New Vice President Quientell Walker teaches class on Fold3 at March meeting

When our speaker was unable to attend the March meeting, our newly elected Vice President Quientell Walker stepped in to teach a class on the genealogy/military web site called Fold3.

Walker, who is the Genealogy Librarian for the Pickens County Library System, recently

taught this class during the Reunion of Upcountry Families, assisted by OPD Secretary Brenda Meyer.

He explained to the audience that Fold3 is a database similar to Ancestry.com as it contains primary source documents such as census records, city directories, and naturalization records.

"Fold3 is primarily focused on gathering materials that pertain to the military," he said. "It is more than just digitized military documents. Fold3 also includes photos, newspapers and stories from the men and women who have served in the military."

Some files include the U.S. Census Records from 1860, 1900-1920 and 1930, as well as Military Records including the War of 1812 Pension Files.

Using his laptop, he showed the audience how easy it was to access the site and give out tips on how to use both the basic and advanced search methods.

He recommended that Fold3 users create a personal account which is easy to do. He said this will allow you to bookmark the pages you find and want to keep, as well as allow the user to create Memorial Pages.

Walker described several differences between the free library version and the regular paid version.

He noted that the paid version includes the African

Memorial Service for Revolutionary Soldier Benjamin Barton scheduled for May 12, 2015

Fort Prince George Chapter is organizing a Memorial Service and Grave Marking for an American Revolutionary Soldier, Benjamin Barton, who is buried in Mountain Grove Baptist Church Cemetery at 644 E. Preston McDaniel Road in Pickens.

The service is planned for Tuesday, May 12 and the Pickens County Historical Society and Sons of American Revolutionary would like to invite everyone to participate in the service.

May 12 will honor the date Benjamin

Barton enlisted in the Continental Army on May 12, 1780. This was also the date Charleston fell to the British.

The Memorial Service will be held in the church. Afterwards, everyone will proceed to the cemetery to mark the grave. The Fort Prince George Chapter DAR and Col. John Robbins Chapter of Colonial Dames will be represented.

The event is spearheaded by Una Welborn, whose husband Harold is descended from Benjamin Barton.

Dan Brennan to present "Over There: A Pickens County Perspective on World War I" on April 21

Our speaker for the April 21 meeting will be Dan Brennan from the Pickens County Museum of Art and History. He will be speaking about an exhibit entitled "Over There: A Pickens County Perspective on World War I."

Dan graduated from Slippery Rock University with a degree in Anthropology, and has worked in public history since March of 1996. He moved to South Carolina in April 2004 and began working at the Pickens County museum in September of 2005, moving from the job of preparator to curator in late 2013.

His presentation will entail the process that led to the development of the exhibit as well as interesting local and national history concerning World War I.

The Pickens County Museum of Art and History wanted to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the beginning of World War I so they created a special exhibit, which included artifacts reflecting America's entry into the war in 1917 through the end of the war in 1918.

Dan will also speak about the experiences of Samuel Whitaker, a resident of Pickens County that served "over there."

Durham* Born Oct 2nd 1862 He had 4 sisters and 7 Brothers all had families except two *Susan* and *Bright* they died quite young not women of but two of his Brothers or sisters being alive that name and *John* an only one *Hardy Gilstrap* never professed religion or joined any church till his death as an avowal of. He accumulated some great wealth in his day
