A COBB Family of Old Pendleton District, South Carolina

"In search for the antecedents of our known ancestor, Henry Cobb, I have reviewed many books and manuscripts written on the early Cobb families and their descendants. Most of this trace the families of Ambrose and Joseph Cobb of Virginia, but none provides any clue as to our line of Cobbs. After many years of research, I have arrived at only one logical conclusion. Through the sworn testimony of George S. Cobb in 1904 he declared to be the son of Humphrey Wilson Cobb, son of Humphrey Cobb, son of Samuel Cobb of Greenville County, SC. In his testimony, he stated: "The tradition of the family is that five brothers originally came to this country and settled, my recollection is that they first reached the State of Virginia and then came to the State of South Carolina and North Carolina, and two of the original five went west. They came from England."

Mr. Sutton tried to tie the family to known Cobb settlers in Virginia, but was unsuccessful. In a letter to Mrs. Kathy Stevens, dated April 18, 1983, Mr. Sutton makes the following observation, "If these five brothers came to America according to family tradition, I have not been able to locate such record. Sometimes I wonder if they immigrated to North Carolina from Massachusetts, their forebearer having settled there. I have checked out all known connections of the early Virginia Cobbs and cannot make any connection there." For a time, we were at an impasse.

In the summer of 2002, **Dr. Neal Cobb**, a retired dentist living in Rabun Gap, Georgia, became aware of the possibility of DNA analysis. While considering how to find a suitable donor for the DNA comparisons, it suddenly occurred to him that **Hubert Cobb** of Gray, Maine, a member of their Cobb research group, might be a likely candidate. He was a descendant of **Henry the Elder Cobb** of Barnstable, Barnstable County, MASS b. Oct 5, 1606 in England. His birthdate is given in "The Great Migration Begins, 1620-1635" by Robert Charles Anderson. Great Migration Begins: Immigrants to New England, 1620-33 [database on-line]. HENRY COBB SR was born 06 Oct 1606 in Reculver, City of Canterbury, Kent, England, and died 03 Jun 1679 in Barnstable, Barnstable County, MA. Buried at Lothrop Hill Cemetery. He married (1) PATIENCE HURST in 1632, daughter of JAMES HURST (1582-1657) and GERTRUDE BENNISTER (1585-1670). She was born Jan 1610 in Amsterdam Municipality, Noord-Holland Netherlands, and died 04 May 1648 in Barnstable, Barnstable County, MA buried at Lothrop Hill Cemetery. He married (2) SARAH HINCKLEY in 1649. She was born 22 Nov 1629 in Kent, England, and died 16 Feb 1687 in Barnstable, Barnstable County, MA buried at Cobb's Hill Cemetery East & West. Henry's Will was written April 4, 1678, and proved June 3, 1679.

She married JASHER TAYLOR son of RICHARD TAYLOR, Jr (1652-1732) and HANNAH RICE (1648-1733). He was born 1685, and died 31 Oct 1752 in Yarmouth Port, Barnstable County, MA buried at Ancient Cemetery., b. 08 Jun 1692, Barnstable, Barnstable County, MA; d. 17 Dec 1764, Yarmouth Port, Barnstable County, MA buried at Ancient Cemetery.
- JONATHAN COBB was born 25 Dec 1694 in Barnstable, Barnstable County, MA, and died 03 Aug 1773 in Brewster, Barnstable County, MA buried at Old Burying Ground. He married SARAH HOPKINS 20 Oct 1715 daughter of STEPHEN HOPKINS (1670-1733) and SARAH HOWES. She was born 1694 in Braintree, Norfolk County, MA, and died 27 Jul 1753 in Brewster, Barnstable County, MA buried at Old Burying Ground.
- 9. ELEAZER COBB was born 14 Jan 1696 in Barnstable, Barnstable County, MA, and died 21 Sep 1731 in Barnstable, Barnstable County, MA buried at Cobb's Hill Cemetery East and West. He married RELIANCE PAINE 11 Jun 1742, daughter of JOSPEH PAINE, Sr. (1667-1712) and PATIENCE SPARROW (1675-1745). She was born 27 Jan 1706, and died 11 Jun 1742 in Barnstable, Barnstable County, MA buried at Cobb's Hill Cemetery East and West.
- LYDIA COBB was born 08 Dec 1699 in Barnstable, Barnstable County, MA, and died 18 Jun 1778 in Centerville, Barnstable County, MA buried at Centerville Ancient Cemetery. She married EBENEZER

SCUDER, son of JOHN SCUDER (1658-1742) and ELIZABETH HAMILIN (1665-1743). He was born 1696, and died 06 Apr 1737 in Barnstable, Barnstable County, MA buried at Cobb's Hill Cemetery East and West.

3rd GENERATION OF OUR COBBS IN AMERICA To Old Pendleton District

From John Sutton's writing: "The 1790 Census of Pendleton District, South Carolina, shows as heads of households: Asa Cobb, John Cobb, and Henry Cobb and in Greenville District (across the Saluda River), was Samuel Cobb and his son, Humphry Cobb. This area along the upper Saluda River was Cherokee land until after the Revolutionary War when settlers began to move in. It was then in the Judicial District of Ninety-Six, later attached to Abbeville County where many of the earlier records were kept. Land was not granted to settlers until 1784. Pendleton County was created in 1789 with Court House in Pickensville, which embraced all lands north-west from Abbeville County between the Saluda River and the Savannah/Tugaloo/Chattooga Rivers (State of Georgia boundary) up to the Blue Ridge. In 1791, Washington District was short lived and in 1798 Pendleton and Greenville again became districts, each with a court house. In 1826, Pendleton District was divided into Anderson and Pickens Counties"

Henry Cobb and Jemima Morse were the parents of 7 children, 2 girls and 5 boys. Their first five children were born in Pomfret, Connecticut. Sometime around 1742, they left Pomfret and moved to Orange County (now Caswell), North Carolina. They had two more children in North Carolina. There are many Cobbs living in Caswell County today, almost all are descendants of Henry's son Noah who remained in Caswell County, North Carolina. Henry died about 1755 in Orange County (now Caswell County). The date of the death of Jemima is unknown.

