Activities begin on Thursday, March 12 at the Pickens County Library in Easley with a computer class, "Introduction to Fold3," at 1:30 and at 4 p.m., "Beginning Genealogy for Children," designed for students grades three through six.

The Mary Oates Gregorie Historical Room at the library will host an Open House beginning at 5 p.m., followed by a special event at 7 p.m. The topic will be "Lewis Redmond and Manse Jolly: Upcountry Bad Boys." There is a small charge for this event.

On Friday, there will be guided tours at Old Stone Church Cemetery from 10 a.m. until noon, and also at Roberts Presbyterian Cemetery at 1:30 p.m. the Anderson County Genealogical Library will host a tour of their collection starting at 3 p.m.

That evening, Collins Ole Towns in Central will be open to tour, beginning at 5. Dinner will be served at 6 p.m. and must be paid for in advance.

Following the meal, Dennis Chastain will present "Early Trails and Roads of the Upcountry." This event is free.

This year, there is also an event planned for Sunday, March 15. There will be a dedication of Confederate Graves at the Pickens Cemetery at 3 p.m. Revolutionary Graves will also be identified.




