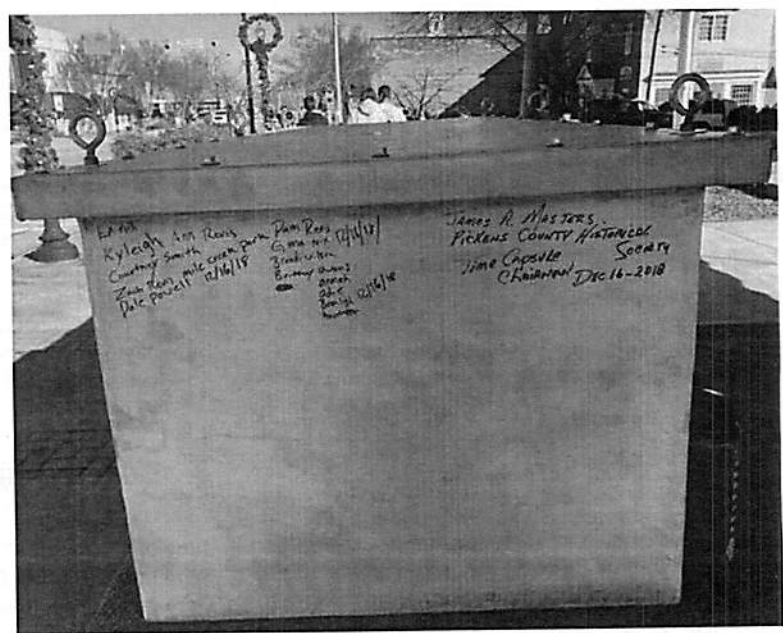

We the Grand Jurors for Pickens District at March Term 1832 present the following as grievances to the Citizens of the District.

- First. We present as a grievance that commissioners of Roads are compelled to serve under heavy penalty and receive nothing for their services.
- Second. We present as a great and growing Evil in our Country the great number of "frivolous" prosecutions be paid by the Prosecutor unless the defendant are convicted and that in all cases the defendants where convicted pay all the costs or the officer receive no fees.
- And also present as a grievance that Witnesses in State Cases receive no Compensation for their attendance. John Odell, Foreman. A. Richards, James Morrison, John Merritt, Simeon Wade, William Lusk, John Sharpe, Ephraim Perry, Richard Poe, Elijah Barnett, James Kelley, James Henderson, Ira /R? Ordered that these presentments be entered on the Journals of the Court and copies furnished to the Senator. Reed Creek is in the northern part of **Hart County**, near the junction of the Tugaloo and Savannah rivers. In 1795, Thomas Shockley's Ferry was established on the Savannah River. This ferry later became known as Brown's Ferry. The old Knox Bridge was on the Tugaloo River crossing into SC from Georgia near the Shoal Creek Community.
