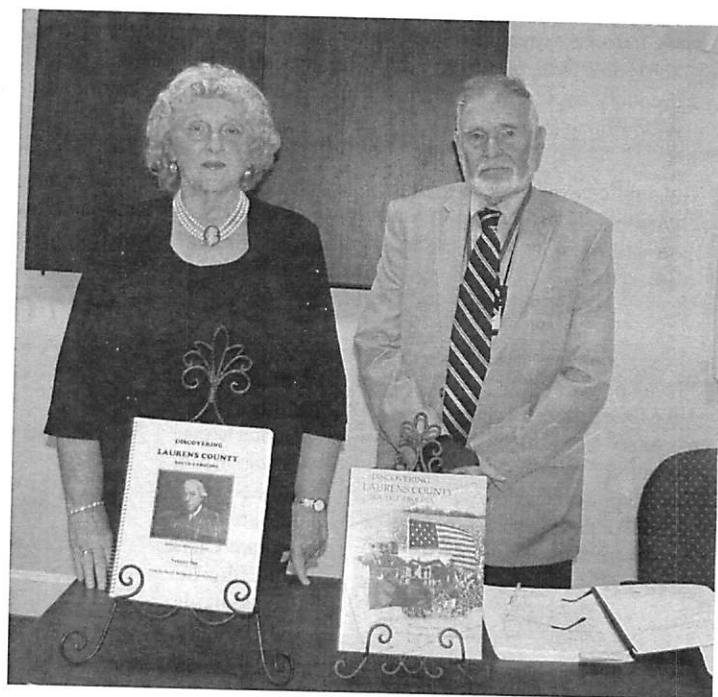

The meeting of the Old Pendleton District Chapter of the SCGS was held at the Central Clemson Branch of the Pickens County Library System on Tuesday, October 17, 2017 at 7:00 PM.

President Quientell Walker called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone. He made the following announcements: the February 2018 meeting will be held at a different location. Details to follow.

The nominations for the 2018 officers are as follows: President, Quientell Walker; Vice President, Mildred Brewer; Treasurer, LaMarr Brooks; Secretary, Brenda Meyer, SCGS Representative and Archivist, Anne Sheriff.

LaMarr Brooks, treasurer was absent, no report. Brenda Meyer, Secretary had no report. Judy Long made a motion that the minutes of the September meeting that appeared in the newsletter be accepted as written. Anne Sheriff seconded the motion. The motion was carried.

Anne Sheriff, SCGS Representative and Archivist announced that the Fort Prince George project is "back on" to build a replica of the fort near the original site. Also the annual meeting of the SCGS will be held in Chapin on Saturday, October 28, 2017. Details are in the Sept. newsletter.

## BURDINE LODGE GROUNDBREAKING



A large crowd gathered at the Hagood Mill Historic Site on Tuesday afternoon (November 31, 2017) for the long-awaited groundbreaking for the Eighteenth Century Burdine Lodge. Led by Bishop Jonathan Holston, Resident Bishop of the South Carolina United Methodist Conference, and Dr. Roger Gramling, Chairman of the United Methodist Foundation and Secretary-Treasurer of the State Methodist Historical Society, Methodist leaders from across the State and local members participated in the event.

The Burdine Lodge is a documented location where Bishop Francis Asbury stayed as he established Methodism in the South Carolina Upcountry in the late 1700s and early 1800s. It had become the home of Samuel Burdine in 1796.

Senator Rex Rice and members of the Pickens County Delegation, County Councilman Wes Hendricks, County Administrator Gerald Wilson, Mayor David Owens, City Councilman Patrick Lark, and a sizable contingent of members of the Pickens County Historical Society were present at the wooded site selected for the re-building scheduled to begin in the next few weeks.

Historical Society President Ken Nabors who supervised the careful deconstruction of the structure several years ago said, "We are restoring an important part of our local history to Pickens County that will be here for generations to come." Methodist Lay Speaker and Pickens County Historical Society member Chuck Blowers will lead the construction team. A grand opening event will be held when the log house is completed.
