This photograph of "Frank" Harrison was taken when he was a captain. He was a member of a prominent Andersonville family, having been a son of James and Sarah (Earle) Harrison. He was promoted to major in December 1862 and to lieutenant colonel and colonel in 1863. He participated in (and was wounded

during) the Battle of Gaines' Mill. After having received a battle wound in the leg, he personally removed a bullet or ball that had penetrated his body. Later, during the war, he resigned and returned to his home. He then served in the S.C. reserves until the end of the war.



LT. JOHN WESLEY HUNTER
(1829-1915)
Co. F, 22nd. S.C. Infantry Vol.

Born in Rabun County, Georgia,
John Wesley Hunter moved
to Pickens District, S.C.
with his parents at the age of six.

He was a son of David Hunter
(b. ca. 1805) and Mary
(Sluder) Hunter (b. ca. 1810).

On January 18, 1862 he enlisted
in the Confederate Army.
During the Civil War, he rose from
the rank of private to 1st lieutenant.

He was seriously wounded in
Maryland and then captured by the enen
He was immediately taken to Union
Hospital in Frederick, Maryland.

After Lt. Hunter signed an oath
that he would not take up
arms against the United States
again, he was turned over to
Confederate authorities, who also
admitted him to a hospital.

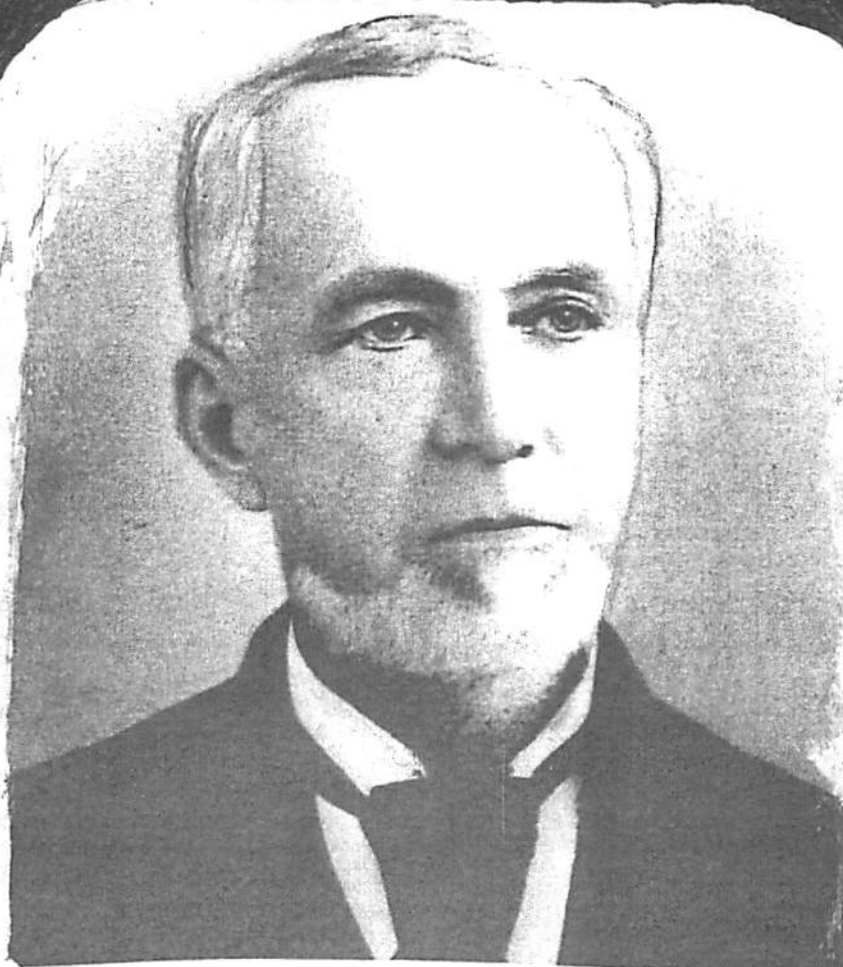

(1828-1914)

2nd South Carolina Rifles (Moore's)

Born on a Twelve Mile River farm in Pickens District, S.C., this Confederate soldier was a son of Charles and Mahalia (Gaines) Thompson.

He became a journalist, lawyer, state legislator and civic leader.

His newspaper work began with the Pendleton Messenger in Pendleton, S.C. and the Laurensville Herald in Laurens, S.C.

In 1853 he purchased the Keowee Courier and published it for 45 years.

In 1860 he was elected a delegate to the S.C. Secession Convention and signed the disunion order.

Thompson entered the army as a captain and company commander.

He was later promoted to the ranks of major and to lieutenant colonel.

During the U.S. Civil War, he took part in numerous battles.

His younger brother, George McDuffie

Thompson, was also a Confederate soldier.

A Pennsylvania native, Clemson was a highly educated agriculturist, mining engineer chemist and planter who married Anna Maria Calhoun, daughter of John C. Calhoun. ➔

Although he was too old to take part in active military combat, Clemson supported the Confederacy as head of its western nitrate bureau. He purchased the Fort Hill plantation that was established and operated by his prominent father-in-law.

He then willed it, along with substantial funds, to the state for the establishment of an agricultural college that evolved eventually into Clemson University. Mr. Clemson's son (see below) was a Confederate soldier during the war.

