Some of the collections now at the Clayton Room at Southern Wesleyan University are as follows: The Julia Alexander Collection, the Bess Bowen Collection, the Herb Hendricks collection which includes some Smith Family records, collection from the Pickens County Historical Society (photos), materials from Hyatt Printing and Bivens Hardware.

Plans are well on the way for the SCGS 2019 Summer Workshop which will be the second Friday and Saturday of July. This year there will be a Silent Auction, many door prizes and speakers. More information will be forthcoming in the months ahead. The evening ended with time of fellowship and refreshments.

 - 4. Running horses in the Streets is forbidden.
 - 5. All rows, riotous or disorderly conduct ... the peace and good order of the Town are strictly forbidden.
 - 6. All Road hands ... be relieved from ... working by paying 75 cents per day to the Clerk of the Council.
 - 7. The Property Tax shall not exceed the State tax.
- 8. Quarterly dues on the gross sales of Goods shall not exceed 20 cents on the hundred dollars; and said tax is due on 1st January, April, July and October in 1869. All persons owing such tax will settle with the Clerk of Council at the above named times. Failing to do so, at the expiration of four week they will be double taxed.
- 9. In order to prevent fire in the Town, citizens are to keep their chimneys well burnt out in wet weather. Failing to do so, and any accident occurring in consequence of such neglect, they will be subject to a fine of \$20.
- 10. We recommend that the citizens of the Town furnish themselves with ladders, sufficiently long to reach to the tops of their houses, and that they be kept on the premises ready for use.
- 11. We also recommend that all merchants, lawyers, doctors, and other business men, erect a horse-rack in front of their place of business, in the street on a line with the middle row of shade trees.
