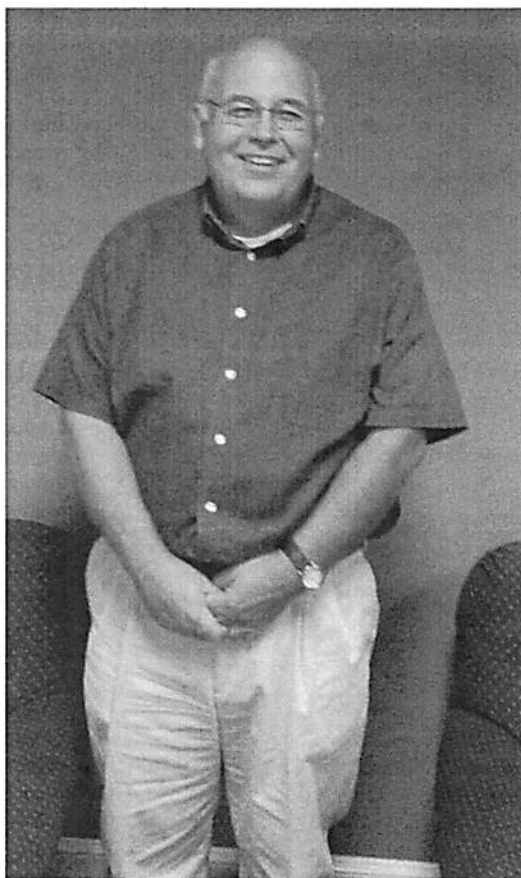

Articles from *Anderson Intelligencer* and *Pickens Sentinel*

Abstracted by G. Anne Sheriff

An Act to Re-charter the Pumpkintown Turnpike Road, in Pickens County

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of South Carolina, now met and sitting in General Assembly, and by the authority of the same, *That the Turnpike Road leading from Pumpkintown to Table Rock, in Pickens County, be, and the same is hereby re-chartered, in the name of Marcus D. Keith, for the term of 14 years, with the same rates of toll as those heretofore allow by law.* Section 2. *That all persons going to and returning from elections, churches and mills, shall be allowed to pass over the road free of toll.* Approved 23 Jan 1871. (*Anderson Intelligencer*, 23 Mar 1871, p. 4).

New Road

The citizens of Pumpkintown township are opening a new public road leading from Mr. Matthew Gillespie's at Pumpkintown to A.B. Talley's, on Saluda river, where it intersects the Jones' Gap road near Middle Saluda. In addition to the work performed by the citizens, we are informed that Mr. Talley is contributing liberally of his own means, and has given the right-of-way through a valuable portion of his bottom land. The liberality of Mr. Talley is to be commended and shows him to be a public spirited, progressive citizen of the County, as was evidenced by the very handsome vote given him for the re-nomination to the Office of County commissioner in our recent primary election. The Highway Supervisors of that township, Matthew Gillespie and W.B. Jones are making other important and necessary changes in the public roads of that township. They have commenced to regrade and put in thorough condition the road leading from Mr. Gillespie's to Holly Springs Church in order to meet the depot they expect to be established on the A. & F.B.V.R.R. at that place. They also intend improving the road from Pumpkintown to Oolenoy church. . . . (*The Pickens Sentinel*, 30 Sep 1880, p. 3)

Some History of Old Pickens District by N. Boone Carey Sheriffs of Old Pickens

Samuel Reid, a son of Joseph Reid, who was a revolutionary soldier and settled a large tract of land in the fork of Keowee and Little Rivers, which is still owned by his descendants, having been in the family over one hundred years (1915). Mr. Reid served only one term as sheriff and engaged extensively in farming the remainder of his life, except that part of it spent in the service of his country during the 60's; for, though advanced in years, he was among the first to volunteer in defense of the Southern cause. He had three sons: Joseph, who died a prisoner of war at Elmira, N.Y., James T., who entered the army as a private, rose to the rank of captain, served throughout the war and died at the old family homestead a few years ago, bearing upon his person evidence of his bravery in wounds received in battle, and George T., who entered the army with the sixteen-year old boys in Capt. C.L. Hollingsworth's company, and remained till the close of the bloody struggle. He is now a prominent citizen and prosperous merchant of Chappells, SC. There were three daughters of Mr. Reid: Mrs. W.C. Keith, deceased; Mrs. L.B. Lee of Chappells, SC and Mrs. Warren Shelor of Anderson, SC.

The second sheriff was Alexander Bryce, who served one term and was rather a noted character in his day, being a magistrate and for some time major of the state militia. In the days of Reconstruction he affiliated with the Republican party and was a member of the "Ringer, Streaked and Striped" convention of South Carolina. He was the father of the notorious Alexander Bryce, Jr., and Morgan H. Bryce, deceased, both of whom figured prominently in Republican politics.

James A. Doyle was the third sheriff of the old district and was a very remarkable and prominent man. He served his district in many other positions of trust and honor, always with credit to himself and honor to his country. He was a brother to the late Dr. O.M. Doyle, deceased, of Seneca, and has a large number of relatives in South Carolina and Texas. It was during the administration of Mr. Doyle that the Henderson brothers were hanged for the killing of Wilson. I have heard older people say that there was much excitement at the time, many believing one of the brothers was innocent, as the other one so declared at the trial and remained firm in this statement on the gallows. . .

