years. Students carried lunches from home because there were no lunch rooms. They carried water from a spring and everyone used the same dipper. Later, a pump was added on the outdoor well from which the students got water.

Mrs. Clovie Boggs recalled: "We did not have buses when I went to school. We had to walk and the roads were all dirt roads. In August of each year, we marched to Cross Roads Church for the morning revival services. We had a tree at Christmas time and everyone exchanged gifts. We made all or most of the decorations for the tree. We would also have box suppers and cake walks which were a lot of fun. We also had assembly each morning. Someone would read some scripture, maybe sing a song or two, and we would have prayer before we began our classes. I have a lot of fond memories of the years I spent in the Maynard and Cross Roads community, for that is where I grew up."

Mr. A. D. Mann was principal at Maynard after they built the new building and also served as a teacher for a while. Some other teachers were Miss Bessie Nimmons, Miss Jessie B Edens, Miss Annie Roper, and Mrs. Eva Mann.

The old Maynard Schoolhouse was sold on September 3, 1921 to the Easley Lumber Company for \$446.00. The new schoolhouse was started on September 19, 1921, and was completed on December 21, 1921 by Bob Sheck and B. T. Day, contractors for building the schoolhouse.

The People's Journal identified the following teachers at Maynard School: Miss Minnie Williams, Miss Essie Cox, Miss Bettie Bowen, Prof. W.W.F. Bright, and Lewis F. Robinson.

Other teachers reported to have taught at Maynard School are Nettie E. Newton, H. W. Hiott, Miss Annie Roper, Jessie Edens, May Attaway, Ruth Looper, Emma Henderson, and Cecil Young.