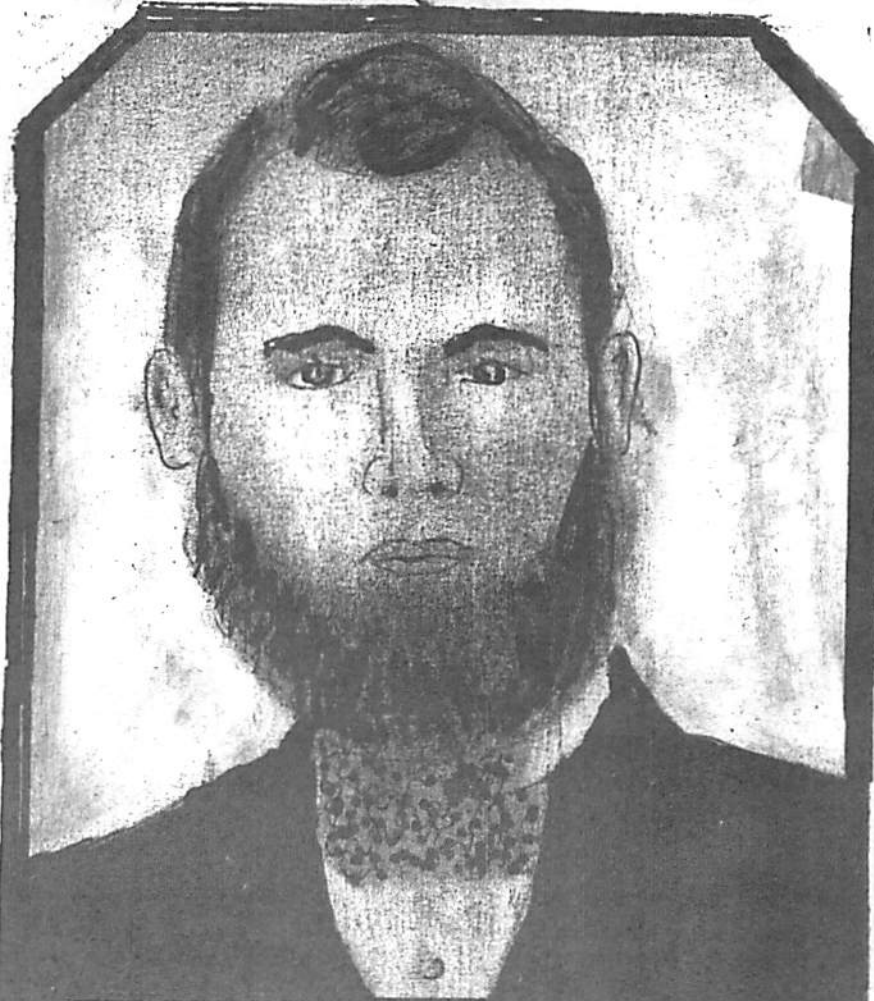

➔ A son of Thomas Green Clemson (see above) and a grandson of John C. Calhoun, Capt. Clemson entered Confederate military service as a private and was promoted to captain during the U.S. Civil War. He was born on his grandfather's Fort Hill plantation near Pendleton. After his father was assigned to the Trans-Mississippi Department of the C.S.A., Capt. Clemson was transferred from Orr's Rifles to the West. He was captured there by Union troops during the war and then sent to a military prison on Johnson Island in Lake Erie, where he was held as a prisoner of war until June 1865.

Then, he returned to Fort Hill.

In 1871, he was killed in a freak train accident near present-day Seneca in Oconee County.

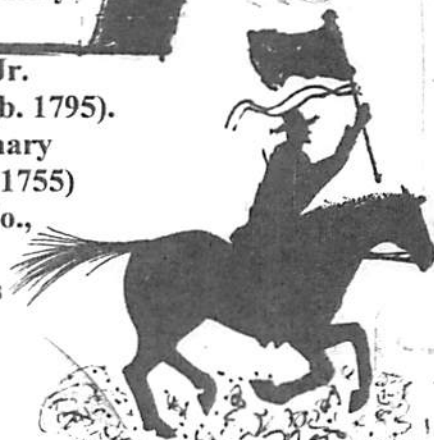

James Washington Lawrence, the soldier whose photograph is shown above, was born Sept. 7, 1832 in Pickens District, South Carolina. He was a son of Elisha Lawrence (1789-1876) and Martha (Craig) Lawrence (1792-1876).

In 1853 he married Emily Adeline Russell, sister of Maj. Thomas Hogan Russell, C.S.A.

At the age of 29 years, he enlisted in a company of troops Commanded by Capt. Miles Norton, in the 1st South Carolina Rifles.

While still in service, but on forlough in South Carolina, Sgt. Lawrence helped arrest Confederate

Army deserters and men who

were attempting to avoid conscription, some of whom were hiding in the mountains of northern Pickens and Greenville Districts in South Carolina.

This Confederate soldier survived the U.S. Civil War, and he returned to his home in Pickens District. He operated farms near the Twelve Mile and Keowee rivers.

He donated the four acres of land on which Lawrence Chapel United Methodist Church & cemetery are situated in present-day Pickens County, S.C. (The church was later named in honor of the Lawrence family.).

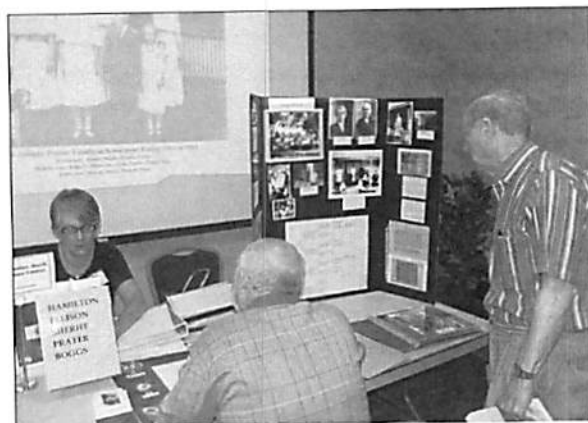
