Citizens in neighborhood of Rock Springs Church are organizing a Democratic Society on 27 May 1868 (5 o'clock) t Rock Spring Church. On motion of Capt. J.L. Shanklin, Rev. H.H. Penny was elected as Chairman and T.A. McElroy as Secretary. Committee: M.S. Stribling, M.B. Dendy, Rev. T.B. Mauldin, Capt. J.L. Shanklin and Lewis Morehead. Known as Rock Spring Democratic Club. Purpose is to be auxiliary to the Central Democratic Club of Oconee County at Walhalla and to cooperate with the great National Democratic party of the US. Other officers: Vice Presidents, M.B. Dendy and W.W. Stribling; Executive Committee, James Wright, Oliver Martin, Lewis Morehead and H.D. McDonald. Delegates: L.D. Stribling, Thos. Wiley, W.W. Stribling, James Wright and J.L. Shanklin.

Members of Mount Zion Democratic Club and citizens of surrounding country met at O.F. Seminary on 22 May 1868 at 4 o'clock for purpose of electing officers. President and Secretary elected at previous meeting. Whitner Symmes addressed the meeting. President, Gen. F.N. Garvin; Vice President, J.N. Arnold, Esq., Charles Thompson and John W. Knight: Secretary, Sam'l A. Jaines and J.V. Philpot; Treasurer, E.B. Colhoun; Executive Committee, B.S. Gaines, J.J. Garvin, J.A. Gaines, N.T. Martin, Lot James, James Porter and S.T. Knight. Delegates: J.D. Gasaway, J.S. Porter, J.S. Richie, J.W. Knight and S.A. James elected to represent the club at the Central Democratic Association at Secona, 23 May 1868. Next meeting at Mt. Zion on 30 May 1868 at 4 o'clock.

Article from the Charleston News. Democratic gains in South Carolina. Oconee majority against constitution 140, Democratic majority County elections 350, Democratic gain 110. "This is surly encouraging; for it proves that the white men of the State are beginning to exert their whole strength as well as that the negroes are gradually forsaking the Loyal League to vote with the Conservation party."

Unknown Author. Friday evening the Female Educational Society gave an entertainment at Ansel's Hall in the shape of a miniature Theatre. Attended a Democratic meeting "of our colored friends. We do assure you, Mr. Editor that we were highly gratified to find so many Freeman in attendance and manifesting as they all did, on this occasion, such a decided interest in the Democratic organization of our Country, was, we do assure you quite animating to our Democratic spirits." Spent night at Biemann's Hotel. Walhalla has three schools, two male and one female.

Letter from Confederate Home asking for monetary support. Charleston, SC.

The Center Union Democratic Club met on 30 May 1868. A motion was made by **J.B. Sanders** to have "all colored person to join with us by giving their names and attending our meetings as spectators. . ." This church began in a log cabin in 1895 with a Sunday School organized by Brother Haywood. In the year of 1896, Rev. F. W. Moore took over the Sunday School and began preaching services. In 1903 nine members were added to that Mission. On July 16, 1904, members from various churches organized the church under the pastorship of Rev. F.W. Moore.

During the organizational meeting, Rev. F.W. Moore called the house to order. It was motioned that the Rev. J.H. Cunningham, be the acting Moderator and Miss Estelle Jenkins the secretary. After the organization, a motion was made by Rev. F.W. Moore that the Rev. J.H. Cunningham preach for the remainder of the year. Ashmore Oglesby and S.M. McClure were ordained as deacons.

Mrs. Elsie Lay Watkins Poole was the first member to be baptized at White Oak Spring Baptist Church.

In the fall of 1904, Rev. F.W. Moore was elected Pastor, who served four years. During those years, he ordained Samuel Lay and J.W. Wright as deacons. John Grier, a deacon, joined by letter.

From this organization, the church has had sixteen pastors. They are as follows:

Rev. W.H. Baker 1958. In 1961, the church was remodeled and education building added. The chairman of the building committee was Mrs. Lizzie Oglesby and members included Mr. R.C. Jamison, Mrs. Elsie W. Poole, and Mrs. Willie Boggs.

Rev. J.E. Young 1965

Rev. Ulysses Durham 1969. In 1973 Matthew Oglesby was licensed and ordained to preach the gospel.

Rev. B. E. Griffith 1974. A complete renovation and fellowship hall was built in 1976.

Rev. Lonnie E. Skelton 1989. Melvin Patterson, Jr. was ordained as a deacon.

Rev. Ronald S. Watson 1997. Russell Oglesby was licensed to preach the gospel in 2000.

Rev. John L. Black, Jr. 2002. Four individuals were trained for deaconship; A. H. Oglesby, Marcell Oglesby,

Michael E. Forbes, and Paul Oglesby, Jr. were ordained and Russell M. Oglesby ordained as a minister.

The church, located on Simms [Symmes] School Road, was destroyed by fire in October 1988. This was the third time in the existence of the church that fire destroyed the facility.

Rev. Matthew Oglesby was concerned about the church congregation having a place to worship. He contacted Rev. James Wiggins, pastor of Trinity Wesleyan Church, concerning their vacant church on College Street in Central. Rev. Matthew Oglesby and the White Oak Spring Missionary Baptist Church Board met at Trinity Wesleyan (formerly named Second Wesleyan Methodist Church) to discuss using their vacant church for services. In 1988, after several months of using this church, it was decided to purchase the building.

On May 11, 1997, the new Fellowship Hall was completed and dedicated. Wilbert L. Morgan (Chairperson), Julian W. Oglesby, Bryant S. Black, Sr., Michael E. Forbes, and Russell M.

From my date base I find Anna Mariah McCann born 10 Sept 1843 Anderson District SC d. 9 May 1897 Anderson Co SC d/o Thomas Hampton McCann and Narcissa Walker. Anna Mariah married John M. Glenn 2 Oct 1871 Anderson Co SC.

I'm trying to locate the grave site of my ancestor Thomas Mann (1755 -1834). He served in The American Revolution. He was buried in Pickens County in 1834. He married to Sarah Tackett (1760 - 1858). (African-American Family) From another of your publications, I have learned that he was an early teacher registered in Pickens and eventually working in Liberia, SC. My cousin Loranzo Malone had written a previous book entitled *The Sizemore Family of Pickens, SC.* John Bailus's father William served in the Civil War (Confederate) which I am still trying to understand. I have his pension records. I do have Megginson's book about the Upper Piedmont and the Sizemore and Edens families are mentioned. John Bailus left Pickens and moved to Gaffney/Limestone Springs (Cherokee County) where my grandmother was born. During the time of the Great Migration from the South the family spread to Chicago/Evansville and Washington, D.C./ Maryland where pockets of them remain today. Some also went out West. 

(St. John's German Evangelical Lutheran Church of Walhalla) St. John's Lutheran . Church was constructed between 1859 and 1861 under the direction of John Kaufmann, master builder from Baden, Germany, for the German Lutheran congregation of Walhalla. The pulpit of "twisted wood" is of the style used by the High German Church. A number of charter members of the congregation were members of German Colonization Society. organization responsible for the development of Walhalla. Selected from this same group came three intendants, five town wardens, and one state senator, all of which indicates St. John's had a socially and politically influential congregation, who actively participated in the founding and management of the town of Walhalla. The nominated acreage also includes a ca. 1932 brick Sunday School building and the church cemetery, the earliest gravestone dating to 1851.
