

Home of Dr. William Thomas Field and wife Eliza Jane Blassingame

Dr. William Thomas Field was born December 11, 1836 and died December 11, 1904 and was buried in the Field Family Cemetery near Dacusville, SC. He married Eliza Jane Blassingame who was born in 1842 and died in 1923. The above photograph was published in the *Pickens Sentinel* (unknown date) and reported that Dr. Field was born near this home in a smaller house.

When Pickens County was formed in the division of the old Pickens District in 1868, Dr. Field was one of the six commissioners named to locate a site for the new county seat-Town of Pickens.

Dr. Field, a veteran of Lee's Army, graduated from the Medical College of South Carolina in 1858 but seldom practiced. A farmer, he served the County as Senator from 1882-1890 and as a delegate to the 1895 Constitutional Convention. He died in 1904 at age 68 on 14 Dec 1904. (*Biographical Directory of the Senate of the State of South Carolina 1776-1964* (Columbia, SC, 1964), 217. [Notice difference in death tombstone date.)
