliff Jr. was married to Nancy Harris who survived her husband, dying in Mar 1822 in GA. A will or estate papers for Ratcliff Jr. might name his children. Article on Blue Ridge Railroad.

Public Meeting. Van Divire nominated James A. Doyle as Chairman and Whitner Symmes, Esq. secretary. Discussed how to solicit subscriptions from citizens for the public buildings of Oconee County.

Article from the Sumpter Watchman. Misses Morgan and Miss Moore have left Sumpter to open a school in Walhalla.

Postmaster at Walhalla is Dr. Norman.





Mt. Nebo Baptist Church was established in a brush arbor on the Rock Hill of Pumpkintown, SC in 1866, according to Luther Johnson's history, under the Christian leadership of its first pastor, Rev. Earle. [Before publishing in other material, this date should be check with other sources. It is possible that the date should be 1868 or shortly thereafter.]

About the year 1873, the brush arbor was moved to the location where the Church now stands. At that time the land was owned by Earl Edens. The congregation worshipped at this place, and in the year 1876, Earl Edens agreed to partly sell and partly give three acres of land for a Church.

In the year 1881, Soap Stone, Pine Grove, Shoals Creek, and Mt. Nebo met at the Shoals Creek to organize the first Oolenoy River Association and the first session met at the Mt. Nebo Baptist Church in 1882. A slab structure was built on this land. According to the *Pickens Sentinel* in 9 Mar 1893, "Martin Terrell is rebuilding the Mount Nebo Colored Baptist Church." After this structure, a wooden church experienced much spiritual and numerical growth. Another church was built in October 18, 1923. After 1941 the church did not have services for six years and one day.

In the year 1947, a few got together to reorganize the Mt. Nebo Baptist Church. The people that were responsible were Deacon Roy McGowan, Deacon Will Terrell, Deacon B.C. Hill, Deacon A.C. Hill, Deacon Ernest Mile, Deacon Harvey Mile, and Deacon Henry Brazell, Rev. T.M. Morigne was called as pastor.

The church sanctuary was rebuilt in the year 1955, under the leadership of Rev. T.M. Morigne. During the year 1977, Rev. T.M. Morigne was succeeded by Rev. P.P. Pace and he was succeeded by Rev. David Mayes in 1979. His deacons consisted of Deacon B.C. Hill, Chairman Emeritus; Deacon Harry Peden, Chairman; Deacon John Whitter, Co-Chairman; Deacon James Miles and Deacon Willie Pickens, Jr. The secretary during his pastorate was Mrs. Betty H. Pickens and the Treasurer was Brother Dirlyn Hill.

Pension Record of Ruth Alexander. Ruth Alexander, the widow of E. B. Alexander applied for a pension on 25 Jun 1915. Her husband served in CO B, 2nd SC Rifles under W. W. Clayton. Witnessed by W. L. Morgan and W. R. Garrett. Signed before notary in Oconee County.¹

Pension Record of Ruthy Alexander. Pickens County, SC. Ruthy Alexander, widow of E. B. Alexander, applied for pension on 14 Apr 1919. Her husband enlisted in CO B, 2nd Rifles under R. A. Thompson on 21 Mar 1862 and served until 9 Apr 1865. He was discharged at Appomattox, VA on 9 Apr 1865 and was in same company under Captain Clayton. She married him on 2/10 Sep 1858. He died on 9 Dec 1868. [Listed on the 1870 Census.] She was 78 years old and lived at Route 2. Central since 10 Sep 1858. Witnesses were Robert Stewart (CO B, 2nd Rifles) and R. A. Bowen (CO E, 2nd Rifles).²

Elisha Blevin Alexander was the son of James Prier (b. ca. 1798 – 1870) and Dorcas (Griffin) Alexander. He was born in 1830 (census) or 10 Nov 1835 (tombstone), which was moved and appears incorrect. He is 30 in 1860 census and 41 in the 1870 census. Elisha Alexander married Rutha Boon (b. 7 Jul 1842/43 – d. 31 Aug 1926.) He died 1 Dec 1878 and is buried at Old Pickens Presbyterian Church Cemetery. Children:
