Brought to goal [jail] a Negro man, who call himself **Peter**. He is of dark complexion, 5ft. 6 in. high, rather spare made and appears to be 28 or 30 years of age; says he belongs to **Peter L. Penn**, late of **Patrick county**, **VA**, but who has removed to, and now resident in **Alabama**, **Talego Valley**—that he was hired out in Virginia to **John Harston**, and that he ran away from his employment, intending to reach his master. He states he is a blacksmith by trade, and the taker of him confirms his statement by having made trials in a shop on the way, as he brought him to the goal.

A Librarian's Bookmarks

What's a Gazetteer?

Genealogy, as we all know, is all about names and place names are a very important part of our research. We want to know where exactly our ancestors lived. Locating a place can be difficult though, because place names change through the years, just as personal names do. Librarians, of course, have a tool to handle this problem.

A *gazetteer* is a geographical dictionary. It contains a list of place names, usually in alphabetical order, and gives a location for that place. Many gazetteers also provide further information. Gazetteers have existed since ancient times. The word "gazetteer" first appeared in the English language in 1693. Since genealogists are interested in places that existed years ago, places that may no longer exist, or that may have a different name, we look for both older gazetteers and current ones that provide historical information. A gazetteer can be a printed book or an online file; some titles are available in both formats.

Here are some suggested titles.

North Carolina

The North Carolina Gazetteer, 2nd ed. (Univ. of North Carolina Press, 2010) A dictionary of Tar Heel places and their history. [Call #: R917.56 Pow N. C.] This information has also been loaded into NCPedia, http://ncpedia.org/, and can be searched there.

For example, a search for Woodlawn produces this among other references: "Mount Holly, town in E Gaston County. Post office est. as Huntersville in 1800, named for Rev. Humphrey Hunter, postmaster. Name changed to Woodlawn in 1846. Inc. 1879 as Mount Holly, named for the town in New Jersey

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where fine yarns were manufactured. Produces textiles and hosiery. Alt. 621. See also Nims."

North Carolina, Her Counties, Her Townships, and Her Towns. (Indianapolis, Ind.: The Researchers, 1981.) [975.6 N NCC] This small book is notable for giving the names (and a very small map) of the townships in each county.

United States and World

United States Board on Geographic Names, http://geonames.usgs.gov/. The "Domestic Names" file includes historic names and includes names of landmarks such as cemeteries, parks, churches, etc. It includes a foreign names section.

The Columbia Lippincott gazetteer of the world. Edited by Leon E. Seltzer with the geographical research staff of Columbia University Press and with the cooperation of the American Geographical Society. With 1961 supplement. (Columbia University Press [1962]) x, 2148, 22 p. [Call #: R910.3 C – at Reference Desk] One of the most comprehensive gazetteers.

A gazetteer of Virginia and West Virginia / by Henry Gannett. (Clearfield Co., 1994, c1904.) Two volumes in one. Reprint of the 1904 editions of the author's A gazetteer of Virginia, and A gazetteer of West Virginia, published by U.S. Govt. Print. Off., Washington. [Call #: 975.4003 Gan NCC]

General alphabetical index to the townlands and towns, parishes and baronies of Ireland: based on the census of Ireland for the year 1851. Dublin: Printed by

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Alexander Thom, 1861, reprinted by Genealogical Publishing Co., Baltimore, Maryland, multiple dates. This can be searched online at https://www.johngrenham.com/places/. Anyone doing Irish research needs to be able to locate the exact place their family came from – townland, parish, etc.

What Place Do You Need?

Use the Family Search Wiki to find information on gazetteers for specific places. Some examples:

In a library catalog, do a keyword search on "gazetteer" and the name of the place you are interested in. Another useful subject term is "Names Geographical" which can also be used in a keyword search combined with a place name.

23 Dec 1842

Advertisement. The exercises of this Institution will be resumed on the first Monday in January 1843 under the care of the Rev. J.L. Kennedy. Boarding can be had in respectable families at \$50 per scholastic year (48 years.) Tuition, \$12, \$16 and \$24 per annum. Here are all desirable advantages for education, without exposure to the ordinary temptations to vice and extravagance.

Abundance of Children

Pickens is a great District in some respects. We remember to have heard our friend, **Major Whitfield**, state, one day in the Legislature, encircled by a gallery of beautiful women, that it was not uncommon to see a constituent of his the mother of twenty children!

- ... Whilest attending Pickens Court, the other day, we met our friend, Captain Steele, who had been a gallant midshipman in the war of 1812 with Great Britain and who served heroically in one of the hardest fought naval engagements during the war. He is now a resident of Pickens District. Some years ago he informed us that he had twelve children. We enquired of him "how the wife and twelve children did?" He reply was, that he had added five more to that number, and that now he had seventeen, all the sons and daughters of one mother! The youngest is still nursing! The oldest is just setting out for Kansas.
- ... Fifteen or twenty years ago we remember to have heard our old friend, **Daniel Durham**, of **Pickens District**, defend himself in Court, before **Judge Gantt**, in *propria persone*. In the course of his argument, he stated to the Court that he had **nineteen children at home**, all dependent, in some measure, on him for support! His Honor, the Judge, charged the Jury to acquit him and let him go home to his children and started that it was the best speech he had heard at the Bar during the Circuit.

We could mention a half dozen instances known to us in Pickens, where a mother has fifteen and twenty children. But Greenville, in the person of John Bates, Sr., can beat all this. He has commenced, as our friend P.E. Duncan once said in a stump speech, his third dozen of children. One mother bore him twenty four, and all living, she then died, and the old man took himself a second wife, who had, some years ago, given birth to three more. How many since, we know not.

Proof that Ambrose Cobb is father of John Cobb

Searching proof of the relationship between John Cobb, Pickens County Revolutionary Soldier, and Ambrose Cobb of Halifax County, VA and Lincoln County, NC. John Cobb was born in 1759 in Halifax County, VA and died on 21 May 1841 in Pickens County, SC. His burial site is unknown. His father is listed as Ambrose Cobb on websites and in books. He was born in ca, 1729 in Bruton Parish, York County, Virginia, lived in Halifax County, VA and Lincoln County, NC.