HENRY COBB and JEMIMA MORSE had the following children:

- 2. SAMUEL COBB was born 30 Apr 1735 in Pomfret, Windham, Connecticut, and died Nov 1809 in Breck, Owen County, KY buried at Old Jackson Cemetery, Breck, Owen County, Kentucky. He married (1) ELIZABETH RANSOM 1755. She died 1769 in Laurens Co, SC killed in the Austin Raid Indian Attack. He married (2) JUDAH PEAKE 1781 in Turkey Creek Baptist Church, Donalds, South Carolina. She was born 1745 in Abbeville, 96 District, SC, and died 1813 in Scott, Kentucky. Samuel Cobb, served in the 3rd SC militia for the Revolutionary War beginning 5 Sep 1776. On May 05, 1785, he was awarded 500 acres along Reedy River in SC for war services. Most of this family moved to Owen County, Kentucky.

Samuel's family was involved in a well-documented Indian attack known as the AUSTIN RAID in the fall of 1769 in Laurens County South Carolina. The Austin farm was only two farms from the Cobb farm. Samuel's wife. Elizabeth Ransom, and daughter were killed in the attack. Two sons were captured but released, Humphrey and Ransom. After serving in the Revolutionary War, fighting in battles around Charleston, Samuel remarried to Judith Judah Peak and had seven more children. In 1786, Samuel received 500 acres along the Reedy River in South Carolina as payment for War Services. He deeded this land to his son Humphrey, who grew up and married and moved on to DeKalb, Georgia in late 1790s. Samuel was buried in the Old Jackson Graveyard on the Davis Farm near Breck in Owen County, Kentucky. 5 May 1785 Samuel Cobb was awarded 500 acres along Reedy River in SC for war services. 1780 - Residence - Between Broad and Sauldy Rivers, Ninety-Six District, South Carolina 1795-Samuel, Judah and their children moved to Lusby's Mill, Owen County, Kentucky.


HENRY COBB was born 14 Apr 1737 in Pomfret, Windham, Connecticut and died Jul 1790 in Pendleton District, SC, buried at Old Rogers Place, 2 miles from Williamston. He married (1) DEBORAH REED 1765 in NC. She was born 1745 in Orange County, NC, and died 1775 in Yanceyville, Caswell County, NC. He married (2) RACHEL REED WILSON 1780 in Bertie County, NC, daughter of JAMES WILSON (1713-1784) and RUTH REED (1719-1766). She was born 25 Jul 1765 in NC, and died 12 Mar 1836 in Asylum, Tuscaloosa County, Alabama.

Henry Settled near Williamston in the 1780's. 1795 Jan. Anderson County Probate Judge Estate Records 1793-1799 pages 63-65 Estate of Henry Cobb appraised July 29, 1794. Negro man Peter, yellow wench Hannah, black negro Hannah, negro girls Fan, Milla, Sal and Lettie, and negro boys Toney, London, Dick, Peter. Appraised by Thomas Garner, Benjamin Farmer, and William Harper. Rec Jan. 1795.

- 4. NOAH COBB was born 14 Apr 1739 in Pomfret, Windham, Connecticut, and died Dec 1808 in St. David's, Caswell County, NC. He married ELIZABETH NANCEY WALKER 04 Dec 1766 in Caswell, NC, daughter of SAMUEL WALKER (1714-1793) and ELEANOR. She was born 03 May 1749 in Caswell County, NC, and died 1811 in Caswell County, NC. This family remained in Caswell County, NC.
- MARY COBB, b. 13 Mar 1741, Pomfret, Windham, Connecticut; d. 1841, River Colony, Colony of Connecticut. (?) No more information.
- 6. JOHN COBB was born 1743, in Pomfret, Windham, Connecticut, and died 05 Jul 1793 at Broadmouth Creek, Saluda River, Pendleton District, and Anderson County, SC and buried on his property. He married PHOEBE. She was born 1755, and died 1810 in Pendleton District., Anderson County, SC. The family moved to Caswell County, NC in 1747 when John was 4 years old.

The 1800 Pendleton District census shows that only two Cobb widows, one being **Rachel** (Reed Wilson) **Cobb**, age 45, and widow of **Henry Cobb** (1737-1790), with eight of her ten children (2 children married). **Rachel** was living in Tuscaloosa County, Alabama in 1820 and 1830. The other widow was **Phoebe Cobb** wife of **John Cobb** (1743-1793), age 45, with 5 children. Phoebe died 1810.

7. ASA COBB was born 1746 in Orange County, (Now Caswell County) NC, and died 1828 in Fentress, TN. He married (1) SARAH STEPHENS. She was born 09 Apr 1753 in Orange, NC, and died 09 Apr 1816 in Mt. Cobb, Luzerne, PA. He married (2) FANNIE COKER. She was born 1750 in Tuscumbia, Colbert County, AL, and died 1829 in Overton Co, TN. 1808: Asa purchased land in Roane County, TN on Popular Creek.

SEABORN the daughter of JAMES SEABORN of Oconee County, SC (1757-1804) and MARY POLLY BRAISHER (1759-?). She was born in 1797 in Golden Grove, Abbeville District, SC. She died in 1860.
