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

More Cobb Cotton Mill Superintendents from The Old Pendleton District, SC

This line of Cobb Superintendents belongs to our Old Pendleton District Member, Carolyne Cobb James Rudd. A remarkable event happened in Carolyne's life when she purchased and restored the Chicopee Mill Supt. House in Walhalla, SC. She was informed by a Cobb relative that the home she purchased belonged to a Cobb Superintendent, a Cobb from her line of Cobbs, Melvin Darrell Cobb and his wife's name was Carolyn Cobb.

The Chicopee Mill Supt. House



Located in the Chicopee Mill Area of Walhalla, this block of homes belonged to the Superintendent and Mill Overseers. Today they are well kept by their present owners.



Chicopee Mill Supt. House at 302 South Spring Street.

Carolyne Rudd's grandfather, James Henry Cobb, an overseer in the mill, raised his family in the house located on Lot #1. Catherine Street, (1930 Census, Walhalla City, Wagener Township, Oconee County, SC). From the SC Department of Archives and History: Chicopee Mill Supervisor's House-Description: Irregular plan, 1 story: gable/jerkinhead roof; 1 interior chimney; weatherboard ext., portico with columns; jerkinhead dormer on façade; projecting jerkinhead gable to left of entrance; entrance angled; another dormer set on side front gable; triple 4/1 windows.

The Mill History:

From the Book: Person, Places and Happenings in Old Walhalla page 173 & 174 by Charles Sloan Reid & Marguerite Brennecke -Jan 1, 1960

1895- Walhalla Cotton Mills was formed and a charter obtained in 1985 with a capital stock of \$75,000. (Charter Book A, Page 37.) The Board of Directors were: John D. Verner, President and Treasurer; D.

P. Robins, Secretary; C. W. Pitchford, S. P. Dendy, William J. Stribling, J.J. Norton, and W. A. Strother. 1895-Victor Monagan Company. The Walhalla Cotton Mills sold out to the Victor Monagan Company. (Deed Book 5H, page 179), filed declaration July 30, 1895.

1899 The Mill was built and completed by the Victor-Monaghan Mills

1945 The Chicopee Manufacturing Corporation, which is a division of Johnson and Johnson of Massachusetts, purchased the Victor Monagan Company.






Spring Street before the Mill was built. Known as the Melville Property.

Walhalla 150 years In the Garden of the Gods.
Through the concerted efforts of Wiechiner and Wanner, the Oconee County Fruit Growers and Distilling Company was organized to aid grape growers, and Wanner became known as the little old winemaker of Walhalla. Around this time, there were two jug factories in operation on the branch near the present site of the Chicopee, later Avondale Mill. Before these mills, the Walhalla Cotton Manufacturing Company was organized, the street on the mill village bearing the names of those engaged in this enterprise. The mill was later sold to Victor Monaghan Company and later became Chicopee and then Avondale Mill.





Massachusetts, originally born in 1823. In 1916, it started the supply of nonwoven bandages due to booming wartime demand for sterile dressings. Johnson & Johnson acquired Chicopee during WW I to increase its manufacturing capacity. Today, Chicopee North America specializes in roll goods, and finished, packaged wipes for Foodservice, Industrial, Health Care and general-purpose applications. Another Chicopee: The Chicopee Manufacturing, Textiles & Apparel Company headquarters located in the Netherlands.

In the 1950 Census, Elbert and Ruby are living in Westminster, Oconee County, SC. He was the Proprietor of a Filling Station.
