

- First. We present as a grievance that commissioners of Roads are compelled to serve under heavy penalty and receive nothing for their services.
- Second. We present as a great and growing Evil in our Country the great number of "frivolous" prosecutions be
 paid by the Prosecutor unless the defendant are convicted and that in all cases the defendants where convicted pay
 all the costs or the officer receive no fees.
- And also present as a grievance that Witnesses in State Cases receive no Compensation for their attendance.