Mr. Doyle was succeeded by L.C. Craig in the sheriff's office, who served two terms and at the beginning of the war joined the army and died of wounds received in some of the bloody battles of Virginia.

W.N. Craig, a cousin of L.C., was a war-time sheriff as well as a brave and gallant soldier. After the division of the old district he was elected sheriff of Oconee and died in office.

Samuel Thomas was the last sheriff of Old Pickens District, was a splendid citizen and made an excellent officer. He died a few years ago and has a large circle of relatives in Oconee and Pickens.

Regis** mule, one horned jersey cow about 8 years old. Also 500 lbs. lint cotton to be grown by me or for me in the year 1920 in Hurricane Township, Pickens Co. of lands of **Mrs. J.R. Griffin**, adjoining lands of **R. T. Hallums, J.C. Duckworth** and **J.R. Griffin** and others. It is agreed that ½ of above note is to be paid this fall and the remainder to run till Nov 1st 1921. Witnessed 11 Feb 1920 by **E.W. Tate**. Notary: **J. Alonzo Brown**. Recorded 17 Mar 1920 in Vol. AA, p. 124.

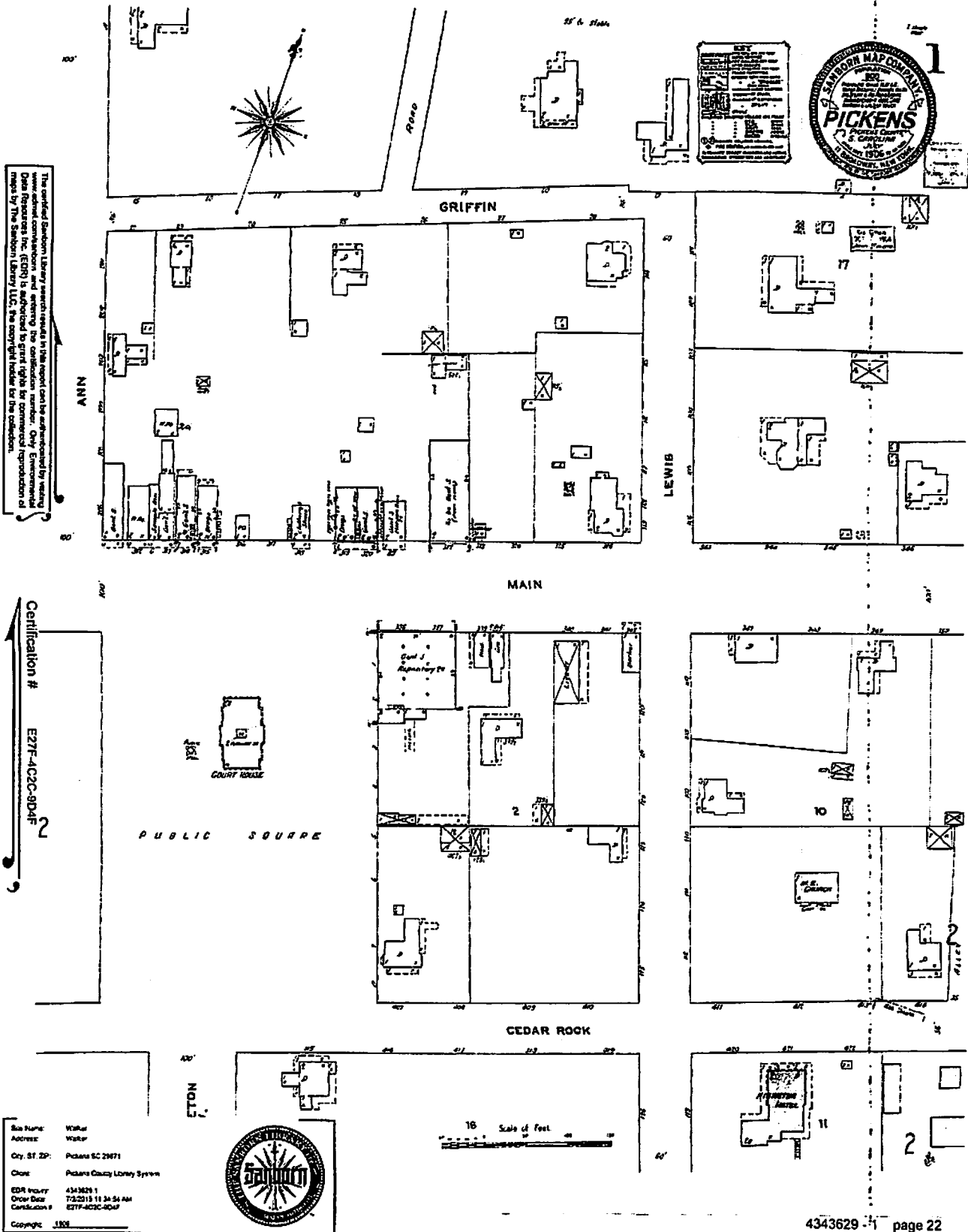
