

The location is a most desirable one, being situated on a beautiful plateau and surrounded by a fertile region, with thrifty inhabitants.

There is on both Town and Wolf Creeks fine WATER POWER with good SAW MILLS, and an abundance of the best TIMBER near by.

The County Site is nearly equidistant between Keowee and Saluda Rivers, with a fine view of the mountain scenery, and will command a large and profitable trade from the mountains and from North Carolina.


