James Mason Clardy Papers

Rev. Royce Addis, Norris, South Carolina donated the Clardy documents to the Faith Clayton Family Research Center. Mr. Clardy had a Mule Business in Norris, SC. On an insurance application, he reports his name is James Mark Clardy and he was born in Pickens County on 2 Dec 1881 and that he has a wife and three children. (30 Jan 1930). On an application for automobile insurance on 19 Sep 1924 he says he was born 12 Dec 1885 and that he is a Live Stock Dealer. Mrs. Anne Sheriff is currently researching further information on this business and the family.
